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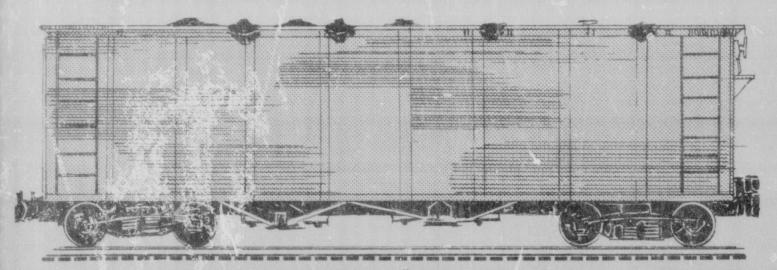

(?) (b). Any person who shall knowingly and willfully make, cause to be made, or participate in the making of, any false entry in any annual or other report required under the section to be filed. * * * or shall knowingly or willfully file with the Commission any false report or other document, shall be deemed guitty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject, upon conviction in any court of the United States of competent jurisdiction, to a fine of not more than five thousand dollars or imprisonment for not nowe than two years, or both such fine and imprisonment. ***

(7) (c) Any carrier or lessor, * * * or any officer, agent, employee, or representative thereof, who shall fail to make and file an annual or other report with the Commission within the time fixed by the Commission, or to make specific and full, true, and correct asswer to also question within theirly days from the time it is lawfully required by the Commission so to do, shall forten to the United States the sum of one hundred dollars for each and every day it shall continue to be to default with content.

18). As used in this section " " " the term "earrier" means a common carrier subject to this pair and includes a receiver or trustee of such carrier, and the term "lessot" means a person oweling a calle ad, a water line, or a pipe line, leased to and operated by a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such lesson. " " " "

The respondent is further required to send to the Bureau of Accounts, immediately upon preparation, two copies of its latest annual report to stockholders. See scheduled 108, page 3.

2. The instructions in this Form should be carefully observed, and each question should be answered fully and accurately, whether it has been answered in a previous annual report or not. Except in cases wifere they are specifically authorized, cancellations, arbitrary check marks, and the like should not be used either as partial or as intire answers to inquiries. Operating companies / including switching and terminal) are broadly classified, with respect to their operating revenues, according to the following general definitions.

Class I companies are those having annual operating revenues of \$5,000,000 or more. For this class. Annual Report Form R-1 is provided.

Class II companies are those faving annual operating revenues below \$5,000,000. For this class. Annual Report Form R-2 is provided.

In applying this classification to any switching or terminal company which is operated as a joint facility of owning or tenant railways, the sum of the annual railway operating revenues, the joint facility rent income, and the returns to joint facility credit accounts in operating expenses, shall be used in determining its class.

Switching and terminal companies are further classified as

Class St. Exclusively switching. This class of companies includes all those performing switching service only, whether for joint account or for revenue.

Class A Exchange training. This class of companies includes all companies furnishing terminal trackage or terminal facilities only, such as union passenger or freight stations, stocking by etc., the which a charge is made, whether operated for joint account or for revenue. In core a ordige or story is a part of the facilities operated by a terminal company, it should be metalled under this should be

Class S. Both switching and terminal. Companies which perform both a switching and a securing service. This class of companies includes all companies whose operations cover both switching as a terminal service, as defined above.

Class S4. Bridge and ferry. This class of companies is confined to those whose operations are amoved to type ground ferries exclusively.

Class S. Mixe's Companies performing primarily a switching or a terminal service, but which also conduct a regular freight or passenger traffic. The resembes of this c'ass of companies sociade, in addition to softehing of terminal revenues, those derived from local passenger service, local freight service, participation in through movement of freight or possenger traffic, other transportation operations, and operations other than trussportation.

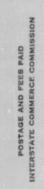
