

1. This Form for annual report should be filled out in triplicate and two copies returned to the Interstate Commerce Commission, Bureau of Accounts, Washington, D.C. 20423, by March 31 of the year following that for which the report is made. Attention is specially directed to the following provisions of Part 1 of the Interstate Commerce Act:

Sec. 20. (7) (b). Any person who shall knowingly and willfully make, cause to be made, or participate in the making of, any false entry in any annual or other report required under the section to be filed, * * * or shall knowingly or willfully file with the Commission any false report or other document, shall be deemed guitry of a misdemeanor and shall be subject, upon conviction in any court of the United States of competent jurisdiction, to a fine of not more than five thousand dollars or imprisonment for not more than two years, or both such fine and imprisonment. ***

(7) (c). Any carrier or lessor, " " " or any officer, agent, employee, or representative thereof, who shall fail to make and file an annual or other report with the Commission within the time fixed by the Commission, or to make specific and full, true, and correct answer to any question within thirty days from the time it is lawfully required by the Commission to to do, shall forfeit to the United States the sum of one hundred dollars for ach and every day it shall continue to be in default with respect thereto.

(8). As used in this section * * * the term "carrier" means a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such carrier, and the term "lessor" means a person owning a railroad, a water line, or a pipe line, leased to and operated by a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such lessor. * * *

The respondent is further required to send to the Bureau of Accounts, immediately upon preparation, two copies of its latest annual report to stockholders. See scheduled 108, page 3.

- 2. The instructions in this Form should be carefully observed, and each question should be answered fully and accurately, whether it has been answered in a previous annual report or not. Except in cases where they are specifically authorized, cancellations, arbitrary check marks, and the like should not be used either as partial or as entire answers to inquiries. Operating compa. 's (including switching and terminal) are broad classified, with respect to their operating revenues, according to a following general definitions:

Class I companies are those having annual operating revenues of \$5,000,000 or more. For class, Annual Report Frem R-1 is provided

Class II companies are those having annual operating revenues below \$5,000,000. For class, Annual Reject Form R-2 is provided.

Class \$4. Bridge and ferry. This class of companies is confined to those whose operations limited to bridges and ferries exclusively.

Class \$5. Mixed. Companies performing primarily a switching or a terminal service, but we also conduct a regular freight or passenger traffic.
