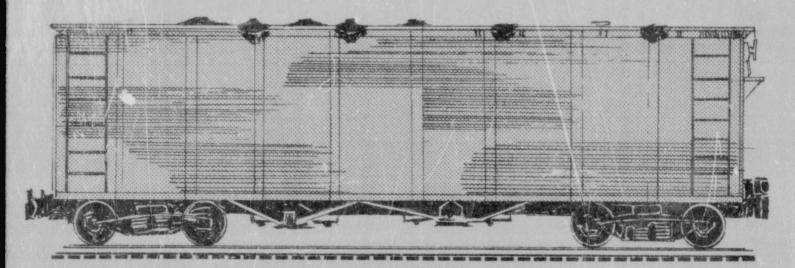

(7) (b) Any person who shall knowingly and willfully make, cause to be made, for participate in the making of, any false entry in any annual or other report required under the section to be filed. * * * or shad knowingly or willfully file with the Commission any Yelse report or other document, shell be deemed guity of a misdemeaning and shall be subject, upon conviction in any court of the United Stores of competent jurisdiction, so a true of not more than five thousand dollars or impressionment for not fivere than 1900 years, or both such fine and impressionment. **

(7) (c) Any carrier or lessor, " " " or any office), agent, employee, or representative thereof, who shall full to make and file an annual or other report with the Commission within the time fitted by the Commission, or to gathe specific and full, " and correct uniwer to any question within theirly days from the time it is lawfully required by the Commission so to do, state for fact to the Limbed States the sum of one hundred dollars for each and every day it shall continue to be in default with respect thereto.

(8) As used in this section * * * the term "carrier" means a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or rurine of such carrier and the term "lessor" means a person owning a railroad a water flue, or a pape line; leased to and operated by a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such lessor. * * * *

The respondent is further required to send to the Bureau of Accounts, immediately upon preparation, two copies of its latest annual report to stockholders. See scheduled 108, page 3.

2. The instructions in this Form should be carefully observed, and each question should be answered fully and accurately, whether it has been answered in a previous annual report or not. Except in cases where they are specifically authorized, cancellations, arbitrary check marks, and the like should not be used either as partial or as entire answers to inquiries.
