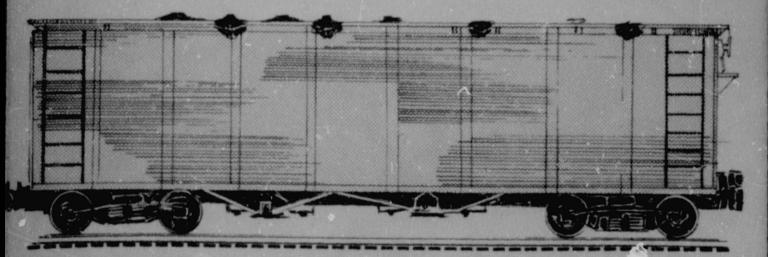

Any person who shall knowingly and willfully make, cause to be made, or participate in the making of, any false entry in any annual or other report required under the section to be filed, \* \* \* or shall knowingly or willfully file with the Commission any false report or other document, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject, upon conviction in any court of the United States of competent jurisdiction, to a fine of not more than five thousand dollars or imprisonment for not more than five thousand dollars or imprisonment for not more than five thousand dollars or imprisonment: \* \*

(7) (c). Any carrier or lessor, \* \* or any officer, agent, employee, or representative thereof, who shall fail to make and file an annual or other report with the Commission within the time fixed by the Commission, or to make specific and full, true, and correct answer to any questions within thirty days from the time it is lawfully required by the Commission so to do, shall forfeit to the United States the sum of one hundred dollars for each and every day it shall continue to be in default with respect thereto.

(8). As used in this section \* \* \* the term "carrier" means a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such carrier, and the term "lessor" means a person owning

common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such carrier, and the term "lessor" means a person owning a rairoad, a water line, or a pipe line; lessed to and operated by a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such lessor. \* \*

In making reports, lessor companies use Annual Report Form R4.

Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broadly classified, with respect to their operating revenues, according to the following general definitions:

Class I companies are those having annual operating revenues of \$50,000,000, or more. For this class, Annual Report Form R-1 is

Class II companies are those having annual operating revenues less than \$50,000,000 but in excess of \$10,000,000. For this class, Annual Report Form R-2 is provided.

Class III companies are those having annual operating revenues of \$10,000,000, or less. For this class, Annual Report Form R.3.

In applying this classification to any switching or terminal company which is operated as a joint facility of owning or tenant railways, the sum of the annual railway operating revenues, the joint facility rent income, and the seturns to joint facility credit accounts in operating expenses, shall be used in determining its class.

Switching and terminal companies are further classified as:

Class S1. Exclusively switching. This class of companies includes all those performing switching service only, whether for joint account or for revenue.

account or for revenue.

Class S2. Exclusively terminal. This class of companies includes all companies furnishing terminal trackage or terminal facilities ordy, such as union passenger or treight stations, stockwards, etc., for which a charge is made, whether operated for ioint account, or for revenue. In case a beidge or iera, is a part of the facilities operated by a terminal company, it should be included under this

Class S3. Both switching and ferminal. Companies which perform both a switching and a terminal service. This class of companies includes all companies whose operations cover both switching and

terminal service, as defined above

Class 54. Bridge and ferry. This class of companies is confined to come whose operations are limited to bridges and ferries exclusively. Class 55. Mixed. Companies performing primarily a switching or terminal service, but which also conduct a regular freight or assenger traffic. The revenues of this class of companies include, in passenger traffic. passenger service, local freight service, participation in through movement of freight or passenger traffic, other transportation operations, and operations other than transportation.

9. Except where the context clearly indicates some other meaning, the following terms when used in this Form have the reanings below stated:

COMMISSION means the Interstate Commerce Commission. RESPONDENT means the person or corporation in whose behalf the report is made. THE YEAR means the year ended December 31 for which the report is made. THE CLOSE OF THE YEAR means the close of business on December 31 of the year for which the report is made, or, in case the report is made for a shorter period than one year, it means the close of the period covered by the report. THE BEGINNING OF THE YEAR tricans the beginning of business on January 1 of the year for which the report is made; or, in case the report is made for a shorter period than one year, it means the beginning of the period covered by the report. THE PRECEDING YEAR means the year ended December 31 of the year next preceding the year for which the report is made. THE UNIFORM System in Part 1201 of Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, as umended.

10. Railroads and all companies considered to be carriers under Section 5(3) of the Interstate Commerce Act having gross carrier operating revenues of \$20 million or more shall file the Annual Report Supplement Corporate Disclosure. This supplement is an integral part of the annual report and shall be submitted concusrently. Subject railroads are not required to file Schedules 380, 381, and 390.

Rathroads with currier operating revenues less than \$20 million shall complete all applicable schedules in this report.
