 - (a) On Line a, "Regular Proposals", is shown the number of Proposals which, in each instance, has been issued at the request of an interested Member Carrier and mailed to all other affected Member Carriers, under the provisions of Article IX, Sections 6 and 8, and Article X of the Articles of Association and By-Laws, attached hereto as Appendix F, and Proposals adopted as Resolutions at Rate Meetings of all interested Member Carriers, under the provisions of Article IX, Sections 7 and 8, of the Articles of Association and By-Laws. No proposals are "submitted by respondent".
 - (b) On Line c, "Section 22 Proposals", is shown the number of Section 22 Rate Quotations, issued under the provisions of Article IX, Section 10, of the Articles of Association and By-Laws.
- 2. Under Item 8, "Disposition of proposals during the year", terms are used which are not completely descriptive of the procedures prescribed under this Association's Rate and Tariff Agreement.
 - (a) On Line a, "Number placed on public docket", is shown the number of Proposals adopted by a majority vote of the interested Member Carriers at Rate Meetings, held under the provisions of Article IX, Sections 7 and 8, of the Articles of Association and By-Laws, which we would interpret as being "Placed on Public Docket".
 - (b) On Line b, "Number not placed on public docket", is shown the number of Proposals, including Section 22 Rate Proposals, adopted by a majority vote of the interested Member Carriers, in response to written Proposals, issued under the provisions of Article IX, Sections 6, 8 and 10, of the Articles of Association and By-Laws.
 - (c) The Rate and Tariff Procedures of this Association, make no provision for a "standing rate committee (SRC)" or a "general rate committee (GRC)", as commonly recognized in procedures which we understand are provided by Rate Bureaus of Common Carriers of Property.
- 3. By far the great majority of Tariffs, issued by this Association, are published upon specific requests from individual Carriers. In our opinion, these requests would come within the interpretation of Item 9, "Independent actions filed with respondent during the year", Line a, "Number taken without filing of proposals", and within the provisions of Paragraph 130.20(3) of the Rules and Regulations,

under Docket No. 32448, which refer to "instructions or requests for publication by independent action". All such instructions or requests from individual Carriers are processed under the provisions of Article IX, Section 6, Paragraph (e), of the Articles of Association and By-Laws, and, in every instance, "a tariff or tariffs giving effect to such instructions" are published.

No detailed count of such individual instructions or requests from Carriers is made, nor is a "separate file" kept on each such instruction or request; however, all such instructions or requests for independent action are filed directly in connection with the affected Tariff or Tariffs and are "readily accessible for examination by representatives of the Commission", as required.

On Line a of Item 9, the number of "independent actions filed with respondent during the year, taken without filing of proposals", is shown as 1,200 which figure represents an estimate of the number of instructions and requests made to the Association by individual Carriers, during the year.

On Line b of Item 9, is shown the number of independent actions "taken after filing of regular or emergency proposals", as reflected in "exceptions" filed by individual Carriers to such proposals, after such Proposals have been announced as carried by a majority vote of all interested Member Carriers.

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF NATIONAL BUS TRAFFIC ASSOCIATION, INC.

ARTICLE I Title

The name of this Corporation is National Bus Traffic Association, Inc.

ARTICLE II Objects

The objects for which it is formed are:

(1) To provide economical means for the negotiation and establishment of interline tariffs, divisions, claims, services, baggage arrangements, and ticketing systems.

(2) To investigate, assemble, publish and disseminate information with respect to efficiency and economy of operations or improvement of public service of Common Carriers by Motor Vehicle of passengers, mail, baggage and express.

(3) To compile, print, publish and distribute tariffs, statistics and division sheets.

(4) To assist, when deemed necessary or advisable, Members in the advocation of enactment of uniform, just and proper laws and regulatory bodies' rules and regulations governing the promulgation and publication of tariffs and rates, fares and time schedules.

(5) To maintain such bureaus or divisions (such as Clergy, Scrip, Schedule, Tariff, Military, etc.) as may be necessary or advisable or of benefit to the Members.

(6) To represent Member Carriers as a party in administrative or judicial proceedings.

(7) To do any and all things necessary, incidental or proper to conduct such Association and to accomplish each and every of the aforesaid purposes and objects.

No dividends or distribution of the property of such Corporation shall be made until all debts are fully paid and then only upon its final dissolution and surrender of organization and name; nor shall any distribution be made except by a vote of a majority of the Members.

ARTICLE III Membership

Any Intercity Regular-Route Common Carrier of Passengers by Motor Vehicle shall be eligible for membership in this Association upon such terms and conditions as from time to time shall be provided in the By-Laws.

ARTICLE IV Directors

The management of this Corporation shall be vested in a Board of Directors of such a number and with such qualifications and elected in such manner as shall from time to time be provided in the By-Laws.

ARTICLE V Location — Offices

Section 1. The Corporation shall maintain an office in the City of Chicago, in the County of Cook, State of Illinois, and in such other places as from time to time shall be fixed by the Board of Directors. The address of the initial registered office of the Corporation shall be 506 South Wabash Avenue, Chicago, Illinois 60605, and the name of its initial registered agent shall be L. H. Ristow.

Section 2. Directors of any Regional Division, organized pursuant to the By-Laws, may direct the establishment of a branch office of the Association within such Region, which shall be administered under the direction of the Chairman.

BY-LAWS

OF

NATIONAL BUS TRAFFIC ASSOCIATION. INC.

ARTICLE I

Seal

The corporate seal shall be in the form of a circle and shall set forth the full name of the Association, the word "Illinois", and the year of its incorporation.

ARTICLE II Membership

Section 1. APPLICATION FOR MEMBERSHIP — Any Intercity Regular-Route Common Carrier of Passengers by Motor Vehicle desiring to become a Member of this Association shall file with the Association and application in writing, agreeing to become bound and to abide by the Articles of Association and By-Laws of this Association, and faithfully to discharge all duties and obligations imposed thereby on Members. Such application shall set forth the full name and address of the applicant, the trade name under which business is carried on, a description of the routes served, and the number of miles of routes operated by the applicant. If the applicant is a partnership, the application shall show the name and address of each individual partner; and if a corporation, the names, titles, and addresses of the executive officers. If the applicant is conducting an operation as managing or operating agent for, or otherwise in behalf of, another person, partnership, or corporation, the application shall so state and shall show the name and address of such other person, partnership, or corporation.

Section 2. ADMISSION TO MEMBERSHIP—Any Intercity Regular-Route Common Carrier of Passengers by Motor Vehicle shall be admitted to membership in this Association, as of right, upon the same terms as existing Members. Upon receipt by the Association of written application for membership, and the determination by the Board of Directors that same is complete and in compliance with the requirements of Section 1 hereof, the Board shall direct the Chairman to notify the applicant that it is eligible for admission to the Association. The membership of such applicant shall become effective as of the date of receipt thereafter by the Association of the payment of an Initiation Fee of One (\$1.00) Dollar for each one hundred (100) miles or fraction thereof of routes operated by the applicant, but not less than Five (\$5.00) Dollars.

