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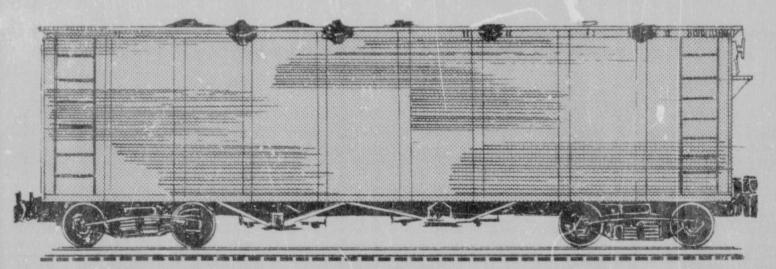

additional time be granted in any case by the Commission.

(7) (b). Any person who shall knowingly and willfully make, cause to be made, or participate in the making of, any false entry in any annual or other report required under the section to be filed, " * " or shall knowingly or willfully file with the Commass' many false report or other document, shall be decered guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject, upon conviction in any court of the United States of competent jurisdiction, in a fine of not more than five thousand dollars or imprisonment for not more than two years, or both such fine and imprisonment. ** *

(7) (c). Any corrier or lessor, * * * or any officer, agent, employee, or representative thereof, who shall fair to trake and file an annual or other report with the Commission within the time fixed by the Commission or to make specific and full, true, and correct answer to any question within thirty days from the time it is lowfully required by the Commission so to do shall forfeit to the United States the sam of one hundred dollars for each and every day it shall continue to be in default with respect thereto.

(8) As used in this section * * * the term "carrier" means a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such carrier, and the term "lessor" means a person owning a ratiroad, a water line, or a pipe line, lossed to and operated by a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receive; or trustee of such lessor. * * *

The respondent is further required to send to the Bureau of Accounts, immediately upon preparation, two copies of its latest annual report to stockholders. See scheduled 108, page 3.

Switching and terminal companies are further classified as.

Class \$1. Exclusively switching. This class of companies includes all those perform switching service only, whether for joint account or for revenue.

Class S2. Exclusively terminal. This class of companies includes ail companies furnist terminal trackage or terminal facilities only, such as anno passenger or frequestation stockyards, etc., for which a charge is made, whether operated for form account or for rever in case a bridge or ferry is a part of the facilities operated by a terminal company, it should included under this heading.

Class S3. Both switching and termina? Companies which perform both a switching an terminal service. This class of companies class all companies whose operations cover has switching and terminal service, as defined above.

Class S4. Beidge and ferry. This class of companies is confined to those whose operations limited to bridges and ferries exclusively.

Class SS. Mixed. Companies performing primarily a switching or a terminal service, but whalso conduct a regular freight or passenger traffic. The revenues of this class of companiculus, in addition to switching or terminal revenues, those derived from local posser service, local freight service, participation in through movement of freight or passenger training transportation operations, and operations other than transportation.
