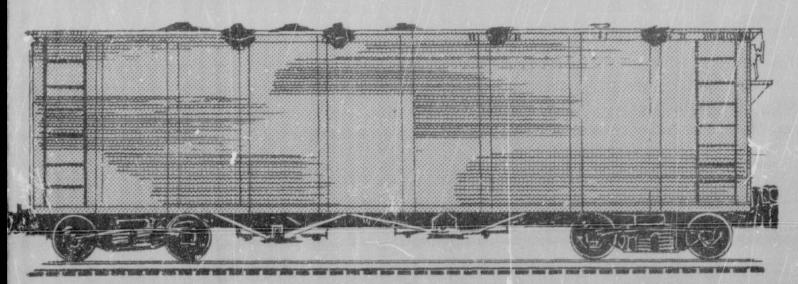

(2) Said annual reports shall contain all the required information for the period of thefive months ending in the 31st day of December in each year, unless the Commission shall specify a different date, and shall be made out under outh and filed with the Commission at its office in Washington within three months after the close of the year for which report is made, unless additional time be granted in any case by the Commission.

(7) (b) Any person who shall knowingly and willfully make, cause to be made, or participate in the making of, as y false entry in any annual or other report required under this section to be filed, * * * or shall knowingly or willfully file with the Commission any false report or other document, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject, upon conviction in any court of the United Syras of competent jurisdiction, to a fine of not more than five thousand collars or imprisonment for not more than two years, or both such fine and imprisonment: * * * (7) (c) Any carrier or lessor, * * * or any officer, agent, employee or representative thereof, who

shall fail to make and file an annual or other report with the Commission within the time fixed by the Commission, or to make specific and full, true, and correct answer to any question within thirty days from the time it is lawfully required by the Commission so to do, shall forfeit to the United States the sum of one hundred dollars for each and every day it shall continue to be in default with

respect thereto.

(8) As used in this section * * * the term "carrier" nears a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such currier, and the term "lessor" means a person owning a railroad, a water line, or a pipe line, trusted to and operated by a common carrier subject to this part; and includes a precisive or trustee, (such lessor. * * " to this part, and includes a receiver or in ster of such lessor,

The respondent is further required to send to the Bureau of Accounts immediately upon preparation, two copies of its fatest annual report to stockhol ters. See schedule 108, page 6.

- 2. The instructions in this Form should be carefully observed, and each question should be answered fully and accurately, whether it has been answered in a previous annual report or not. Except in cases where they are specifically authorized, cancellations, arbitrary check marks, and the like should not be ed either as partial or as entire answers to inquiries. - 3. Every annual report should, in all particulars, be complete in itself, and references to the returns of former years should not be made to take the place of required entries except as herein otherwise specifically directed or authorized

If it be necessary or de lable to invert additional statements, typewritten or other, in a report, they should be legibly made on durable paper and, wherever practicable, on sheets not larger than a page of the Form. Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broadly classified, with respect to their operating revenues, according to the following general definitions:

Class I companies are those having annual operating revenues of \$10,000,000, or more. For this class, Annual Report Form R-1 is provided.

Class II companies are those having annual operating revenues below \$10,000,000. For this class, Annual Report Form R-2 is provided.

In applying this classification to any switching or terminal company which is operated as a joint facility of owning or tenant railroads, the sum of the annual railway operating revenues, the joint facility rent income, and the returns to joint facility credit accounts in operating expenses, shall be used in determining its class

Switching and terminal companies are further classified as:

- Class S1. Exclusively switching. This class of companies includes all those performing switching service only, whether for joint account or for revenue.
- Class \$2. Exclusively terminal. This class of companies includes all companies furnishing terminal trackage or terminal facilities only, such as union passenger or freight stations, stockyards, etc., for which a charge is made, whether operated for joint account or for revenue. In case a bridge or ferry is a part of the facilities operated by a terminal company, it should be included under this heading.
- Class S3. Both switching and terminal. Companies which perform both a switching and a terminal service. This class of companies includes all companies whose operations cover both switching and terminal service, as defined above
- Class S4 Bridge and terry. This class of companies is confined to those whose operations are limited to bridges and ferries exclusively.
- Class S5. Mixed. Companies performing primarily a switching or a terminal service, out which also conduct a regular freight or passenger traffic. The revenues of this class of companies include, in addition to awitching or terminal revenues, those derived from local passenger service, local freight service, participation in through movement of freight or passenger traffic, other transportation operations, and operations other than transportation
- 8. Except where the context clearly indicates some other meaning, the following terms when used in this Form have the meanings below stated.

COMMISSION LIBERTS the Interstate Commerce Commission. Respondent means the person or corporation in whose behalf the report is made. The YEAR means the year ended December 31 for which the report is made. THE CLOSE OF THE YEAR means the close of business on December 31 of the year for which the report is made; or, in case the report is made for a shorter period than one year, it means the close of the period covered by the report. The BEGINNING OF THE YEAR means the beginning of business on January 1 of the year for which the report is made; or, in case the report is made for a shorter period than one year, it means the beginning of the period covered by the report. THE PRECEDING YEAR means the year ended December 31 of the year next preceding the year for which the report is made. THE UNIFORM SYSTEM Accounts for Railroad Companies means the system of accounts in Part 1201 of Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, as amended

Schedule 2910.—COMPETITIVE BIDDING — CLAYTON ANTITRUST ACT

Section 10 of the Clayton Antitrust Act (15 U.S.C. 20) states that "no common carrier engaged in commerce shall have any dealings in securities, supplies or other articles of to the amount of nore than \$50,000, in the aggregate, in any one year, with another corporation, firm, partnership or association when the said common carrier shall have upon its board of directors or as its president, manager or as its purchasing or selling officer, or agent in the particular transaction, any person who is at the same time a director, manager, or commerce, or shall make or have any contracts for construction or maintenance of any kind,
