One copy should be retained in respondent's files. Attention is specially directed to the following provisions of Part I of the Interstate Commerce Act:

(7) (b) Any person who shall knowingly and willfully make, cause to be made, or participate in the making of, any faise entry in any annual or other report required under this section to be filed, * * or shall knowingly or willfully file with the Commission any false report or other document, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject, upon conviction in any court of the United States of competent jurisdiction, to a fine of not more than five thousand dol lars or imprisonment for not more than two years, or both such fine and imprisonment; * * *

court of the United States of competent jurisdiction, to a fine of not more than five thousand dot-lars or imprisonment for not more than two vears, or both such fine and imprisonment: * * * (T)(c) Any carrier or lessor, *** or any officer, agent, employee or representative thereof, who shall fail to make and file an annual or other report with the Commission within the time fixed by the Commission, or to make specific and full, true, and correct answer to any question within thir y days from the time it is lawfully required by the Commission so to do, shall forfeit to the United States the sum of one hundred dollars for each and every day it shall coatinue to be in default with report thereto. respect thereto

(8) As used in this section * * * the term "carrier" means a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trastee of such carrier; and the term "lessor" means a person owning a tailroad, a water line, or a pipe line, leased to and operated by a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such lessor, * * *

he respondent is further required to send to the Bureau of Accounts immediate-1v upon preparation, two copies of its latest annual report to stockholders. See schedule 108, page 6.

The instructions in this Form should be carefully observed, and each question should be answered fully and accurately, whether it has been answered in a previous annual report or not. Except in cases where they are specifically a thorized. cancellations, arbitrary check marks, and the like should not be used either as par-tial or as entire answers to inquiries. If any inquiry, based on a preceding inquiry in the present report form is, because of the answer rendered to such preceding inquiry, inapplicable to the person or corporation in whose behalf the report is made, such notation as "No: applicable; see page____, schedule (or line) number_____ would be used in answer thereto, giving precise reference to the portion of the report showing the facts which make the inquiry inapplicable. Inserted sheets should be securely attached, preferably at the inner margin; attachment by pins or clips is insufficient

All entries should be made in a permanent black ink. Those of a contrary character should be indicated in parenthesis.

6. Money items, except averages, throughout the annual report form should be shown in thousands of dollars adjusted to accord with footings. Totals for amounts reported in subsidiary accounts included in supporting schedules must be in agreement with related primary accounts. For purposes of rounding, amounts of \$500 but iess than \$1,000 should be raised to the nearest thousand dollars, and amounts of less than \$500 should be lowered.

7. Railroad corporations, mainly distinguished as operating companies and lessor companies, are for the purpose of report to the Interstate Commerce Commission divided into classes. An operating company is one whose officers direct the business of transportation and whose books contain operating as well as financial accounts; and, a $h_{\rm ev}$ or company, the property of which being leased to and operated by another company, is one that maintains a separate legal existence and keeps financial but not operating accounts. In making reports, lessor companies use Annual Report Fort. R-4

Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broadly classified. with respect to their operating revenues, according to the following general definitions:

Class I companies are those having annual operating revenues of \$10,000,000, or more. For this class, Annual Report Form R-1 is provided.

Class II companies are those having annual operating revenues below \$10,000,000. For this class, Annual Report Form R-2 is provided.

In applying this classification to any switching or terminal company which is operated as a joint facility of owning or tenant railroads, the sum of the annual railway operating revenues, the joint facility rent income, and the retarns to joint facility credit accounts in operating expenses, shall be used in determining its class.

Switching and terminal companies are further classified as:

Class S1. Exclusively switching. This class of companies includes all those performing switching service only, whether for joint account or for revenue.

Class S2. Exclusively terminal. This class of companies includes all companies furnishing terminal trackage or terminal facilities only, such as union passenger or freight stations, stockyards, etc., for which a charge is made, whether operated for joint account or for revenue. In clise a bridge or ferry is a part of the facilities operated by a terminal company, it should be included under this heading

Class S3. Both switching and terminal. Companies which perform both a switching and a terminal service. This class of comparies includes all companies whose operations cover both switching and terminal service, as defined above.

Class S4. Bridge and ferry. This class of companies is confined to those whose operations are limited to bridges and ferries exclusively.

Class S5. Mixed. Companies performing primarily a switching or a terminal service, but which also conduct a regular freight or passenger traffic. The revenues of this class of companies include, in addition to switching or terminal revenues, those darived from local passenger service, local freight service, participation in through movement of freight or passenger traffic, other transportation operations, and operations other than transportation.

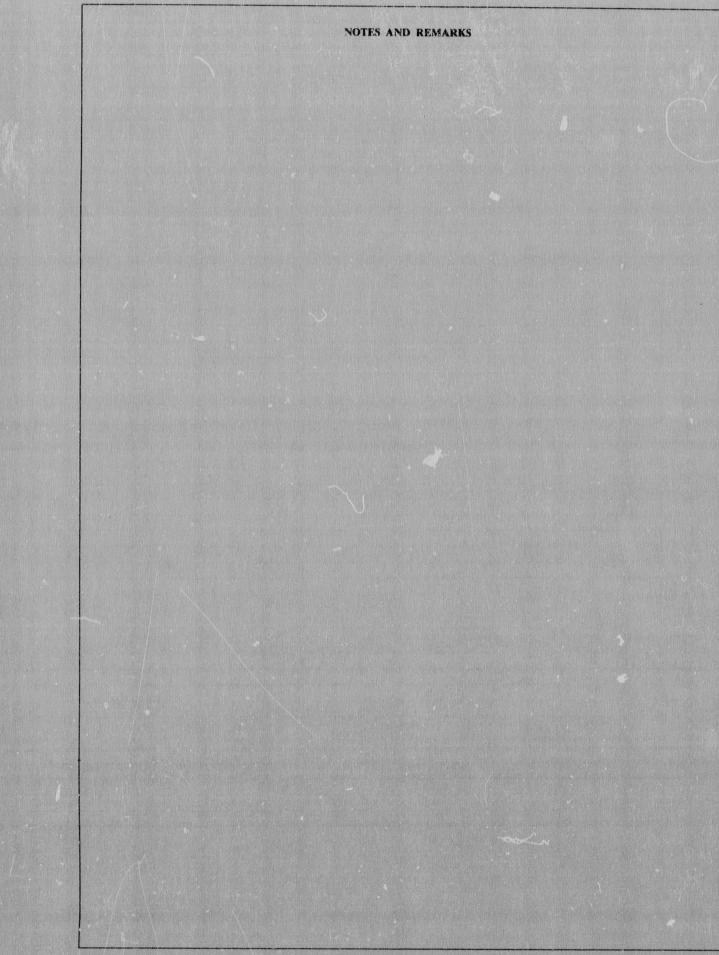
