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

# NOTICE

1. This Form for annual report should be filled out in triplicate and that for which the report is made. Attention is specially directed to the following provisions of Part I of the interstate Commerce Act:

Sec. 20 (1) The Commission is hereby authorized to require annual, periodical, or special reports from carriers, lesssors, \* \* \* (as defined in this section), to prescribe the manner and form in which such reports shall be made, and to require from such carriers, lissors. specific and till, true, and correct answers to all questions upon which the Commission may deem information to be necessary, classifying such carriers, lessors, \* \* \* as it may deem proper for any of these purposes. Any carrier or lessor, 5 5 or any officer, agent, employee, or representative thereof, who shall fail to make and file an annual or other report with the Commission within the time fixed by the Commission, or to make specific and full, true, and correct answer to any question within thirty days from the time it is lawfully required by the Commission so to do shall forfer, to the United States the sum of the hundred dollars for each and every day it shall continue to be in default with respect thereto.

(8). As used in this section " \* " the term "carrier means a common care subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such carrier, and the term "lessor" means a person owning a railroad, a waler line, or a pipe line, leased to and operated by a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such lessor.

An operating company is one whose officers direct the business of transportation and whose books contain operating as well as financial accounts; and, a lessor company, the property of which being leased to and operated by another company, is one that maintains a senarate legal existence and keeps financial but not operating accounts. In making reports, lessor companies use Annual Report Form R-4

> Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broadly classified, with respect to their operating revenues, according to the following general definitions:

> Class I companies are those having annual operating revenues of \$10,000,630 or more. For this class. Annual Report Form R-1 is provided.

> Class II companies are those having annual operating revenues below \$10,000,000. For this class, Annual Report Form R-2 is provided.
