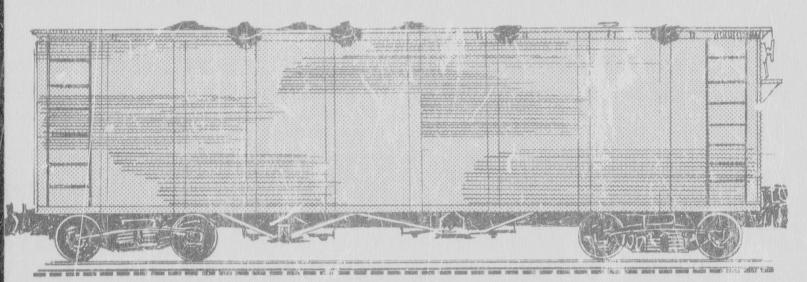

1. This Form for annual report should be filled out in triplicate and two copies returned to the Interstate Commerce Commission, Bureau of in triplicate, retaining one copy in its files for reference in case following provisions of Part I of the Interstate Commerce Act:

Sec. 20. (1) The Commission is hereby authorized to require annual, periodical, or special reports from carriers, lesssors, * * * (as defined in this section), to prescribe the manner and form in which such reports shall be made, and to require from such car ters, lessors, " deem information to be necessary, classifying such carriers, lessors, * * * as it may deem proper for any of these purposes. Any person who shall knowingly and willfully make, cause to be made, or participate in the making of, any false entry in any annual or other report required under the section to be filed, * * * or shall knowingly or willfully file with the Commission any false report or other document, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject, upon conviction in any court of the United States of competent jurisdiction, to a fine of not more than five thousand dollars or imprisonment for not more than two years, or both such fine and imprisonment: ** *

(7) (c). Any carrier or lessor. * * * or any officer, agent, employee, or representative thereof, who shall fail to make and file an innual or other report with the Commission within the time fixed by the Commission, or to make specific and full, true, and correct answer to any question within thirty days from the time it is lawfully required by the Commission so to do shall forfeit to the United States the sum of one hundred dollars for each and every day it shall

continue to be in default with respect thereto.

(8). As used in this section * * * the term "carrier" means a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such carrier, and the term "lessor" me ins a person owning a railroad, a water line, or a pipe line, leased to and operated by a common carrier
