

- 1. This Form for annual report should by filled out in triplicate and two copies returned to the Interstate Commerce Commission, Bureau of Accounts, Washington, D. C., 20423, by March 31 of the year following that for which the report is made. Attention if specifically directed to the following provisions of Pat 1 of the Interstate Commerce Act:
- SEC. 20. (1) The Comm ssion is hereby authorized to require annual, periodical, or special reports from carriers, lessors, * * * (as defined in this section), to prescribe the manner and form in which such reports shall be made, and to require from such carriers, lessors, * * * specific and full, true, and correct inswers to all questions upon which the Commission may deem information to be necessary, classifying such carriers, lessors, * * * as it may deem proper for any of these purposes. Such annual reports shall give an account of the affairs of the carrier, lessor, * * * in such form and detail as may be prescribed by the Commission.
- (2) Said annual reports shall contain all the required information for the period of twelve months ending on the 31st day of December in each year, unless the Commission shall specify a different date, and shall be made out under oath and filed with the Commission at its once in Washington within three months after the close of the year for which report is made, unless additional time be granted in any case by the Commission.
- (7) (b). Any person who shall knowingly and willfully make, cause to be made, or participate in the making of, any false entry in any annual or other report required under this section to be filed, * * * or shall knowingly or willfully file with the Commission any false report or other document, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject, upon conviction in any court of the United States of competent jurisdiction, to a fine of not more that five thousand dollars or imprisonment for not more than two years, or both such fine and imprisonment: * * *
- (7) (c). Any carrier or lessor, * * * or any officer, agent, employee, or representative thereof, who shall fail to make and file an ennual or other report with the Commission within the time fixed by the Commission, or to make specific and full, true, and correct answer to any question within thirty days from the time it is lawfully required by the Commission so to do, shall forfeit to the United States the sum of one hundred dollars for each and every day it shall continue to be in default with respect thereto.
- (8) As used in this section* * * the term 'carrier' means a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such carrier; and the term 'lessor' means a person owning a railroad, a water line or a pipe line, leased to and operated by a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such lessor,* * *

The respondent is further required to send to the Bureau of Accounts, immediately upon publication, two copies of its latest printed annual report to stockholders. See schedule 108, page 5.

2. The instructions in this Form should be carefully observed, and each question should be answered fully and accurately, whether it has been answered in a previous annual report or not. Except in cases where they are specifically authorized, cancellations, arbitrary check marks, and the like should not be used either as partial or as entire answers to inquiries.
