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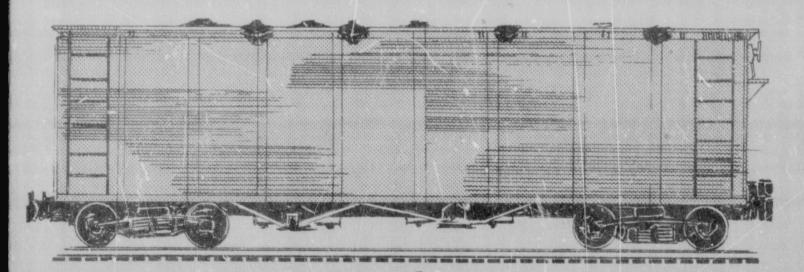

(2) Said annual reports shall contain all the required information for the period of twelve in online ending on the 31st day of December in each year, unless the Commission shall specify a different date, and shall be made out under each and filed with the Commission at its office in Washington within three months after the close of the year for which report is made, unless additional time be granted in any case by the Commission:

(7) (b). Any person who shall knowingly and willfully make, cause to be made, or participate in the making of, any faise entry in any annual or other report required under the section to be filed, \* \* \* or shall knowingly or willfully file with the Commission any faise report or scher document, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeason and shall be subject, upon conviction in an, court of the United States of Competent pursuitation, to a fine of not more than have thousand dottars or imprisonment for not more than two years, or both such fine and imprisonment. \*\*\*

(7) (c). Any carrier of lessor, " " " or any officer, agent, employee, or representative thereof, who shall fail to make and file an annual or other report with the Commission within the time fixed by the Commission, or to make specific and full, true, and correct answer to any question within thirty days from the time it is fawfally required by the Commission so to do, shall forfer to the United States the sum of one hundred dollars for each and every day it shall continue to be in default with respect there to.

(8) As used in this section " " " the term "carrier" means a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such carrier, and the term "lessor" means a person owning a railword, a water line, or a pipe line, lessed to and operated by a common carrier whitest to the part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such ressor. " "

The respondent is further required to send to the Bureau of Accounts, immediately upon preparation, two copies of its latest annual report to stockholders. See scheduled 108, page 3.

2. The instructions in this Form should be carefully observed, and each questi in should be answered fully and accurately, whether it has been answered in a previous annual report or not. Excent in cases where they are specifical' authorized, cancellations, arbitrary check marks. and the like should not be used either as partial or as entire answers to inquiries. 6. Money items except averages, throughout the annual report form should be shown in WHOLE DOLLARS adjusted to accord with footings. Totals for amounts reported in subsidiary accounts included in supporting schedules must be in agreement with delated primary accounts.

7. Each respondent should make its annual report to this Commission in triplicate, retaining one copy in its files for reference in case correspondence with regard to such report becomes necessary. For this reason three copies of the Form are sent to each corporation concerned.

8. Railroad exporations, mainly distinguished as operating companies and lessor companies, are for the purpose of report to the Interstate Commerce Commission divided into classes. An operating company is one whose officers direct the business of transportation and whose books contain operating as well as financial accounts, and, a tessor company, the property of which being leased to and operated by another company, is one that maintains a separate legal existence and keeps financial but not operating accounts. In making reports, lessor companies use Annual Report Form R-4

Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broadly classified, with respect to their operating revenues, according to the following general definitions:

Class I companies are those lawing annual operating revenues of \$5,000,000 or more. For this class, Appeal Report Form R-1 is provided.

Class II companies are those having annual operating revenues below \$5,000,000. For this class, Annual Report Form R-2 is provided.

In applying this classification to any switching or terminal company which is operated as a joint facility of owning or tenant railways, the sum of the annual railway operating revenues, the joint facility cent income, and the returns to joint facility credit accounts in operating expenses, shall be used in determining its class.

Switching and terminal companies are further classified as:

Class S1. Exclusively switching. This class of comparies includes all those performing switching service only weighter for joint account or for revenue.

Class S2. Exclusively terminal. This class of companies includes all companies furnishing terminal trackage or terminal facilities only, such as union passenger or freight stations, stockwards, etc. for which a charge is made, whether operated for joint account or for revenue. In case, a bridge or ferry is a part of the facilities operated by a terminal company, it should be overfuled under this heading.

Class 53. Both switching and reminal. Companies which perform both a switching and a terminal service. This class of companies includes all companies whose operations cover both switching and reminal service, as defined above.

Class 54. Bridge and ferry. This class of companies is coramed to those whose operations are limited to bedges and ferrice exclusively.

Class \$3. Mined. Companies performing primarily a switching or a terminal service, but which also conder, a regular freight or posenger traffic. The revenues of this class of companies include in addition to switching or terminal revenue, those derived from local passenger service, local freight service, participation in this way, assented of freight or passenger traffic, office transportation operations, and operations other than transportation.

9. Except where the context clearly indicates some other meaning, the following terms when used in this Form have the meanings below stated:

COMMISSION means the Interstate Commerce Commission. RESPONDENT means the person of corporation in whose behalf report is made. The YEAR means the year ended December 31 for which the report is made. The CLOSE OF THE YEAR means the close of business on December 31 of the year for which the report is made for a shorter period than one year, it means the close of the period covered by the report. The BEGINNING OF THE YEAR means the beginning of business on January 1 of the year for which the report is made, or, in case the report is made for a shorter period than one year, it means the beginning of its period covered by the report. The PRECEDING YEAR means the year ended December 31 of the year next preceding the year for which the report is made.
