lessor company, the property of which being leased to and operated by another company, is one that maintains s, separate legal existence and keeps financial but not operating accounts. In making reports, lessor companies use Annual Report Form E.

Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broadly classified, with respect to their operating veveries, according to the following general definitions:

Class I companies are those having annual operating revenues of \$5,000,000 or more. For this class, Annual Report Form A is provided.

Class II companies are those having annual operating revenues below 5,000,000. For this class, Annual Report Form C is provided. \$5,000,000.

In applying this classification to any switching or terminal company which is operated as a joint facility of owning or tenant railways, the sum of the annual railway operating revenues, the joint facility rent income, and the returns to joint facility credit accounts in operating expenses, shall be used in determining its class.

Switching and terminal companies are further classified as:

Class S1. Exclusively switching. This class of companies includes all those performing switching service only, whether for joint account or for revenue.

Class S2. Exclusively terminal. This class of companies includes all companies furnishing terminal trackage or terminal facilities only, such as union passenger or freight stations, stockyards, etc., for which a charge is made, whether operated for joint account or for revenue. In case a bridge or ferry is a part of the facilities operated by a terminal company, it should be included under this heading.

Class S3. Both switching and terminal. Companies which perform both a switching and a terminal service. This class of companies includes all companies whose operations cover both switching and terminal service, as defined above.

Class S4. Bridge and ferry. This class of companies is confined to those whose operations are limited to bridges and ferries exclusively.

Class S5. Mixed. Companies performing primarily a switching or a terminal service, but which also conduct a regular freight or passenger traffic. The revenues of this class of companies include, in addition to switching or terminal revenues, those derived from local passenger service, local freight service, participation in through movement of freight or passenger traffic, other transportation operations, and operations other than transportation.

300. IDENTITY OF RESPONDENT

12. The respondent was incorporated April 24, 1962 under the general corporation laws of the State of Ohio as Midway Railroad Company, a wholly owned subsidiary of the Columbus and Southern Ohio Electric Company.

Railroad assets were acquired from Ohio-Midland Light and Power Company. The transaction was authorized by The Public Utilities Commission of Ohio, order number 30,614, dated March 13, 1962. The Interstate Commerce Commission authorized the acquisition and operation of the railroad by the respondent on Docket No. 22601, dated October 28, 1963. Authority was granted to the respondent to issue 397 shares of no-par value common stock having a stated value of \$1,000 per share on Docket No. 22602, dated October 28, 1963.

The respondent filed an application under Section 1 (18) of the Interstate Commerce Act on October 24, 1972 for a certificate of public convenience and necessity permitting abandonment of a line of railroad extending from the southern corporation line of Lockbourne between the Norfolk & Western and the Chesapeake & Ohio lines, south and west to the Picway electric generating station of Columbus and Southern Ohio Electric Company, a distance of 4.09 miles in Franklin and Pickaway Counties, Ohio. This line constitutes all the lines owned by the respondent.

A Certificate and Order authorizing the abandonment of the line was issued by the Interstate Commerce Commission dated December 8, 1972 (Docket No. AB-63). Abandonment was consummated pursuant to that order on September 20, 1973 and notice of the abandonment was duly given to the Interstate Commerce Commission.

Journal entries to record the retirement of the respondent from service were submitted to the Interstate Commerce Commission on September 27, 1973 and notice of acceptance of the accounting was given to the respondent by the Bureau of Accounts on October 19, 1973. The respondent was merged into Columbus and Southern Ohio Electric Company (parent company) on September 28, 1973, and prior to this date respondent no longer owned any locomotive or rolling stock.

On November 23, 1973, notice was given to the Interstate Commerce Commission by respondent of cancellation of the Powers of Attorney and Concurrences applicable to the line. Duplicate copies of the notice were sent to the agents, associations and carriers listed in that notice.

COMPARATIVE GENERAL BALANCE SHEET-EXPLANATORY NOTES

The notes listed below are provided for the purpose of disclosing supplementary information concerning matters which have an important effect on the financial condition of the carrier. 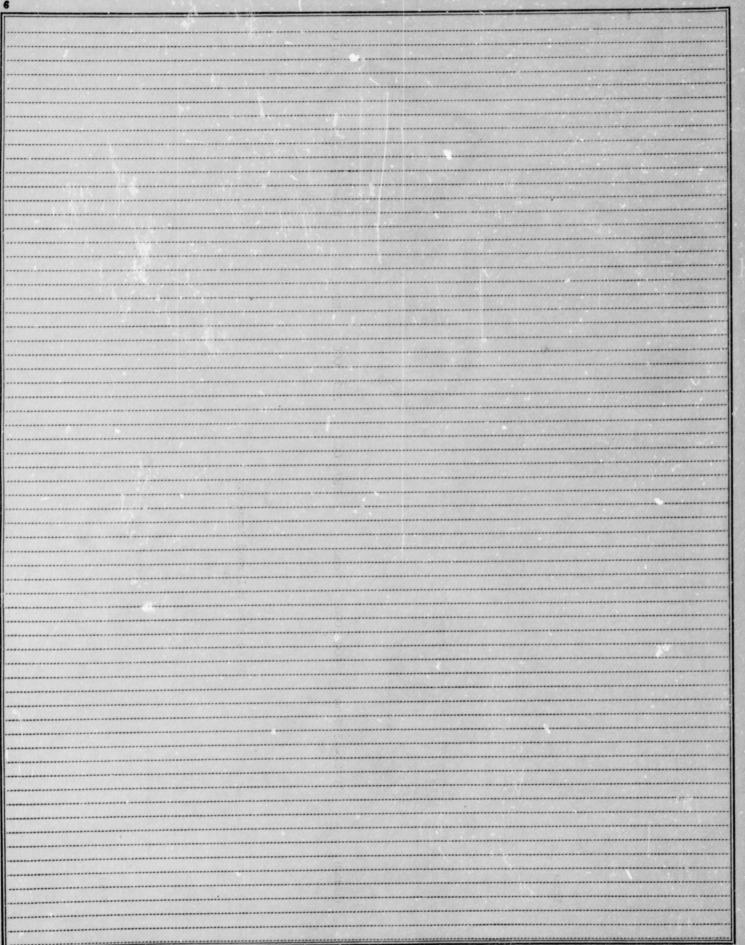
