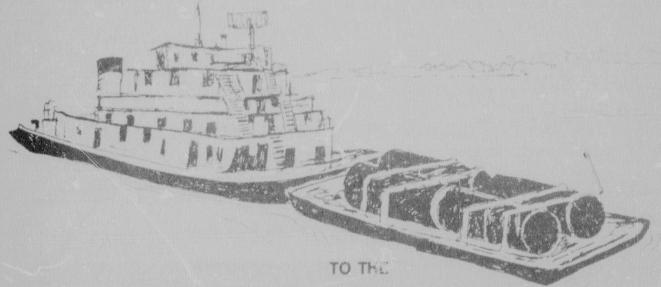

Whoever willfully falsifies, destroys, mutilates, or alters any such report, account, record, rate, charge, or memorandum or willfully files a false report, account, record, rate, charge, or memorandum shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and subject upon conviction to a fine of not more than \$1,000, or imprisonment for not more than I year, or to both such fine and imprisonment.
