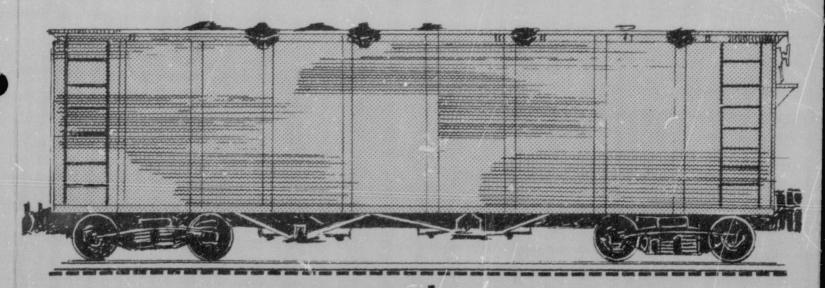

In making reports, lessor companies use Annual Report Form R-4

> Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broadly classified, with respect to their operating revenues, according to the following general definitions:

Class I companies are those having annual operating revenues of \$10,000,000 or more. For this class. Annual Report Form R-1 is provided.

Class II companies are those having annual operating revenues below \$10,000,000. For this class, Annual Report Form R-2 is provided

Class \$5. Mixed. Companies performing primarily a switching or a terminal service, but which also conduct a regular freight or passenger traffic.
