MOTICE

1. This Form for annual report should be filled out in triplicate and two copies returned to the Interstate Commerce Commission, Bureau of Accounts, Washington, D.C. 20423, by March 31, of the year following that for which the report is made. (7) (b) Any person who shall knowingly and willfully make, cause to be made or participate in the noking of, any false entry in any annual or other report required under this section to be filed. * * or shall anowingly or willfully file with the Canmission any false report or other document, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject, upon conviction in any court of the United States of competent jurisdiction, to a fine of not more than five thousand dolure or imprisonment for not more than two years, or both such fine and imprisonment: * * or any officer, agent, employee, or representative thereof, who shall fail to make and file an annual or other report with the Commission within the time fixed by the Commission, or to make specific and full, true, and correct answer to any question within thirty days from the time it is lawfully required by the Commission so to do, shall forfeit to the United States the sum of one hundred declars for each and every day it shall continue to be in default with respect thereto.

another company, is one that maintains a separate legal existence and keeps financial but not operating accounts. In making reports, lessor companies use Annual Report Form E.

Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broadly classified, with respect to their operating revenues, according to the following general definitions:

Class I companies are those having annual operating revenues of \$5,000,000, or more. For this class, Annual Report Form A is provided.

Class II companies are those having annual operating revenues below \$5,000,000. For this class, Annual Report Form C is provided.

In applying this classification to any switching or terminal company which is operated as a joint facility of owning or tenant railroads, the sum of the annual railway operating revenues, the joint facility rent income, and the returns to joint facility credit accounts in operating expenses, shall be used in determining its class.

Switching and terminal companies are further classified as:

Class SI. Exclusively switching. This class of companies includes all those performing switching service only, whether for joint account

Class S2. Exclusively terminal. This class of companies includes all companies furnishing terminal trackage or terminal facilities only, such as union passeager or freight stations, stockyards, etc., for which a charge is made, whether operated for joint account or for revenue. In case a bridge or ferry is a part of the facilities operated by a terminal company, it should be included under this heading.

Class S3. Both switching and terminal. Companies which perform both a switching and a terminal service. This class of companies includes all companies whose operations cover both switching and terminal service, as defined above.

Class S4. Bridge and ferry. This class of companies is confined to those whose operations are limited to bridges and ferries exclusively.

Class S5. Mixed. Companies performing primarily a switching or a terminal service, but which also conduct a regular freight or passenger traffic. The revenues of this class of companies include, in addition to switching or terminal revenues, those derived from local passenger service, local freight service, participation in through movement of freight or passenger traffic, other transportation operations, and operations other than terminal traffic. ations other than transportation.

8. Except where the context clearly indicates some other meaning, the following terms when used in this Form have the meanings below stated:

COMMISSION means the Interstate Commerce Commission. EPONDENT means the person or corporation in whose behalf the report is made. The YEAR means the year ended December 31 for which the report is made. The CLOSE OF THE YEAR means the close of business on December 31 of the year for which the report is made; or, in case the December 31 of the year for which the report is made; or, in ease the report is made for a shorter period than one year, it means the close of the period covered by the report. THE VEGINNING OF THE YEAR means the beginning of business on January 1 o', the year for which the report is made; or, in case the report is made for a shorter period than one year, it means the beginning of the period covered by the report. THE PRECEDING YEAR means the year ended December 31 of the year next preceding the year for which the report is made. THE UNIFORM SYSTEM OF ACCOUNTS FOR RAILROAD COMPANIES means the system of accounts in Part 1201 of Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, as amended.

The respondent is an unincorporated agency known as the Los Angeles Union Passenger Terminal.

The three Proprietary Companies — The Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway Company; Los Angeles & Salt Lake Railroad Company (now under lease to Union Pacific Railroad Company); and Southern Pacific Transportation Company (Southern Pacific Railroad Company consenting) — entered into an agreement dated September 11, 1933, designated as the "Preliminary Agreement," under which these three railroad systems undertook to construct as a joint agency the Los Angeles Union Passenger Terminal.

The agreement of September 11, 1933, provided terms and conditions for construction and operation. Subsequent thereto, namely on April 15, 1938, the Southern Pacific Transportation Company, Southern Pacific Railroad Company, The Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway Company, Union Pacific Railroad Company, and Los Angeles & Salt Lake Railroad Company entered into another agreement, designated as the 'Permanent Agreement," under the terms of which they were to complete and thereafter operate the Los Angeles Union Passenger Terminal.

The construction of this Terminal was ordered by the Railroad Commission of the State of California in Decision No. 18593 of July 8, 1927 (30 C.R.C. 151) and Interstate Commerce Commission Finance Docket No. 14788, 142 I.C.C. 489 of May 8, 1928.

Operation of the Union Passenger Terminal began May 7, 1939.

You have copy of the Permanent Agreement transmitted to you by Mr. Frank Karr, Chairman of the Law Committee, on February 8, 1939.

510. GRADE CROSSINGS A-RAILROAD WITH RAILROAD

1. A crossing of a railroad with a railroad means the intersection of all the tracks on one right-of-way with all of the tracks on another right-of-way, whether or not owned or operated by the same company; thus, the intersection of one double-track line with another double-track line shall be reported as one crossing. Each such crossing shall be reported only by the earrier who performs the actual maintenance of the signal or interlocking protection, if so provided, or by the earrier who maintains the crossing frogs where no protection exists. The carrier which actually performs the maintenance shall be the reporting carrier, even though other party, or parties, assume a part or all of the expense of such maintenance. Where portions of the apparatus are maintained by two or more companies, as for example—the condition where one crossing frog is maintained by one company and the second frog by the other company, agreement should be made between carriers as to which shall report. Report should be made of each crossing, whether main line, branch line, or switching tracks are involved, so long as separate rights-of-way are involved, tegradless of whether or not the rights-of-way involved are owned or leased

by the same company. A cross-over from one track to another on the same right-of-way, or the use of a crossing frog for the intersection of two tracks in the same right-of-way, is not to be considered as a crossing in this connection. If one right-of-way intersects two or more rights-of-way in the same vicinity a separate crossing shall be reported for each such intersection, even though all are controlled by one interlocking plant. In such case, this fact should be explained in a footnote in order that the interlocking plant may not be counted more than once.

2. The term "Protection" as used in this connection should include all signalling or derailing devices which may restrict the use of the crossing by either carrier. It shall not include stationary or other cautionary signs which merely indicate the proximity of a crossing. Where crossings are protected by more than one of the types of protection shown in columns (b) to (i) inclusive, the kind of protection, etc., should be reported in only one classification and that of the more elaborate type.