Section 3. "INTERCITY REGULAR-ROUTE COMMON CARRIER OF PASSENGERS BY MOTOR VEHICLE" DEFINED — As used herein, an "Intercity Regular-Route Common Carrier of Passengers by Motor Vehicle" is a carrier which:

(a) Holds a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity, issued by the Interstate Commerce Commission or a State or Provincial Regulatory Body, which authorizes it to transport passengers in Scheduled, Regular-Route, Common Carrier service; and

(b) Operates over a specified regular route or routes between two or more municipalities or incorporated villages whose municipal or corporate limits do not touch, join or overlap, and

(c) Sells and/or accepts interline tickets good for Regular Route Service.
Section 4. SUSPENSION AND TERMINATION OF MEMBERSHIPS—

(a) Membership of any Member may be suspended.

- (1) By the Chairman, upon sixty (60) days' notice, for failure to pay, or cause to be paid, any amount owed to this Association; or
- (2) By vote of the Board of Directors, for non-payment of any amount owed to this Association.

(b) Membership of any Member may be terminated:

- (1) By voluntary resignation of such Member, upon not less than sixty (60) days' notice in writing to the Association;
- (2) By revocation, abandonment, sale, transfer, or other termination of the right of such Member to transport passengers for hire in motor vehicles on the public highways as an Intercity Regular-Route Common Carrier;
- (3) By vote of the Board of Directors, for non-payment, within sixty (60) days after written notice by the Chairman, of any amount due the Association.

If the Membership of any Member be terminated for any reason whatsoever, neither such Member nor its successors or assigns, his or her heirs, assigns, or representatives shall have any interest in or claims upon any of the property, funds, income, or assets of this Association.

ARTICLE III

Expenses

Section 1. ANNUAL BUDGET — Prior to December 1 of each calendar year, the Board of Directors shall adopt and cause to be distributed to the Membership the Annual Budget of General Expenses and Expenses Subject to Assessment for the following calendar year. The Budget shall include, as General Expenses,

(a) All ascertainable expenditures of the Association, other than those incurred in operating its tariff publication or other Bureau Services, and

(b) Funds necessary to restore the Cash Working Fund to a level sufficient to cover unfore-seeable of extraordinary expenditures which the Board may find necessary from time to time during the year for the discharge of any authorized purposes of the Association.

The amount by which such General Expenses shall exceed the prospective net receipts from tariff publication and other Bureau Services, fees, et cetera, shall be designated as Expenses Subject to Assessment.

Section 2. ASSESSMENT OF MEMBERS — Not later than January 31 of each calendar year, each Member shall be assessed and billed for (a) its portion, computed in accordance with Section 4 of this Article, of the Expenses Subject to Assessment as set forth in the Annual Budget for that year, and (b) its prospective Bureau Service costs, 'Tariff Assessments, et cetera, determined pursuant to Section 5 of this Article, as estimated by the Chairman. Assessments of Five Hundred (\$500) Dollars or less shall become due and payable when billed. Assessments of more than Five Hundred (\$500) Dollars may be paid in installments as prescribed by the Board of Directors. New Members, admitted during any calendar year, shall be assessed, for that year, a prorata portion of the Annual Assessment, based upon the number of months remaining in that year.

Section 3. CHARGES TO NON-MEMBERS — Non-Member Carriers, participating in any tariff publication or other service of the Association at any time during any calendar year, if eligible for Membership under Article II hereof, shall be assessed (a) the same charge for such service, and (b) the same portion of the Expenses Subject to Assessment as if said Non-Member Carrier had been a Member of the Association during the time of said participation. If ineligible for Membership, such participating Non-Member Carrier shall be assessed such Service Charges as may be fixed by the Board of Directors from time to time.

Section 4. APPORTIONMENT OF GENERAL EXPENSES SUBJECT TO ASSESS-MENT — The General Expenses Subject to Assessment shall be apportioned as follows:

(a) Each Carrier with Annual Gross Revenues (excluding revenues from Local or Suburban Operations and excluding revenues from the operation of Highway Post Office Buses) of Fifty Thousand (\$50,000,00) Dollars or less (as shown by reports to the Interstate Commerce Commission for the latest available (welve (12) month period), shall be assessed Thirty (\$30,00) Dollars per year;

(b) Each Carrier with Annual Gross Revenues (excluding revenues from Local or Suburban Operations and excluding revenues from the operation of Highway Post Office Buses) of more than Fifty Thousand (\$50,000.00) Dollars and less than Two Hundred Thousand (\$200,000.00) Dollars, (as shown by reports to the Interstate Commerce Commission for the latest available twelve (12) month period), shall be assessed Fifty (\$50,00) Dollars per year:

(c) The remainder of the General Expenses Subject to Assessment shall be apportioned each year by the Board of Directors among Carriers having Annual Gross Revenues (excluding revenues from Local or Suburban Operations and excluding revenues from the operation of Highway Post Office Buses) of Two Hundred Thousand (\$200,000.00) Dollars or more (as shown by reports to the Interstate Commerce Commission for the latest available twelve (12) month period ending September 30th), in the following manner:

(1) Twelve (12¢) cents per route-mile per year, provided that not more than fifty (50%) percent of the General Expenses Subject to Assessment be so prorated;

- (2) The balance, not otherwise provided for, to be prorated among such Carriers, excluding Canadian and Mexican Carriers, on the basis of their respective Annual Gross Revenues (other than those from Local or Suburban Operations and excluding revenues from the operation of Highway Post Office Buses), as reported to the Interstate Commerce Commission in Quarterly Reports for the latest available twelve (12) months, provided that no Carrier, or group of Carriers affiliated by common ownership or control, or by membership in an association or system designed to promote the interests of its members, shall be assessed an amount greater than forty-eight (48%) percent of the General Expenses Subject to Assessment;
- (3) In no event shall the apportionment of the General Expenses Subject to Assessment, under the provisions of this Paragra, h (c), he less than Twenty-Five (\$25.00) Dollars for each such Carrier per year.
- (d) Upon request by a Member Carrier, the Board of Directors shall be authorized to exclude any extraordinary revenues of the Carrier from the Annual Gross Revenues reported to the Association to be used in the proration of General Expenses of the Association Subject to Assessment.

Section 5. CHARGES FOR BUREAU SERVICES — The Board of Directors of the Association in its discretion may, from time to time, prescribe a basis of charges for each tariff, Bureau, or other service of the Association or permit the recipients of any such service to apportion the cost thereof among themselves.

