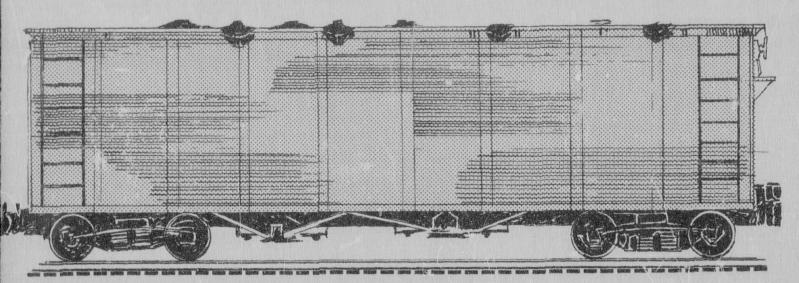

Any carrier or lessor, * * * or any officer, agent, employee, or representative thereof who shall fail to make and file an annual or other report with the Commission within the time fixed by the Commission, or to make specific and full, true, and correct answer to any question within thirty days from the time it is lawfully required by the Commission so to do, shall forfeit to the United States the sum of one hundred dollars for each and every day it shall continue to be in default with respect thereto.

(8). As used in this section * * * the term "carrier" means a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such carrier, and the term "lessor" means a person owning a railroad, a water line, or a pipe line; leased to and operated by a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such lessor, * * *

> 8. Railroad corporations, mainly distinguished as operating companies and lessor companies, are for the purpose of report to the Interstate Commerce Commission divided into classes. An operating company is one whose officers direct the business of transportation and whose books contain operating as well as financial accounts; and, a lessor company, the property of which being leased to and operated by another company, is one that maintains a separate legal existence and keeps financial but not operating accounts. In making reports, lessor companies use Annual Report Form R-4

> Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broadly classified, with respect to their operating revenues, according to the following general definitions:

> Class I companies are those having annual operating revenues of \$5,000,000 or more. For this class, Annual Report Form R-1 is provided.

> Class II companies are those having annual operating revenues below \$5,000,000. For this class, Annual Report Form R-2 is provided.

Class S5. Mixed. Companies performing primarily a switching or a terminal service, but which also conduct a regular freight or passenger traffic. The revenues of this class of companies include, in addition to switching or terminal revenues, those derived from local passenger ervice, local freight service, participation in through movement of freight or passenger traffic, other transportation operations, and operations other than transportation.

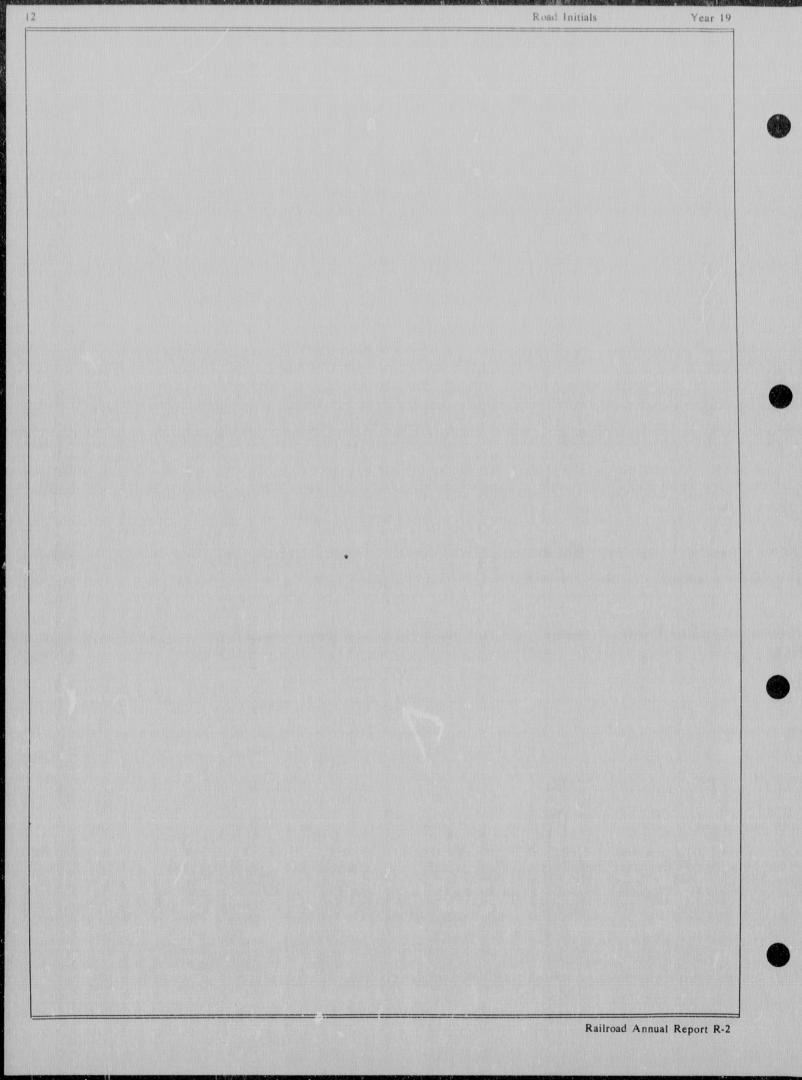
