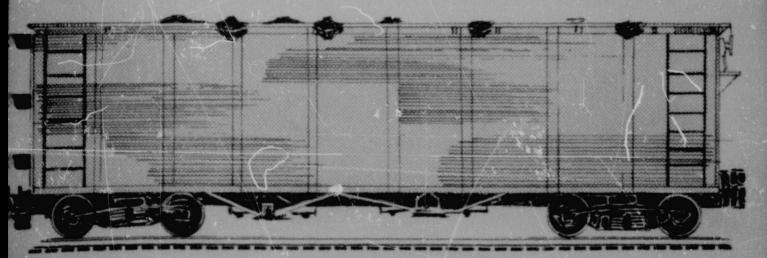

(1) The Commission is hereby authorized to require armual, periodical, or special reports from carriers, lessors, * * * (as defined in this section), to pres ribe the manner and form in which such reports shall be made, and to require from such carriers, lessors, * * * specific and full, true, and correct answers to all questions upon which the Commission may deem information to be necessary, classifying such carriers, lessors, * * * as it may deem proper for any of these purposes. (7) (b). Any person who shall knowingly and willfully make, cause to be made, or participate in the making of, any false entry in any annual or other report required under the section to be cause to be made, or participate in the making of, any faise entry in any annual or other report required under the section to be filed. " " or shall knowingly or willfully file with the Commission any faise report or other document, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject, upon conviction in any court of the United States of competent jurisdiction, to a fine of not more than five thousand dollars or imprisonment for not more than two years, or both such fine and imprisonment: " "

(7) (c). Any carrier or lessad, "" or any officer, agent, employee, or representative thereof, who shall fail to make and file an annual or other report with the Commission within the time fixed by the Commission, or to make specific and full, true, and correct answer to any questions within thirty days from the time it is a sirvily required by the Commission to do, shall forfeit to the United States the sum of one hundred dollars for each and every day it shall continue to be in default with respect thereto.

(8). As used in this section " - the term "carrier" means a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or

common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such cyrrier, and the term "lescor" means a person owning a railroad, a water line, or a pipe line; leased to and operated by a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or truster of such lessor. * *

The respondent is further required to send to the Bureau of Accounts, immediately upon preparation, two copies of its latest

annual report to stockholders. See schedule D, page 7.

2. The instructions in this Form should be carefully observed. and each question should b. answered july and accurately, whether it has been answered in a previous annual report or not. Except in cases where they are specifically anthorized, cancellations, arbitrary check marks, and the like should not be usen either as part at or as entire answers to inquiries. If any inquiry, based and preceding inquiry in the present report form is, because of the answer rendered to such preceding inquiry, inapplicable to the person or corporation in whose behalf the report is made, such notation as "Not applicable; see page , schedule (or line) number

should be used in answer thereto, giving precise reference to the portion of the report showing the facts which make the inquiry inapplicable. Where the word "none" truly and completely states the fact, it should be given as the answer to any particular inquiry or any particular portion of an inquiry. Where dates are called for, the month and day should be stated as well as the year. Customary abbreviations may be a sed in stating dates.

3. Every annual report should, in ail furticulars, be complete in itself, and references to the returns of former years should not be made to take the place of required entries except as herein

otherwise specifically directed or authorized.

- 4. 8 Railroad corporations, mainly distinguished as operating companies and lessor companies, ere for the purpose of report to the Interstate Commerce Commission divided into classes. An operating company is one whose officers direct the business of transportation and whore books contain operating as well as financial accounts; and, a lessor company, the property of which being leased to and operated by another company, is one that smaintains a separate legal existence and keeps financial but not operating accounts. In making reports, lessor companies use Annual Report Form R-4.

Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broadly classified, with respect to their operating revenues, according to the following general definitions:

Class I companies are those having annual operating revenues of \$50,000,000, or more. For this class, Annual Report Form R-1 is

Class II companies are those having annual operating revenues less than \$50,000,000 but in excess of \$10,000,000. For this class, Annual Peport Form R-2 is provided.

Class III companies are those having annual operating revenues of \$10,000,600, or less. For this class, Annual Report Form R-3

In applying this classification to any switching or terminal company which is operated as a joint facility of owning or tenant railways, the sum of the annual railway operating revenues, the joint facility rent income, and the returns to joint facility credit accounts in operating expenses, shall be used in determining its class

Switching and terminal companies are further classified as:

Class Si. Exclusively switching. This class of exampanies includes all those performing switching service only, whether for inent account or for revenue.

Class S2 Exclusively terminal. This class of companies includes all companies furnishing terminal trackage or terminal facilities only, such as union passenger or freight statiom, stockyards, etc., for which a charge is made, whether operated for joint account or for revenue. In case a bridge or ferry is a part of the facilities operated by a terminal company, it should be included under this heading.

Class S3. Both switching and terminal. Corapanies which perform both a switching and a terminal service. This class of companies includes all companies whose operations conv both switching and

terminal service, as defined above

Class S4. Bridge and ferry. This class of companies is confined to those whose operations are limited to bridges and ferries exclusively. C.ass S5. Mixed. Companies performing primarily a switching or a terminal service, but which also conduct a regular freight or passenger traffic. The revenues of this class of companies include, in addition to possess. passenger traits. The revenues of this class of companies include, in addition to switching or terminal revenues, those derived from local passenger service, local freight service, participation in through movement of freight or passenger traffic, other transportation operations, and operations other than transportation.

