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

397, GRADE CROSSINGS A-RAIL WAY WITH RAIL WAY

416C. GRADE CROSSINGS A-RAILWAY WITH RAILWAY

A crossing with a radway is to be regarded as comprising all the tracks within the right-of-way of the sespondent, owned or leased, that are crossed by the track or tracks eliber of its own lines or of another steam or electric radway at a definite point of intersection. B-RAILWAY WITH HIGHWAY

A highray crossing is to be regarded as a crossing comprising a/i the tracks within, or immediately adjacent to, the right of way of the respondent, owned or leased, at a definite point of intersection with a highway. The returns pertain to crossings with streets, avonues, and highways and should relate to public crossings only. Private, crossings (such as farm lance, or made leading to or within industrial plants) are to be excluded. Highway creesings with industrial tracks, not owned or leased by the res-