Section 6. MILEAGE AND REVENUE REPORTS - Mileage and Revenue Reports shall be filed with the Association as follows:

Members With Annual Gross Revenues Greater Than Two Hundred Thousand (\$200,000.00) Dollars — At the time of making application for Membership, and as of December 1 each year thereafter, each such Member shall file with the Association a statement of the miles of route then authorized to be operated by it, and a statement reflecting its Annual Gross Revenues (excluding revenues from Local or Suburban Operations, as defined by the Interstate Commerce Commission, and excluding revenues from the operation of Highway Post Office Buses) for the latest available twelve (12) month period, ending September 30th, as revealed by its Quarterly Reports to the Interstate Commerce Commission.

(b) Members With Less Than Two Hundred Thousand (\$200,000.00) Dollars Annual Gross Revenue - At the time of making application for Membership, and as of December 1 of each year thereafter each such Member shall submit a statement showing its Annual Gross Revenues (excluding revenues from Local or Suburban Operations and excluding revenues from the opera-

tion of Highway Post Office buses) for the latest available calendar or fiscal year;

(c) Errors - The Association shall be notified promptly of all errors discovered in any of the foregoing Reports, and Assessments shall be amended accordingly.

(d) Non-Member Recipients of Association Services - This Section 6 shall be applicable to Non-Member Carriers participating in Association Services, if eligible for Membership in the Association.

ARTICLE IV

General Meetings of Members

Section 1. The Sections and provisions of this Article shall govern all General Meetings of the Members of the Association which are hereby defined to include any and all meetings except "Rate Meetings" held pursuant to Article IX hereof.

Section 2. PLACE OF MEETINGS - Meetings of Members of the Association shall be held at such place or places as shall from time to time be designated by the Board of Directors, or, in

the absence of such designation, as shall be specified in the Notice of Meeting.

Section 3. ANNUAL MEETING -- An Annual Meeting of the Members shall be held daring each year on such day and at such hour as shall be determined by the Board of Directors or, in the absence of such determination, by the Chairman.

Section 4. SPECIAL MEETINGS - Special Meetings of the Members, for any purpose or purposes, may be called by the Chairman and shall be called by the Chairman or Secretary at the request of a majority of the Board of Directors, or at the request in writing of twenty-five (25%) percent of the Members in good standing. Such request shall state the purpose or purposes of the proposed meeting and shall be delivered to the Chairman or Secretary, Business transacted at all Special Meetings shall be confined to the objects stated in the Call.

Section 5. NOTICE - Written or printed Notice of a Meeting of the Members, stating the time and place and, in the case of a Special Meeting, the object thereof, shall be mailed, postage prepaid, or otherwise given, at least fifteen (15) days before such Meeting to each Member in good standing at such address as appears on the books of the Association.

Section 6. QUORUM - Twenty-five (25) Members in good standing, present in person or epresented by proxy, shall be requisite to and shall constitute a quorum at all Meetings of the Members for the transaction of business. If, however, such number shall not be present or represented at any Meeting of the Members, the Members in good standing, present in person, or by proxy, shall have power to adjourn the Meeting from time to time, without notice other than announcement at the Meeting, until the requisite number of Members shall be present or represented. At such reconvened adjourned Meeting, at which the requisite number of Members shall be present or represented, any business may be transacted which might have been transacted at the Meeting as originally notified.

Section 7. VOTING AND PROXIES - At each Meeting of the Members, each Member in good standing (through its duly authorized representative) shall be entitled to one vote in person or by proxy appointed by an instrument in writing, subscribed by such Member and bearing a date not more than one year prior to said Meeting, unless said instrument provides for a longer period. Upon the demand of any Member, the vote for Directors and the vote upon any questions before the Meeting shall be by ballot. All elections shall be had and all questions decided by plurality

vote, except as otherwise provided in these By-Laws.

ARTICLE V

Directors

Section 1. NOMINATION - Before the opening of each Annual Meeting, the Chairman shall appoint a Nominating Committee of five (5) Members. At the Annual Meeting, the Nominating Committee shall present Nominations for Directors to hold office during the ensuing year, which nominations shall be determined as follows:

(a) Where a Territorial Division has been formed, as provided in Article XI, the Members of such Territorial Division shall, except as otherwise provided herein, have the exclusive privilege to nominate the Directors which will represent its Region, except that when a Territorial Division has not submitted nominees, the incumbent Directors shall be nominated by the Nominating Committee.

(b) The Nominating Committee shall also select a Nominee for each place on the Board of Directors, not provided for in Section 1(a) of this Article V.

- (c) The Nominating Committee is authorized to make a substitution for a nomination made by a Territorial Division, under the following circumstances:
 - (1) The death, retirement, or refusal to serve by a Nominee after his nomination by the Territorial Division.

(2) Ineligibility of a Nominee at the time of the Annual Meeting.

- (3) If the election of the Nominees nominated by the Territorial Division would result in a violation of any of the provisions of these Articles and By-Laws.
- (d) Mominations from the floor of the Annual Meeting of the Association may be made only for Directors other than those nominated by the Territorial Divisions, or Directors who are nominated by the Nominating Committee under the provisions of Subsection (c) hereof

Section 2. ELECTION - At each Annual Meeting, the Board of Directors shall be elected

by a plurality vote of the Members present at such Meeting and entitled to vote.

Section 3. POWERS — The general management and control of the affairs, funds, and property of the Association shall be vested in the Board of Directors, which may, insofar as permitted by law, exercise all of the powers of the Association. Without limiting the foregoing, the Board of Directors may authorize one or more officers or employees of the Association to sign and execute in the name and on behalf of the Association, bills, notes, receipts, acceptances, endorsements, checks, contracts, and documents, and may determine the salaries of the officers and employees. The Board of Directors shall have final authority and power from time to time to fix and determine those affairs which relate or pertain to or affect two or more Divisions of the Association, or two or more Regions of the Association, or the Membership generally.

Section 4. NUMBER, QUALIFICATIONS, ELECTION, TERM OF OFFICE -

(a) The Board of Directors shall consist of thirty-seven (37) members, of whom thirty-one (31) members shall be representatives of Members in the various regions geographically distributed as hereinafter provided; five (5) shall be "Directors at Large"; and the Chairman, who shall serve as a Director Ex Officio; provided that of the entire Board of Directors not more than twelve (12) Directors shall be representatives of Members who are affiliated by common ownership, control, or by membership in a traffic association or system designed to promote the

interests of the members thereof;

(b) For the purpose of making the Board of Directors geographically representative, the United States and Canada are divided into eight (8) regions, as designated in paragraph (c) of this Section 2, and the Board of Directors as finally elected must be inclusive of one (1) Director each to represent Members in the Western Canadian and Eastern Canadian Regions; two (2) Directors to represent Members in the New England Region; five (5) Directors each to represent Members in the Northeastern, South Central, North Central and Western Regions, and seven (7) Directors to represent Members in the Southeastern Region; provided that in each of the New England, Northeastern, North Central, South Central, Western and Southeastern Regions, and of the Directors at Large, at least one (1) Director shall be a representative of a Member Carrier, not affiliated by common ownership, control, or by membership in a traffic association or system designed to promote the interests of the members thereof, and whose Annual Gross Revenues from Intercity Passenger Operations is less than five hundred thousand (\$500,000) dollars;

(c) The Regions of the United States and Canada from which Directors shall be elected are

as follows:

New England: The territory north of New York City; east of a line drawn from New York City through Albany, N. Y., to Montreal, Quebec; and south of the Canadian Border.