9. Except where the context clearly indicates some other meaning, the following terms when used in this Form have the meanings below stated:

COMMISSION means the Interstate Commerce Commission. RESPONDENT means the person or corporation in whose behalf the report is made. THE YEAR means the year ended December 31 for which the report is made. THE CLOSE OF THE YEAR means the close of business on December 31 of the year for which the report is made; or, in case the report is made for a shorter period than one year, it means the close of the period covered by the report. THE BEGINNING OF THE YEAR means the beginning of business on January 1 of the year for which the report is made, or, in case the report is made for a shorter period than one year, it means the beginning of the period covered by the report. THE PRECEDING YEAR means the year ended December 33 of the year next preceding the year for which the report is made. THE UNIFORM System in Part 1201 of Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, as amended

10. Railroads and all companies considered to be carriers under Section 5(3) of the Interstate Commerce Act having gross carrier operating revenues of \$20 million or more shall file the Annual Report Supplement Corporate Disclosure. This supplement is an integral part of the annual report and shall be submitted concurrently. Subject railroads are not required to file Schedules 380, 381, and 390.

Railroads with carrier operating revenues less than \$20 million shall complete all applicable schedules in this report.

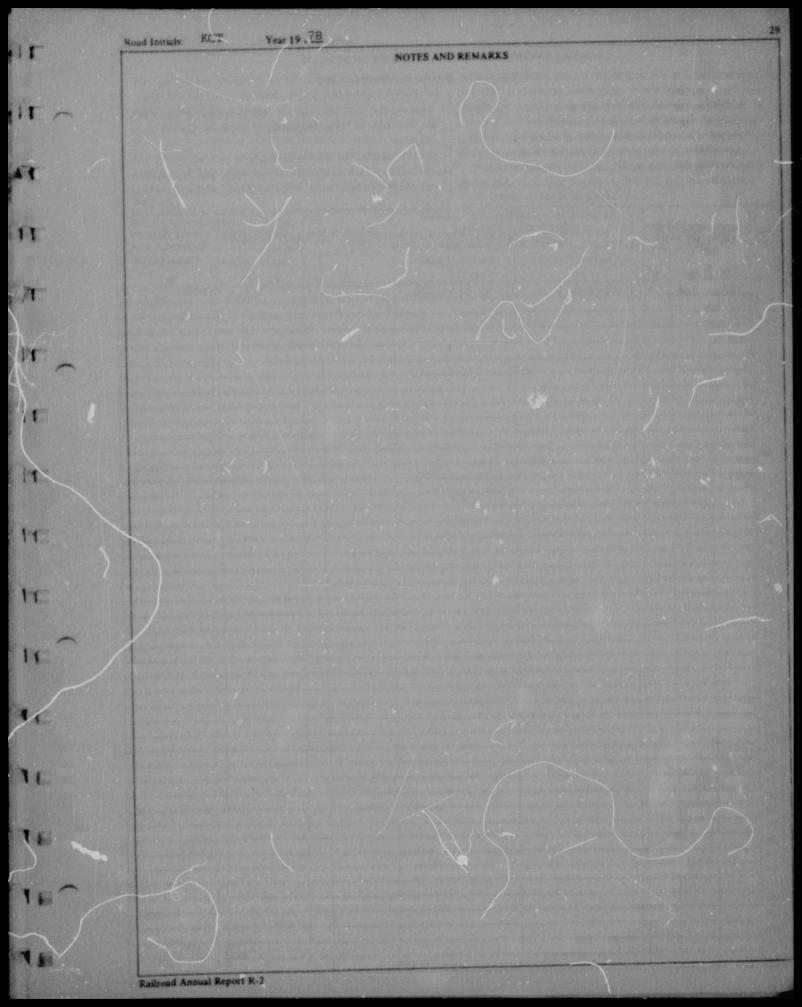

- (1) Capital Leases are those leases which meet one or more of the following four criteria:
 - The lease transfers ownership of the property to the lessee by the end of the lease term.
 - The lease contains a bargain purchase option,
 - The lease term is equal to 75 percent or more of the estimated economic life of the property, and
 - The present value at the beginning of the lease term of the minimum lease payments equals or exceeds 90 percent of the fair value of the leased property to the lessor at the inception of the lease less any related investment tax credit retained by the lessor.
- (2) Operating leases are those leases which do not meet any of the four criteris pertaining to capital leases,
- (3) Minimum lease payments are the payments that the lessee is obligated to make or can be required to make in connection with the leased property. Executory costs such as insurance, maintenance and taxes in connection with the leased property shall be excluded from minimum lease payments.
- (4) Present value minimum lease payments are lease payments that the lessee is obligated to make or can be required to make, exclusive of executory cost. Moreover, these payments are reduced by amounts representing interest, calculated at the companies' incremental borrowing rate on the implicit rate computed by the lessor.
- (5) Noncancelable lease/sublease is one that has an initial or remaining term of one year or more and is noncancelable. er is cancelable only upon the occurrence of some remote contingency or upon the payment of a substantial penalty.
