Pension costs are charged to operating expenses on an accrual method, which includes normal costs and amortization of prior service cost over a 35-year period ending January 1, 2001, plus interest on the recorded unfunded pension liability. Pension charges are funded over a 30-year period ending January 1, 2006.

The pension plan was amended, effective January 1, 1976, and now includes substantially all "non-scheduled" (non-union) employees and conforms the plan to the requirements of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974.

The pension plan and fund includes the Missouri Pacific Railroad and the following affiliated companies - ART, DK&S, FtWB, Mo. Impv., MP Trk. Lines, MP Airfreight, Merchants Cold Storage, WMW&NW and CHTI. The actuary determines costs and contributions of each of the participating companies. There is no separation of the fund by companies. The actuarially computed value of vested benefits and benefits pertaining to retired employees exceeds the market value of the pension fund for the Missouri Pacific Railroad and its affiliates by approximately \$24,679 at December 31, 1978.

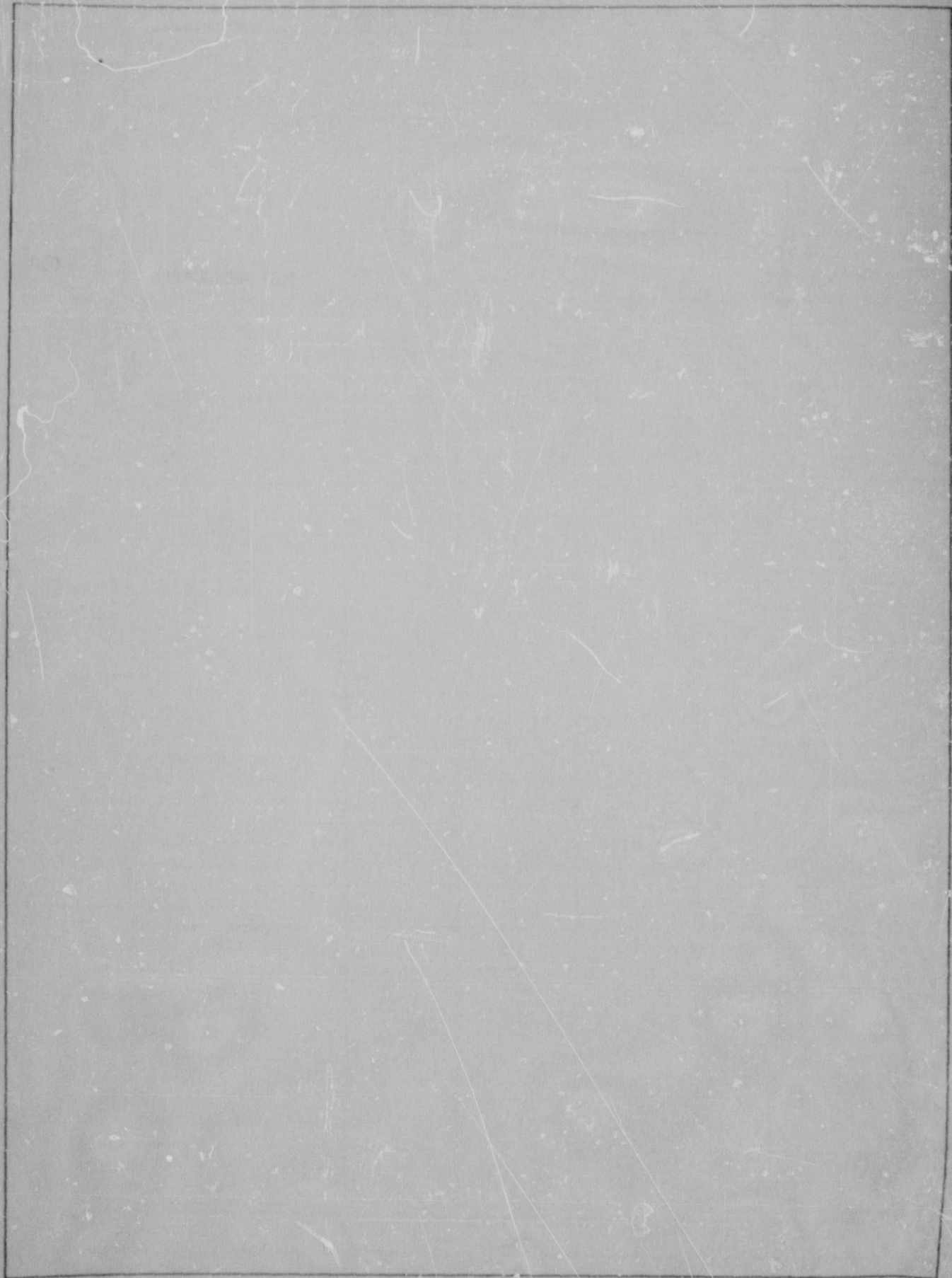