Northeastern: The territory on and within a boundary line drawn in a southerly direction from Sault Ste. Marie, Mich., St. Ignace, Mich., Chicago, Ill., Peoria, Ill., Springfield, Ill., St. Louis, Mo., Paducah, Ky., Evansville, Ind., Louisville, Ky., Cincinnati, Ohio, Chillicothe, Ohio, Athens, Ohio, Parkersburg, W. Va., Clarksburg, W. Va., Red House, Md., New Creck, Md., Romney, Md., Winchester, Va., Washington, D. C., Richmond, Va., Petersburg, Va., and Norfolk, Va.

South Central: The territory on and within a line drawn in a northerly direction from New Orleans, La., through Jackson, Miss., Memphis, Tenn., Cape Girardeau, Mo., to St. Louis, Mo., thence in a westerly direction from St. Louis, Mo., through Columbia, Mo., Kansas City, Mo., Lawrence, Kan., Topeka, Kan., and Manhattan, Kan., thence in a northerly direction from Manhattan, Kan., to Marysville, Kan., thence in a westerly direction from Marysville, Kan., through Phillipsburg, Kan., to Denver, Colo., thence in a southerly direction from Denver, Colo., through Colorado Springs, Colo., Pueblo, Colo., Walsenburg, Colo., Trinidad, Colo., Raton, N. M., Santa Fe, N. M., Albuquerque, N. M., to El Paso, Texas.

North Central: The territory south of the Canadian Border on and within a boundary line drawn in a southerly direction from St. Ignace, Mich., to and through Chicago, Ill., Decatur, Ill., and St. Louis, Mo., thence in a westerly direction from St. Louis, Mo., through Columbia, Mo., and Kansas City, Mo., thence in a northerly direction from Kansas City, Mo., through Leavenworth, Kan., to Hiawatha, Kan., thence in a westerly direction from Hiawatha, Kan., through Marysville, Kan., thence north of Phillipsburg, Kan., to Denver, Colo., thence in a northerly direction from Denver, Colo., through Cheyenne, Wyo., Casper, Wyo., Cody, Wyo., to Billings, Mont., thence in a northeasterly direction from Billings, Mont., through Glendive, Mont., Minot, N. D., to Winnipeg, Man. (Can.).

Southeastern: The territory on and within a boundary line drawn in an easterly direction from Norfolk, Va., to Petersburg, Va., thence in a northerly direction from Petersburg, Va., through Richmond, Va., to Washington, D. C., thence in a westerly direction from Washington, D. C. through Winchester, Va., Clarksburg, W. Va., Parkersburg, W. Va., Chillicothe, Ohio, Cincinnati, Ohio, thence in a southwesterly direction from Cincinnati, Ohio, through Louisville,

Ky., Evansville, Ind., thence in a northwesterly direction from Evansville, Ind., to Salem, Ill., thence in a westerly direction from Salem, Ill., through Sandoval, Ill., to St. Louis, Mo., thence in a southerly direction from St. Louis, Mo., through Cape Girardeau, Mo., Memphis, Tenn., Greenville, Miss., Jackson, Miss., and New Orleans, La.

Western: The territory south of the Canadian Border on and within a boundary line drawn in a southwesterly direction from Winnipeg, Man. (Can.), through Minot, N. D., thence north of Glendive, Mont., to Billings, Mont., thence in a southerly direction from Billings, Mont., through Cody, Wyo., Casper, Wyo., Cheyenne, Wyo., Denver, Colo., Colorado Springs, Colo., Pueblo, Colo., Trinidad, Colo., Raton, N. M., Las Vegas, N. M., Las Cruces, N. M., to El Paso, Texas.

Eastern Canadian: The territory north of the Canadian Border, east of the Ontario-Manitoba Province line.

Western Canadian: The territory north of the Canadian Border, West of the Ontario-Manitoba Province line, including the State of Alaska.

(d) Directors, other than the Chairman, shall be elected by the Members at the Annual Meeting of Members, or otherwise, as herein provided. Each Director shall be elected to serve until the next Annual Meeting and until his successor shall be elected and shall qualify.

Section 5. MEETINGS — The newly elected Board of Directors may meet at the place of meeting of the Annual Meeting of Members between sessions of, or immediately following, such Annual Meeting, or as soon thereafter as such Board may be conveniently called together, for the purpose of organization or otherwise, and no notice of such meeting shall be necessary to the newly elected Directors in order to legally constitute the meeting, providing a majority of the whole Board shall be present; or they may meet at such place and time as shall be fixed by the consent of the majority of the Directors.

Regular Meetings of the Board, if any, may be held without notice at such time and place as shall from time to time be determined by the Board.

Special Meetings of the Board may be called by the Chairman on at least ten (10) days' notice, setting forth the time, place, and purpose of the meeting, sent by mail or telegram or delivered personally to each Director. Special Meetings of the Board shall be called by the Chairman or Secretary in like manner and on like notice on the written request of not less than five (5) Directors.

Section 6. PLACE OF MEETINGS — The Directors may hold their meetings in the City of Chicago, Illinois, or at such other places as may from time to time be fixed in the Notices or Waivers of Notices thereof.

Section 7. QUORUM — At all Meetings of the Board, twelve (12) Directors shall be necessary to constitute a quorum for the transaction of business and the act of the majority of the Directors present at any meeting at which there is a quorum shall be the act of the Board of Directors, except that a majority of the Directors present at any meeting, although fewer than a quorum, may adjourn the meeting from time to time without notice other than the announcement at the meeting.

Section 8. EMERGENCY ACTION BY BOARD — Upon the determination by the Chairman that any matter for determination by the Board of Directors is of such urgercy that the calling of a meeting of the Board would be impracticable, the Chairman may submit the matter by mail or wire to the Board for vote in such manner and within such time as the Chairman shall designate. Upon such submission, the vote of eighteen (18) Directors shall be necessary to constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, and, a quorum having responded, the act of the majority of the Directors voting upon the matter submitted in the manner and within the time specified by the Chairman shall be the act of the Board.

