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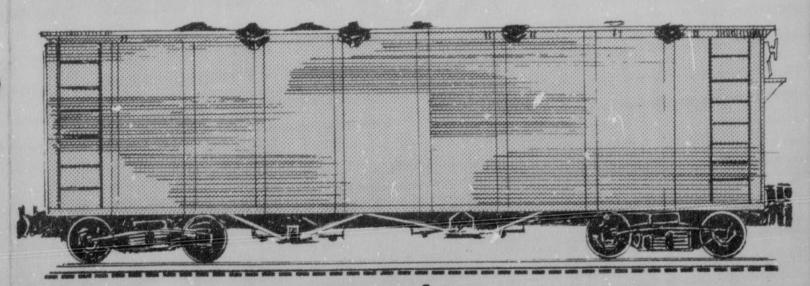

(7) (c). Any carrier or lessor. " * " or any officer, agent, employee, or representative thereof, who shall bill to make and file an annual or other report with the Commission within the time fixed by the Commission, or to make specific and full free and correct answer to spequestion within thirry days from the time it is lawfully required by the Commission so to do. shall forfeit to the United States the sum of one hundred dollars for each and every day it shall continue to be in default with respect thereto.

(8). As used in this section " " " the term "carrier" means a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such carrier, and the term "lessor" means a person wring a railroad, a water line, or a pipe line, leased to and operated by a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such lessor.

The respondent is further required to send to the Bureau of Accounts. immediately upon preparation, two copies of its latest annual report to stockholders See scheduled 108, page 3.

2. The instructions in this Form should be carefully observed, and each question should be answered fully and accurately, whether it has been answered in a previous annual report or not. Class II companies are those having annual operating revenues below \$10,000,000. For this class. Annual Report Form R-2 is provided

In applying this classification to any switching or terminal company which is operated as a joint facility of owning or tenant railways, the sum of the annual railway operating revenues, the joint facility rent income, and the returns to joint facility credit accounts in operating expenses, shall be used in determining its class.

Switching and terminal companies are further classified as:

Class S1. Exclusively switching. This class of companies includes all those performing

switching service only, whether for joint account or for revenue.

Class S2. Exclusively terminal. This class of companies includes all companies furnishing. termina) (tackage or terminal facilities only, such as union passenger of freight stations stockyards, etc., for which a charge is made, whether operated for joint account or for revenue In case a bridge or ferry is a part of the facilities operated by a terminal company, it should be included under this heading.
