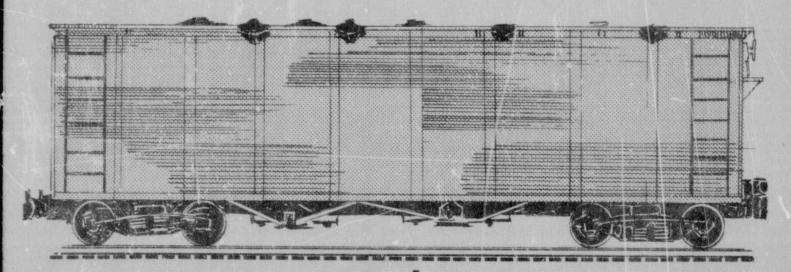

### NOTICE

1. This Form for annual report should be filled out in tripicale and two copies returned to the Interstate Commerce Commission. Bureau of Accounts, Washington, D.C. 20423, by March 31 of the year following that for which the report is made. Attention is specially directed to the following provisions of Part 1 of the Interstate Commerce Act:

Sec. 20. (1) The Commission is bereby authorized to require annual, periodical, or special reports from carriers, lessors, \* \* \* (as defined in this section), to prescribe the manner and form in which such reports shall be made, and to require from such carriers, lessors, \* \* a specific and full, true, and correct answers to all questions upon \*-bich the Commission may deem information to be necessary, classifying such carsiers, lessors, \* \* \* a at may deem proper for any of these purposes. Such annual reports shall give an account of the affairs of the carrier, lessor, \* \* \* in such form and detail as may be prescribed by the Courrussion.

(2) Said annual reports shall contain all the required information for the period of twelve months ending or the 31st day of December it each year, unless the Commission shall speedy a different date, and shall be made out under oath and filed with the Commission in its office in Washington within three months ofter the close of the year for which report is made, unless additional time—be granted in any case by the Commission.

(7) (b). Any person who shall knowingly and willfully make, cause to be no le, or participate in the making of, any false entry in any annual or other report required under the section to be filed. \* \* \* or shall knowingly or wilfully file with the Commission any false report or other document, shall be "econed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject upon correction in any court of the United States of competent jurisdiction, to a fine of not more than five thousand dollars or imprisonment for not more than two years, or both such fine and imprisonment. \*\* \*

Chilch. Any carrier or lessor, " " " or any officer, agent, employee, or representative thereof, who shall fail to make and file an annual or other report with the Commission within the time fixed by the Commission, or to make specific and fail, true, and correct answer to any question within thirty days from the time it is lawfully required by the Commission so to do, shall forfer to the United States the sum of one hundred dollars for each and every day it shall continue to be in default with respect thereto.

(8) As used in this section \* \* \* the term "carrier" means a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such carrier, and the term "lessor" means a person owning a railroad, a water line, or a pipe line, leased to and operated by a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such lessor. \* \* \*

The respondent is further required to send to the Bureau of Accounts, immediately upon preparation, two copies of its latest annual report to stockholders. See scheduled 108, page 3.

- 2. The instructions in this Form should be carefully observed, and each question should be answered fully and accurately, whether it has been answered in a previous annual report or not. Except in cases where they are specifically authorized, cancellations, arbitrary check marks, and the like should not be used either as partial or as entire answers to inquiries. If any inquiry, based on a preceding inquiry in the present report form is, because of the answer rendered to such preceding inquiry, inapplicable to the person or corporation in whose behalf the report is made, such notation as "Not applicable; see pageschedule (or line) number--- should be used in answer thereto, giving precise reference to the postion of the report showing the facts which make the inquiry inapplicable. Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broad classified, with respect to their operating revenues, according to a following general definitions:

Class I companies are those having annual operating revenues of \$5,000,000 or more. For class, Annual Report, Form R-1 is provided.

Class II companies are those having annual operating revenues below \$5,000,000. For class, Annual Report Form R-2 is provided

in applying this classification to any switching or terminal compa which is operated as a joint facility of owning or tenant railways, it sum of the annual railway operating revenues, the joint facility reincome, and the returns to joint facility credit accounts in operatiexpenses, shall be used in determining its class.

Switching and terminal companies are further classified as:

Class SI. Exchalvely switching. This class of companies includes all those perform switching service only, whether for joint account or for revenue.

Class S2. Exclusively terminal. This class of companies includes all companies furnish terminal trackage or terminal facilities only, such as union possenger or freight static stockyards, etc., for which a hearge is made, whether operated for joint recount or for rever In case a bridge of ferty as part of the facilities operated by a terminal company, it should be installed under this feedback.

Class S3. Both switching and terminal. Companies which perform both a switching and terminal service. This class of companies includes all companies whose operations cover be switching and terminal service, as defined above.

Class S4. Bridge and ferry. This class of companies is confined to those whose operations limited to bridges and ferries exclusively.

Class S5. Mixed. Companies performing primarily a switching or a terminal service, but whatso conduct a regular freight or passenger traffic. The revenues of this class of companinclude, in addition to switching or terminal revenues, those derived from local passen service, local freight service, participation in through movement of freight or passenger trafform reamportation operations, and operations other than teamportation.
