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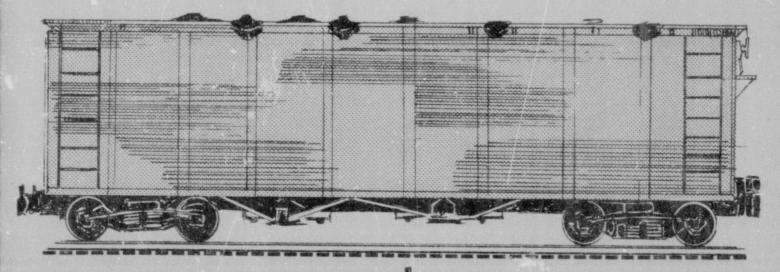

1. This Form for annual report should be filled out in triplicate and two copies returned to the Interstate Commerce Commission. Bureau of Accounts, Washington, D.C. 20423, by March 31 of the year following that for which the report is made. Attention is specially directed to the following provisions of Part 1 of the Interstate Commerce Act.

See 20. (1) The Commission is hereby authorized to require annual, periodical, or special is ported for arriers, lessors, * * * (as defined in this section). (2) Said annual reports shall contain all the required 6 formation for the period of twelve months ending on the 31st day of December in each year, unless the Commission shall specify a different date, and shall be made out under oath and bled with the Commission at its office in Washington within three months after the close of the year for which report is made, unless additional time be granted in any case by the Commission.

(7) (b). Any person who shall knowingly and willfully make, cause to be made, or participate in the making of any false entry in any annual or other report required under the section to be filed. * * * or shall knowingly or willfully file with the Commission any false report or other document, shall be deemed guilty of a mademeanor and shall be subject. Upon conviction any court of the United States of competent jurisdiction, to a fine of not more than five thousand dollars or imprisonment for not more than two years, or both such fine and imprisonment. ** *.

(7) (c) Any earrier or lessor, * * * or any officer, agest, employee, or representative thereof, who shall fail to make and file an annual or other report with the Commission within the time fixed by the Commission, or to make specific and full, true, and correct answer to any question within thirty days from the time it is lawfully required by the Commission so to do, shall forfeit to the United States the sum of one hundred dollars for each and every day it shall continue to be in default with respect thereto.

(8). As used in this section," * " the term "carrier" means a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such carrier, and the term "lessor" means a person owning a redroad, a waver line, or a pipe line, leased to and operated by a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such lessor. * * *

The respondent is furtive required to send to the Bureau of Accounts, immediately upon preparation, two copies of its latest annual report to stockholders. See scheduled 108, page 3.

2. The instructions in this Form should be carefully observed, and each question should be answered fully and accurately, whether it has been answered in a previous annual report or not. Except in cases where they are specifically authorized, cancellations, arbitrary check marks, and the like should not be used either as partial or as entire answers to inquiries.
