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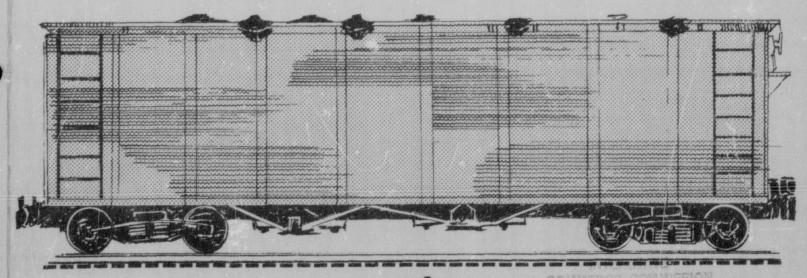

> Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broadly classified, with respect to their operating revenues, according to the following general definitions:

Class I companies are those having annual operating revenues of \$10,000,000 or more. For this class. Annual Report Form R-1 is provided.

Class II companies are those having annual operating revenues below \$10,000,000. For this class, Annual Report Form R-2 is provided

In applying this classification to any switching or terminal company which is operated as a joint facility of owning or tenant railways, the sum of the annual railway operating revenues the joint facility rent income, and the returns to joint facility credit accounts in operating expenses, shall be used in determining its class

Switching and terminal companies are further classified as:

Class \$1. Exclusively switching. This class of companies includes all those performing

switching service only, whether for joint account of for revenue.

This class of companies includes all companies furnishing terminal trackage or terminal facilities only, such as union passenger or freight stations. stockyards, etc., for which a charge is made, whether operated for joint account or for revenue In case a hridge or ferry is a part of the facilities operated by a terminal company, it should be included under this heading.

Class S3. Both switching and terminal. Companies which perform both a switching and a terminal service. This class of companies includes all companies whose operations cover both switching and terminal service, as defined above

Class S4. Bridge and ferry. This class of companies is confined to those whose operations are imited to bridges and ferries exclusively.

Class S5. Mixed. Companies performing primarily a switching of a terminal service, but which conduct a regular freight or passenger traffic.
