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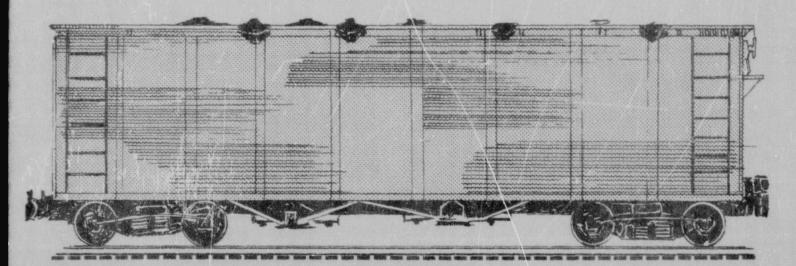

ail itional time be granted in any case by the Commiss on.

2) (b) Any person who shell knowingly and wilifully make, cause to be made, or participate in the making of, any faise entry in any annual or other report required under the section to be iled, " " or shall knowingly or willfully file with the Commission any false report or other document, shall be decimed guilty of a modernianor and shall be subject, upon conviction in any court of the United Vitates of competent jurisdiction, to a line of not more than five thousand divilars or imprisonment for not more than two sears or both such fine and imprisonment." \* "

(7) (c). Any carrier or lessor, " " " or any officer up nt, emologies, or representative thereof, who shall fail to make and file an annual or other report with the Commission within the time fixed by the Commission, or to make specific and full, true, and correct answer to any question within thirty days from the time it is lawfully required by the Commission so to do, shall forter to the United States the sum of one hundred dollars for each and every day it shall continue to be in default with respect thereto.

(8) As used in this section \* \* \* the term "carrier" means a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such carrier; and the term "leasor" means a person owning a railroad, a water line, or a pipe line; leased to and operated by a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such fessor. \* \*

The respondent is further required to send to the Bureau of Accounts, immediately upon preparation, two copies of its latest annual report to stockholders. See scheduled 108, page 3.

- 2. The instructions in this Form should be carefully observed, and each question should be answered fully and accurately, whether it has been answered in a previous annual report or not. Except in cases where they are specifically authorized, cancellations, arbitrary check marks, and the like should not be used either as partial or as entire answers to inquiries. Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broaclassified, with respect to their operating revenues, according to following general definitions:

Class I companies are those having annual operating revenues of \$5,000,600 of more. For class. Adnual Report Form R-1 is provided.

Class II companies are those having a must operating revenues below \$5,000,000. For class. Annual Report Form R-2 is provided.

In applying this classification to any switching or terminal comp which is operated as a joint facility of owning or tenant railways, sum of the annual railway operating revenues the joint facility i income, and the returns to joint facility credit accounts in operaexpenses, shall be used in devermining its class.

Switching and terminal companies are further classified as:

Class S1. Exclusively switching. This class of companies includes all those perfor switching service only, whether for joint account or for reveaue.

Class S2. Exclusively tenninal. This class of companies includes all companies furniforminal trackage of terminal facilities unity, such as union passenger or freight star stockyards, etc. for which a charge is made, whether operated for joint account or for revel in case a bridge or ferry is a part of the facilities operated by a terminal company, it shoul included under this heading.

Class 53. Both switching and terminal. Companies which perform both a switching a terminal service. This class of companies includes all companies whose operations cover cwitching and terminal service, as defined above.

Class S4. Bridge and ferry. This class of companies is confined to those whose operation limited to bridges and ferries exclusively.

Class S5. Mixed. Companies performing primarily a switching or a verninal acrvice, but widso conduct a regular freight or passenger traffic. The revenues of this class of companient do, in addition to switching or terminal revenues, those derived from local passe service, local freight service, participation in through movement of freight or passenger in other transportation operations, and operations other than transportation operations.