Section 9. VACANCIES AND DISQUALIFICATION -

- (a) If the office of any Director becomes vacant, a majority of the remaining Directors, though less than a quorum, shall choose, at its meeting following the declaration of a vacancy, a successor who shall hold office for the unexpired term.
- (b) A vacancy shall be declared upon the death, disqualification, resignation or retirement of a Director.
- (c) A Director shall be disqualified to serve as a Director, and his term of office shall automatically end, when:
 - (1) He is an employee of a Carrier which ceases to be a Member in good standing.
 - He severs his connection with a Member of the Association, either temporarily or permanently.
 - (3) He transfers his affiliation from one Member Carrier to another, and such transfer would effect a change in the composition of the Board of Directors, contrary to the provisions of Section 4 of this Article V.
 - (4) He transfers his affiliation to a Member located in a geographical territory (as defined in Section 4(c) of this Article V) other than that served by the Member by whom he was employed at the time of his election.

ARTICLE VI Obligations of the Association

Section 1. BUDGET APPROPRIATIONS — Except as the Board of Directors may from time to time order otherwise, the Chairman may authorize any expenditure specifically approved in the currently effective Budget, provided sufficient funds therefor are in the treasury of the Association or are receivable from obligations of Members due and payable prior thereto.

Section 2. SPECIAL APPROPRIATIONS—The Board of Directors may appropriate and authorize the expenditure of funds from the Cash Working Fund to meet expenses not specified in the currently effective Budget, provided sufficient funds therefor are in the treasury of the Association or are receivable from obligations of Members which become due and payable prior to such appropriation.

Section 3. OTHER OBLIGATIONS — Neither the Board of Directors, nor the Directors acting for any Regional Division, nor any officer, agent or employee of the Association shall incur, or have authority to incur, any obligation, debt, or liability upon the Association except as and to the extent that an appropriation therefor has been made under the conditions and limitations of Sections 1 or 2 of this Article VI.

ARTICLE VII

Officers

Section 1. OFFICERS — The officers of the Association shall be chosen by the Directors and shall consist of a Chairman, a Vice-Chairman, a Secretary, a Treasurer, and an Auditor, all of whom shall be full-time employees of the Association, and such other officers as the Board of Directors may from time to time designate. One person may hold more than one of said offices except those of Chairman and Vice-Chairman or of Chairman and Secretary.

Section 2. The Board of Directors at its first meeting after each Annual Meeting of the Members, shall choose a Chairman, a Vice-Chairman, a Secretary, a Treasurer, and an Auditor. The Chairman shall be ex-officio a member of the Board of Directors, and the Vice-Chairman in the absence of the Chairman, but not otherwise, shall be ex-officio a member of the Board of Directors, but other officers shall not be members of the Board of Directors.

Section 3. TERM OF OFFICE — The officers of the Association shall hold office for one year and until their successors are chosen and quality. Any vacancy occurring among the officers for any reason shall be filled by the Board of Directors, but the person elected to fill the vacancy shall hold office only until the first meeting of the Board of Directors after the next Annual Meeting of the Members and until his successor is chosen and qualifies.

Section 4. SALARIES — The salaries of all officers shall be fixed by the Board of Directors.

Section 5. REMOVAL — Any officer elected or appointed by the Board of Directors may be removed at any time by the affirmative vote of a majority of the whole Board of Directors, with or without cause.

Section 6. CHAIRMAN — The Chairman shall be the chief executive officer of the Association and shall have the general supervision over the business of the Association and over the several officers, subject, however, to the control of the Board of Directors. He shall, when present, preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors. He may sign and execute, in the name of the Association, contracts or other instruments authorized by the Board of Directors, except in cases where the signing and execution thereof shall be expressly delegated by the Board of Directors or by these By-Laws to some other officer or agent of the Association; and, in general, he shall perform all duties incident to the office of Chairman, and such other duties as from time to time may be assigned him by the Board of Directors. He shall, whenever it may in his opinion be necessary, prescribe the duties for officers and employees of the Association whose duties are not otherwise defined.

The Chairman of the Association shall be an ex-officio member of all Committees, with the right to vote, unless otherwise determined by the Board of Directors.

The Chairman shall, except when the Association has authority to do so, be a joint agent in the compilation, printing, and distribution of common tariffs issued by the Association, and shall be the joint agent in the compilation, printing, and distribution of division sheets issued by the Association.

When the Association acts as a Corporate Tariff Publishing Agent the Chairman will be authorized and appointed to handle all tariff matters for the Association with the Interstate Commerce Commission and the various State Commissions.

Section 7. VICE-CHAIRMAN — The Vice-Chairman shall, when requested by the Chairman, assist the Chairman in the performance of his duties. At the request of the Chairman, or in his absence or inability, the Vice-Chairman shall perform all the duties of the Chairman, and, when so acting, shall have all the powers of and be subject to all the restrictions upon the Chairman; and shall perform such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to him by the Board of Directors or the Chairman.

Section 8. SECRETARY—The Secretary shall keep the minutes of the Meetings of the Members of the Association and of the Board of Directors. He shall see that all notices are duly given, in accordance with the provisions of these By-Laws or as required by law. He shall be the custodian of the records and of the seal of the Association and set that it is affixed to all documents requiring the seal, the execution of which on behalf of the Association under its seal is duly authorized in accordance with the provisions of these By-Laws. He shall see that the corporate reports, and all other documents and records required by law are properly kept and filed. He shall keep a list of Members entitled to vote at any meetings of this Association. In general, he shall perform all duties incident to the office of Secretary, and such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to him by the Chairman or the Board of Directors.

Section 9. TREASURER — The Treasurer, if required to do so by the Board of Directors, shall give a bond for the faithful discharge of his duties in such sum and with such securities 25 the Board of Directors shall require. He shall have charge and custody of, and be responsible for, all funds and securities of the Association, and deposit all such funds in the name of the Association

in such backs, trust companies, or other depositories as shall be selected in accordance with the provisions of these By-Laws. He shall exhibit at all reasonable times his books of accounts and records to any of the Directors of the Association upon application during business hours at the office of the Association where such books and records are kept. He shall render a statement of the condition of the finances of the Association at all Regular Meetings of the Board of Directors and a full financial report at the Annual Meeting of the Members, if called upon to do so. He shall receive and give receipt for money due and payable to the Association from any source whatsoever. In general, he shall perform all duties incident to the office of Treasurer and such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to him by the Board of Directors.

Section 10. AUDITOR - The Auditor, under the direction of the Board of Directors, shall have immediate charge and supervision of the accounts of the Association and shall

- (a) Cause to be in force and maintained proper classification and other accounting rules and regulations;
- (b) Require from the Treasurer, at such times and in such form as he may deem it advisable, reports showing the receipt and disbursement of funds for the account of the Association;
- Have the custody of all vouchers, drafts, invoices and other evidences of payments made by the Treasurer and copies of all contracts and documents of any kind belonging to the Association:
- (d) Cause to be prepared and compiled such statements, statistics and other data as may be prescribed by the Chairman or the Board of Directors;
- (e) Prescribe accounts and records of the Divisions of the Association. He shall also audit the books, accounts and records of each Division, making a report of the same to the Board of the Division and the Association.

