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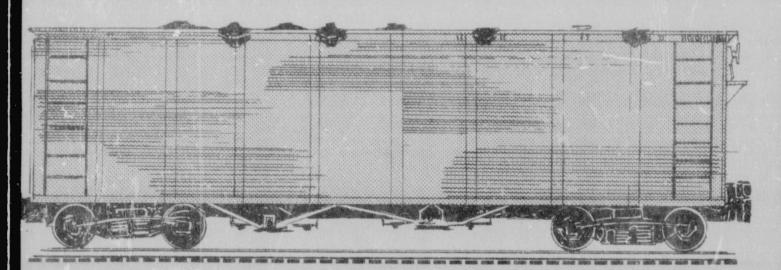

Any carrier or lessor, * * * or any office; agent, employee, or representative thereof, who shall fail to make and file an annual or other report with the Commission within the tene rises by the Commission, or to make specific and full true, and correct answer to any question within furity days from the time it is lowfully required by the Commission so to do, shall forfeit to the United States the sum of one buildred dillars for each and every day it shall critimate to be in default with respect therein.

(8) As used in this section * * * the term 'carrier' means a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such corrier, and the term "lessor' means a person owning a railroad, a water tine, or a pipe line, leased to and operated by a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such lessor. * * *

The respondent is further required to send to the Bureau of Accounts, immediately upon preparation, two copies of its latest annual report to stockholders. See scheduled 108, page 3.

- 3. Every annual report should, in all particulars, be complete in itslef, and references to the returns of former years should not be made to take the place of required entries except as herein otherwise specifically directed or authorized.
- 4. If it be necessary or desirable to insert additional statements, typ written or other, in a report, they should be legibly made on dutable paper and, wherever practicable, on sheets not larger than a page of the Form. Inserted sheets should be securely attached preferably at the inner margin; attachmen by pins or clips is insufficient.
- 5. All entries should be made in a permanent black ink. Those of a contrary character should be indicated in parentheses. Items of an unusual character should be indicated by appropriate symbol and footnote.
- b. Money items except averages, throughout the annual report form should be shown in WHOLE DOLLARS adjusted to accord with footings. Totals for amounts reported in subsidisty accounts included in supporting schedules must be in agreement with related primary accounts.

In applying this classification to any switching or terminal company which is operated as a joint facility of owning or tenant railways, the sum of the a nual railway operating revenues, the joint facility rent income, and the returns to joint facility credit accounts in operating expenses, shall be used in determining its class

Switching and terminal companies are further classified as

Class S1. Exclusively switching. This class of companies includes all above performing switching service only, whether for joint account or for revenue.

Class S2. Exclusively terminal. This class of companies includes all companies furnishing

Class S2. Exclusively terminal. This class of companies includes all companies furnishing terminal trackage, or terminal facilities only, such as union passenger or freight stations, stockyards, etc., for which a charge is made, whether operated for joint account or for revenue. In case a bridge or ferry is a part of the facilities operated by a terminal company, it should be included under this heading.

Class 53. Both switching and ferminal. Companies which perform both a switching and a terminal service. This class of companies includes all companies whose operations cover both switching and ferminal service, as defined above.

Class S4. Bridge and ferry. This class of companies is confined to those whose operations are limited to bridges and ferries exclusively.

Class \$5. Mixed. Companies performing primarily a switching or a terminal service, but which also conduct a regular freight or passenge, traffic. The revenues of this class of companies include, in addition to switching or terminal revenues, those derived from local passenger service, local freight service, participation in through movement of freight or passenger traffic.
