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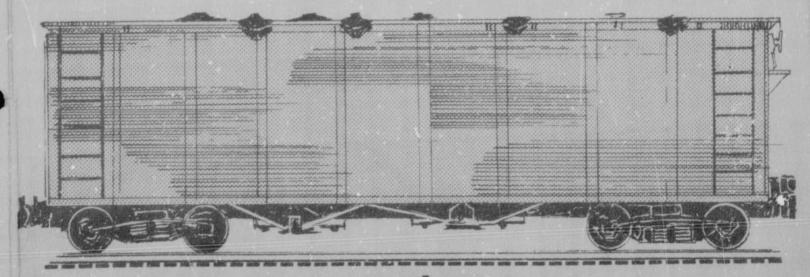

(8). As used in this section * * * the term "carrier" means a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such carrier; and the term "lessor" means a person whing a railroad, a water line, or a pipe line; leased to and operated by a common carrier schiegt to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such lessor."

 - 8. Railroad corporations, mainly distinguished as operating companies and lessor companies, are for the purpose of report to the Interstate Commerce Commission divided into classes. An operating company is one whose officers direct the business of transportation and whose books contain operating as well as financial accounts; and, a lessor company, the property of which being leased to and operated by another company, is one that maintains a separate legal existence and keeps financial but not operating accounts. In making reports, lessor companies use Annual Report Form R-4

Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broadly classified, with respect to heir operating revenues, according to the following general definitions:

Class I companies are those Saving annual operating revenues of \$10,000,000 or more. For this class. Annual Report Form R-1 is provided.

Class II companies are those having annual operating revenues below \$10,000,000. For this class. Annual Report Form R-2 is provided.

In applying this classification to any switching or to minal company which is operated as a join facility of owning or tenant railways, the sum of the annual railway operating revenues, the joint facility rent income, and the returns to joint facility credit accounts in operating expenses, shall be used in determining its class.

Switching and terminal companies are further classified as:

Class S1. Exclusively switching. This class of companies includes all those performing switching service only, whether for joint account or for revenue

Class S2. Exclusively terminal. This class of companies includes all companies furnishing terminal trackage or terminal facilities only, such as union passenger or freight stations stockyards, etc., for which a charge is made, whether operated for joint account or for revenue In case a bridge or ferry is a part of the facilities operated by a terminal company, it should be included under this heading.

Class \$3. Both switching and terminal. Companies which perform both a switching and a terminal service. This class of companies includes all companies whose operations cover both switching and terminal service, at defined above.

Class \$4. Bridge and ferry. This class of companies is confined to those whose operations are limited to bridges and ferries exclusively.

Class \$5. Mixed. Companies performing primarily a switching or a terminal service, but which also conduct a regular freight or passenger traffic. The revenues of this class of companies include, in addition to switching or terminal revenues, those derived from local passenger service, local freight service, participation in through m. sement of freight or passenger traffic,
