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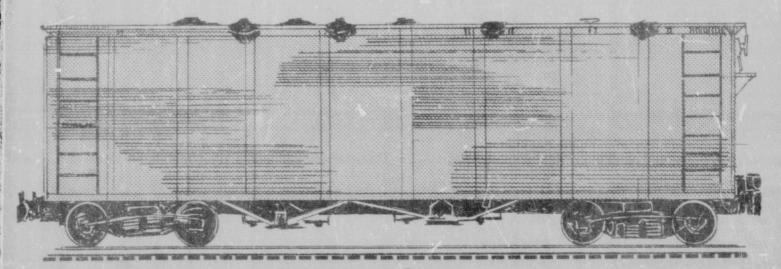

Washington, D.C. 20423, by March 31 of the year following that for which the report is made. Attention is specially directed to the following provisions of Part I of the Interstate Commerce.

(7) (b. Any person who shall knowingly and willfully make, cause to be made, or participate in the making of, any false entry in any annual or other report required under the section to be filed. \* \* \* or shall knowingly or willfully file with the Commission any false report or other document, shall be decided guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject, upon conviction in any court of the United States of competent jurisdiction, to a fine of not more than five thousand dollars or impresonment for not more than two years, or both such fine and impresonment. \*\*\*

(7) Ich. Any carrier or lessor, \* \* \* 0, any othere, agent, employee, or representative thereof, who shall fait to make and file an annual or other report with the Commission within the time fixed by the Commission, or 10 make specific and full, true, and correct answer to any question within thirty days from the time it is lawfully required by the Commission so to do, shall forted to the United States the sum of one hundred didlars for each and every day it shall commission to be in diffusily with respect thereto.

(3) As used in this section " " " the term "carrier" means a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a reserver or trustee of such carrier, and the term "lessor" means a person owing a railroad, a water line, or a pipe line, leased to and operated by a common carrier which is the near and includes a a circum or trustee of such lessor. " "

The respondent is further required to send to the Bureau of Accounts, immediately upon preparation, two copies of its latest annual report to stockholders. See scheduled 108, page 3.

3. Every annual report should, in all particulars, be complete in uslef, and references to the returns of former years should not be made to take the place of required entries except as herein otherwise specifically directed or authorized.

4. If it be necessary or desirable to insert additional statements, typewritten or other, in a report, they should be legibly made on durable paper and, wherever practicable, on sheets not larger than a page of the Form. Inserted sheets should be securely attached preferably at the inner margin; attachment by pins or clips is insufficient.

5. All entries should be made in a permanent black ink. Those of a contrary character should be indicated in parentheses. Items of an unusual character should be indicated by appropriate symbol and footnote.

6. Money items except averages, throughout the annual report form should be shown in WHOLE DOLLARS adjusted to accord with footings. Totals for amounts reported in subsidiary accounts included in supporting schedules must be in agreement with related primary accounts.

7. Each respondent should make its annual report to this Commission in triplicate returning one copy in its files for reference in case correspondence with agard to such report becomes necessary. For this reason three copies of the Firm are sent to each corporation concerned.

8. Railroad corporations, mainly distinguished as operating companies and it sor companies, are for the purpose of report to the Interstate Commission divided into classes. An operating company is one whose officers direct the business of transportation and whose books contain operating as well as financial accounts; and, a lessor company, the property of which being leased to and operated by another company, is one that maintains a separate legal existence and keeps financial but not operating accounts In making reports, lessor companies use Annual Report Form R-4

Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broadly classified, with respect to their operating revenues, according to the following general definitions:

Class I companies up those having annual operating revenues of \$5,000,000 or more. For title class Annual Report Form 8-1 is provided.

Class II companies are those vaving annual operating revenues below \$5,000,000. For this class. Annual Remot From R.Z is provided.

In applying this classification to any switching or terminal company which is operated as a joint facility of owning or tenant railway, the sum of the annual railway operating revenues, the joint facility rent income, and the teturns to joint facility credit accounts in operating expenses, shall be used in determining its class

Switching and terminal companies are further classified as

Class S). Exclusively switching. This class of companies includes all those performing swinching service only, whether for joint account or for revenue.

Class S2. Exclosively recovered Tris class of companies inclindes all companies furnishing reminal trackage or terminal facilities only, such as amon passenger or freight stations stockwards, etc. for which a charge is made, whether operated for joint account or for sevenue. In case a bridge or fetry is a part of the facilities operated by a terminal commany, it should be

Class \$3. Both switching and terminal. Companies which perform both a switching end a terminal service. This class of companies includes all companies whose operations cover both switching and terminal service, as defined above.
