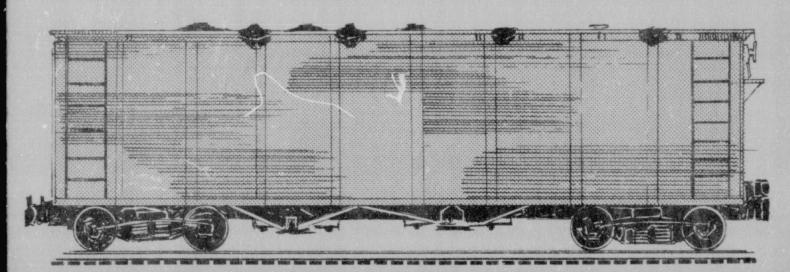

Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broat classified, with respect to their operating revenues, according to t following general definitions.

Class I companies are classe having annual operating revenues of \$5,000,000 at more. For class, Annual Report com R-1 is provided.

Class II companies are those having annual operating revenues below \$5,000,000. For class, Annual Report Form R-2 is provided.

In applying this classification to any switching or terminal comparable in soperated as a joint facility of owning or tenant railways, sum of the annual railway operating revenues, the joint facility raincome, and the returns to joint facility credit accounts in operat expenses, shall be used in determining its class.

Switching and terminal companies are further classified as:

Class St. Exclusively switching. This class of companies includes all those perform switching service only, whether for joint account or for revenue.

Class S2. Exclusively terminal. This class of companies includes all companies furnish terminal trackage or terminal facilities only, such as union passenger or freight statistickyards, etc., for which a charge is made, whether operated for joint account or for revelln case a bridge or ferry is a part of the facilities operated by a terminal company, it should included under this heading.

Class \$3. Both switching and terminal. Companies which perform both a switching at terminal service. This class of companies includes all companies whose operations cover t switching and terminal service, as defined above.

Class \$4. Bridge and ferry. This class of companies is confined to those whose operations limited to bridges and ferries exclusively.

Class S5. Mixed. Companies performing primarily a switching or a terminal service, but will also conduct a regular freight or passenger traffic. The revenues of this class of compainclude, is addition to switching or terminal revenues, those derived from hoost masses service, local freight service, participation in through movement of freight or passenger resource transportation operations, and operations other than transportation operations, and operations other than transportation operations.