Section 11. OFFICER SUCCESSION — If, for any reason, the Chairman and Vice-Chairman shall be unable to perform their duties, their functions shall be performed by the Secretary, man snan be unable to perform their duties, their functions snan be performed by the Secretary, Treasurer or Auditor, in that order, until successors are elected by the Board of Directors. In the event the Secretary, Treasurer and Auditor also become incapacitated, the offairs of the Association shall be directed by the Director-At-Large with the greatest seniority as a Director, followed by each of the Directors-At-Large in the order of his seniority as a Director

ARTICLE VIII

Committees

Section 1. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE - The Board of Directors may, by resolution or resolutions passed by a majority of the whole Board, designate five or more of its members, including the Chairman of the Association, to constitute an Executive Committee to serve during the pleasure of the Board of Directors. The Board of Directors is authorized to remove at any time without notice any member of the Executive Committee and elect another member in his place and stead. The Board of Directors may delegate to such Committee any or all of the powers of the Board of Directors in the management of the business and affairs of the Association and may from time to time extend, modify, curtail, or restrict the powers so delegated. During the temporary absence of a member of the Executive Committee, the remaining member or members may appoint a member of the Board of Directors to act in his place, but vacancies in the membership of the Committee. mittee shall be filled by the Board of Directors at a Regular Meeting or at a Special Meeting called for that purpose. The Executive Committee may choose any one of its number to act as Chairman. The Executive Committee may meet at stated times or on not less than two (2) days' notice given personally or mailed or telegraphed to all by any one of its own number. The Board of Directors may designate the number of Directors which will be requisite to a quorum at meetings of such Committee. The Executive Committee shall keep regular minutes of its proceedings and report the same to the Board of Directors when requested.

STANDING COMMITTEES. There will be the following six (6) Standing Committees: National Tariff Committee, National Schedule Committee, National Express Comcommittees. National Tarin Committee, National Schedule Committee, and By-Laws Committee, mittee, National Baggage Committee, Finance and Auditing Committee, and By-Laws Committee, the members of which shall be appointed annually by the Board of Directors. Each Standing Committee shall be composed of the representatives of three or more Members of the Association, and, in addition thereto, the Chairman and the Secretary of the Association shall be ex-officio members of all Standing Committees. Each Standing Committee shall from time to time investigate, bers of all Standing Committees, with such recommendations as it may deem advisable, concerning such matters, within the subject matter indicated by the title of the Committee, as may be selected by the Committee or the Chairman of the Association or the Board of Directors. Each Standing Committee shall keep regular minutes of its proceedings and report the same to the Board of Directors when requested. The Chairmen of Standing Committees shall make reports of their activities to the Membership at each Annual Meeting.

OTHER COMMITTEES - The Chairman of the Association or the Board of Section 3. OTHER COMMITTEES — The Chairman of the Association of the Board of Directors shall have the power to create other Committees and designate the number of members thereof and the manner of their appointment. The authority of these Committees, other than the making of recommendations, will be confined to the authority that may be delegated by the Board of Directors. The Chairmen of such Committees shall, when requested by the Board of Directors or Chairman of the Association, make reports of their activities at each Annual Meeting.

ARTICLE IX

Publication of Tariffs by Association

Section 1. DEFINITIONS — As used in these By-Laws and in the "Rate and Tariff Agreement" (Section 5 hereof), the following terms shall be construed to denote the meanings respectively set out below:

Tariff: Any schedule or any Section 22 Quotation, or any reissue thereof or revision, amendment, or supplement thereto of any schedule or Section 22 Quotation, containing rates, fares, or regulations applicable to the transportation of passengers, baggage, mail, express, or newspapers, wholly or partly in the United States, by a Common Carrier by Motor Vehicle;

Tariff Provision: Any section, item, paragraph or rule, or any rate or regulation contained in a Tariff;

Publish, Publication (with respect to a Tariff): Compile, file with competent authority, post and distribute;

Series A Tariff: A Tariff, in effect when these By-Laws take effect, which is designated as a "Series A" Tariff, and any subsequent Tariff which is issued under the procedures set out in Sections 6 to 9, inclusive, of this Article IX, which is offered for concurrence of every Interested Carrier, without limitation or exclusion, shall be designated as a "Series A" Tariff;

Series B Tariff: Any Tariff, other than a "Series A" Tariff which is issued upon the direction of a single Carrier, the application of which is limited to such Carrier or to specifically named Interested Carriers exclusively, shall be designated as a "Series B" Tariff, and may not be amended except upon the request by or concurrence of the Directing Carrier.

Interested Member or Interested Carrier: A Member or a Carrier who or which is a party to the then existing Tariff or Tariff Provision which will be affected by any Proposal.

Section 22 Quotation: Any Tariff quoting reduced rates, fares, or charges under Section 22 of the Interstate Commerce Act.

Proposal: Any proposition, request, resolution or recommendation for any initiation, reissue or revision of, any change in or any amendment or supplement to any Tariff, or any specified Tariff Provision or Provisions.

Division of Interline Revenue Agreement: Agreement between Members of this Association governing the division of interline revenues and the settlements of interline accounts.

Section 2. KINDS OF TARIFFS — Each Tariff published by the Association shall identify on its title page the Series of such Tariff.

Section 3. PARTIES TO TARIFFS — Upon filing of requisite Powers of Attorney and other documents (including in the case of a Carrier who is not a Member of the Association a Direction for Participation, as provided in Section 4 of this Article), the completion of the applicable procedures set out in Sections 6 and 7 of this Article IX, and the payment of all fees required by or authorized to be assessed by the Board of Directors, any Carrier of passengers, baggage, mail, express or newspapers by motor vehicle may become a party to any "Series A" Tariff published by the Association or may direct the publication of a "Series B" Tariff as provided in the Direction for Participation signed and filed with the Association, which Direction shall specify whether such changes in "Series A" Tariffs shall be made for the account of such Non-Member Carrier with or without its expressed direction in each case.

Section 4. DIRECTION FOR PARTICIPATION — This Association will publish a Tariff for the account of any Carrier only upon its direction, in the case of a Member as provided herein, or in the case of any Non-Member Carrier as provided in its Direction for Participation, signed and filed with the Association.

Section 5. RATE AND TARIFF AGREEMENT — Each Member of this Association shall, on or before the effective date of these By-Laws or of his application to become a Member, execute and deliver a standard form Rate and Tariff Agreement, reading as follows:

The undersigned Carrier, in consideration of the covenants of the National Bus Traffic Asociation, Inc., and of all Members of such Association who shall enter into like and similar agreements hereto, covenants and agrees with said Association and each and every said other Member that it will initiate, publish and file tariffs or rates, fares, charges, rules and regulations pertaining to the transportation of passengers and their baggage, express, mail or newspapers, in accordance with the provisions of Articles of Association and By-Laws of the National Bus Traffic Association, Inc., as the same may be from time to time hereafter revised, amended or supplemented.

In consideration of which, the National Bus Traffic Association, Inc., agrees to publish the tariffs for the account of the said undersigned Carrier in accordance with its Articles of Association and By-Laws and rules and regulations prescribed by its Board of Directors pursuant thereto.

It is expressly agreed by all parties hereto that the undersigned Carrier and any other Carrier party to this Agreement, shall have the free and unrestrained right

to take independent action either before or after any determination arrived at through the procedures, rules, regulations and By-Laws of said Association and to publish for its own individual account from time to time any other tariffs which it shall deem to be necessary or proper. Where such independent action is to be taken by the Carrier, in the necessary or Series B" Tariff to be published and filed by the said Association at the direction of a "Series B" Tariff to be published and filed by the said Association at the direction of a "Series B" Tariff to be published and filed by the said Association at the direction of the said Association at the sai tion of and for the account of such Carrier, notice of such direction shall be given as provided in Sections 6(a) and 9(b) of Article IX of the B_f-Laws of said Association.

The undersigned Carrier further hereby constitutes said National Bus Traffic Association, Inc., its agent and attorney in fact, which appointment said Association hereby accepts, to file and prosecute any and all applications to competent authority which in the opinion of such Association's counsel are required for the approval and authorization of this agreement.

Section 6. PROPOSALS - Any Carrier, or two or more Carriers, may submit in writing to the Association a Proposal for any change in any "Series A" Tariff or in any Tariff Provision thereof. Upon receipt of such Proposal, the following procedure will be pursued:

(a) The Chairman shall promptly give notice of such Proposal by First Class Mail to any interested person requesting such notice. Within such time as the Chairman shall fix, any such interested person may submit a written expression with respect to such Proposal.

(b) The Chairman shall investigate, or cause to be investigated, such Proposal, and cause a copy of such Proposal together with his report of such investigation promptly to be sent by mail or telegraph to each Interested Member for determination by such Member of concurrence or

(c) In submitting such Proposal, the Chairman is authorized in each case to fix the time non-concurrence in such Proposal; within which such expression shall be given by such Interested Members and in the Chairman's discretion, upon the request of any Member, such time may be extended;

(d) If more than fifty (50%) percent of the Interested Members replying to such submission concur in such Proposal or in any modification thereof recommended by the Chairman, such Proposal or modification shall be published in a "Series A" Tariff for the account of the Inter-

(e) Nothing herein shall be construed to apply to an instruction from any Carrier that: ested Members sc concurring;

- (1) It be made a party to any existing Tariff for which it has the necessary concurrences; or
- (2) It be eliminated as a party to such Tariff; or
- (3) Any rate, fare, rule, or modification in any existing Tariff or removal or modificaon of any restriction or limitation not applicable to all parties shall be published

In all cases covered by this paragraph (e) the Association shall promptly publish a Tariff or Tariffs giving effect to such instructions, subject to the provisions of Section 9(b).

Section 7. RATE MEETINGS - The Chairman, upon his own motion, or upon the request of any Interested Member, may, and upon the request of ten Interested Members or a majority of of any interested Members, thay, and upon the request of ten interested Members of a majority of the Interested Members, whichever is less, shall call one or more meetings of the Interested Members at a time and place to be designated by him to consider any Proposal. He shall give ten (10) days' notice by mail or telegram. The Chairman may attend such meetings and preside, and if he does not, he shall designate an officer, employee or a Director of the Association, who is not directly or indirectly affiliated or connected with an Interested Carrier, to preside at such meeting in his place.

Notice of such Rate Meeting shall be given to any interested person requesting same, as provided in Section 6(a). Any such interested person may appear and be heard with respect to such a Proposal, but shall not be present during the consideration of and vote on such Proposal by the Interested Members.

If at such meeting more than fifty (50%) percent of the Interested Members present thereat in person or by proxy shall agree upon such Proposal or any modification thereof, such agreement shall constitute a direction to the Association by such Members to publish the same for their account. If fifty (50%) percent or less of the Interested Members present agree to such Proposal or any modification thereof, the Proposal upon request shall be handled under the procedure set out in the preceding Section 6 hereof.

The Secretary of the Association or a deputy appointed by bim with the approval of the Chairman, shall attend each such meeting and shall keep full and complete minutes thereof and of all Proposals, resolutions and agreements made thereat, including the names of all persons present at such meetings and the Members or Carriers represented by them and shall promptly file the original of such minutes, duly attested as true and correct, with the official records of the Association.

Section 8. NOTICE OF DISPOSITION — The Chairman shall, within ten (10) days after determination of any Proposal under either Section 6 or Section 7 hereof, notify all Interested Carriers and interested persons, as defined in Section 6(a), of such determination. Where a Proposal, submitted under the provisions of either Section 6 or Section 7 hereof, has been adopted by more than fifty (50%) percent of the Interested Members replying to the submission under Section 6, or present in person or by proxy at the meeting under Section 7, the Chairman shall within ten (10) days thereafter notify each Interested Carrier (which has not theretofore given an expression as to its participation in the change effected by the Proposal) and each carrier previously voting against such Proposal that such Proposal will be published in a "Series A" Tariff and inquiring of such carrier whether or not it desires the change effected by such Proposal to be published for its account. Such notice shall fix a time (not less than fifteen (15) days after its date) within which such carrier may reply.

Section 9. PUBLICATION OF "SERIES A" TARIFFS -

- (a) Upon expiration of the time allotted for replies to notice as provided in Section 8, such adopted Proposal shall be published for the account of:
 - (1) All Interested Carrier Members who have agreed to such Proposal;
 - (2) All Non-Member Carriers who have expressly directed that the Proposal be published for their account;
 - (3) Any Interested Member Carrier who does not, within the time fixed in such notice, direct that the Proposal be not published for its account;
 - (4) All Non-Member Carriers who in their "Directions for Participation" have directed that all Proposals in which they are Interested Carriers be published for their account in the absence of specific instructions to the contrary and who have not so specifically instructed the Chairman.
- (b) All other Carriers parties to the Tariff or Tariff Provision affected by such Proposai shall be eliminated therefrom and included in such other Tariff or Tariff Provision as they shall severally direct. Where such direction to the Association is to publish an Exception to the adopted Tariff or Tariff Provision affected by such Proposal in a "Series A" Tariff, or to publish a "Series B" Tariff for the account of such Carrier, notice of such direction shall be given by the Chairman within ten (10) days of receipt of such direction and to the same extent and in the same manner as the Chairman gave notice under Sections 6 and 7 of this Article IX with respect to the adopted Proposal. The giving of such notice shall not have the effect of invoking any other joint or collective procedures under Articles IX and X of these By-Laws.

Such Proposal thereupon shall be published and filed as provided by law and orders and rules of competent authority for the account of such Carriers who have directed the same to be published for their respective accounts as hereinbefore set out.

Section 10. PROCEDURES FOR SECTION 22 QUOTATIONS—Reduced Rate Quotations for the transportation of passengers, baggage and express for the United States Government, under Section 22 of the Interstate Commerce Act, may, in lieu of all or part of the provisions of Sections 6, 7, 8 and 9 of this Article, be filed and published as follows:

- (a) Single-Trip Emergency Quotations Upon receipt of a request to publish and file such a tariff, the Chairman shall give all interested Carrier-Members not less than seventy-two (72) hours' notice of the proposed Quotation, and shall publish such Quotation for all interested Carriers which have expressly directed that the proposed Quotation be published for their account;
- (b) Quotations Covering Recurring Movements Upon receipt of a specific request for publication of a proposed Section 22 Quotation for recurring trips in accordance with this paragraph, the Chairman shall give all Interested Carriers not less than five (5) days' notice of the proposed Quotation, and shall promptly publish said Quotation for all Interested Carriers who have expressly directed that said Quotation be published for their account, with simultaneous notification of the latter publication to all other Interested Carriers;
- (c) Any Proposal for publication of a Section 22 Quotation which does not require expedited handling under either (a) or (b) above, shall be published in accordance with Section 6 or 7 of this Article.

ARTICLE X

Practices Incident to Joint Through Tariffs and Rates

The divisions of joint rates, fares and charges, and the settlements of interline accounts, as between parties (including Members and Non-Members of the Association) to a Tariff of the Association naming joint rates, shall be governed as of any given time by the Division of Interline Revenue Agreement then effective for such purposes. Any party to a Tariff of the Association naming joint rates may propose the adoption or change of rules or practices to be followed by the parties in connection with such Joint Tariffs, such as the division of joint fares, rates and charges, interline accounting and settlement of joint charges, manner and forms of checking through baggage, through bills of lading, busbills, tickets or coupons, the method of handling transfers at common points, or of reissuing coupons or tickets and any other similar of handling transfers at common points, or of reissuing coupons or tickets and any other similar matter involving accounting settlement, a service, operation or routine incident to a Joint Tariff or rate. Any such Proposal shall be handled under the procedure prescribed for the handling of Proposals for changes in "Series A" Tariffs as set out in Section 6 of Article IX hereof, and the result of such submission shall be circulated to the Carriers affected thereby and may be published in circulars or bulletins of the Association and distributed to all Carriers affected thereby.

ARTICLE XI

Territorial Divisions of the Association

Section 1. FORMATION — Members comprising fifty (50%) percent of the Members operating within any one or more of the Regions defined in Article V, Section 4 (c), may form a Territorial Division of the Association, by filing with the Chairman duly executed copies of the Standard Territorial Agreement as prescribed in Section 2 hereof.

Upon establishment of such a Territorial Division, all Members of the Association operating within that area shall automatically become Members of such Territorial Division.

Section 2. TERRITORIAL AGREEMENT - The following standard form of Territorial Agreement will be executed by carriers as prescribed in Section 1 hereof:

STANDARD TERRITORIAL AGREEMENT

- 1. The undersigned common carrier of passengers, baggage, mail, and express by motor vehicle operates in a portion of the territory described in Paragraph 4 hereof, and is a Member in good standing of the National Bus Traffic Association, Inc.
- 2. Said Carrier hereby agrees to the formation of a Division of said Association for such territory, pursuant to Article XI of the By-Laws of said Association, to be known as the DIVISION OF THE NATIONAL BUS TRAFFIC ASSOCIATION, INC., for the purposes set out in such Article, and to the inclusion of said Carrier as a Member of such DIVISION.
- 3. Said Carrier further agrees to the conduct of the affairs of said DIVISION in the manner provided in and subject to the provisions of such Article and all other applicable Articles of such By-Laws, as same may be amended from time to time.
 - 4. The territory embraced within such DIVISION shall be as follows:

Section 3. ORGANIZATION - The members of the Board of Directors of the Association who represent the territory covered by the Division shall constitute the Board of Directors of the Division. Such Board members shall elect one of their number Chairman of the Division. In addition to the above named Directors, the Division Members may elect not to exceed five (5) Advisory Directors who will advise the Board of the Division on matters of interest to the Members of the Division. One of the members of the Board or the Advisory Board may be elected Treasurer. A Secretary, who need not be a Board member or an Advisory Board member, may be appointed by the Board. The Board may appoint committees, such as Tariff, Schedule, Baggage, Interline Revenue, etc., as they may deem advisable to further the interests of the Members of the Division.

Section 4. ACTIVITIES - The Division may in the interest of and for the benefit of the Members of the Division meet and by mail agree upon such matters local to the territory as manner and forms of checking through baggage, through bills of lading, busbills, tickets and coupons, the method of handling transfers at common points or of reissuing coupons or tickets and coupons, the method of handling transfers at common points or of reissuing coupons or tickets and any other similar matters involving accounting settlement, a service, operation or routine incident to motor bus operation, and division of joint fares, rates or charges, interline accounting and settlement of joint charges.

Section 5. POWERS OF TERRITORIAL DIVISION BOARD OF DIRECTORS—The Board of Directors of each Territorial Division shall have exclusive direction and control of the affairs of such Division which relate to, pertain to or affect exclusively the territory for which such Division was organized, with responsibility for and with power to make such special assessments as may be necessary to maintain such Division. The Board of Directors of the Division may assess dues payable to the Association which shall remit such Division dues to the Division Treasurer.

A majority of the Directors elected to represent any Regional Division shall be necessary to constitute a quorum for the transaction of business affecting such Division and the act of a majority of those present at any meeting at which there is a quorum shall be the act of the Directors of such Region.

Section 6. MEETINGS OF THE MEMBERS OF THE TERRITORIAL DIVISION shall be held at such place or places as shall from time to time be designated by the Chairman of the Division. One meeting each year shall be designated as the Annual Meeting.

Section 7. NOMINATION OF DIRECTORS BY DIVISION—The Association Directors representing any Territorial Division shall be nominated at the Annual Meeting of such Division by majority vote of the Members of such Division present at such Meeting. The number of Directors to be so nominated and their geographic distribution within the Division will be determined in accordance with Article V, Section 4 (b) hereof and the regional allocations will be observed within such Division.

Advisory Directors of the Division shall be elected at the Annual Meeting of the Division and shall take office at the same time as the new Association Directors.

Section 8. ACCOUNTS AND RECORDS — Such accounts and records of the Division shall be kept as prescribed by the Auditor of the Association. Once each year the Auditor shall audit the books, accounts and records of the Division, making a report of same to the Board of the Division and the Association.

Section 9. APPROPRIATION OF FUNDS OF REGIONAL DIVISIONS — Members of the Board of Directors acting for a Regional Division under the provisions of Article V hereof, shall have authority only to appropriate funds for the maintenance of such Division, but only from the proceeds of special assessments levied upon the Members of such Regional visions and actually covered in the treasury of the Association at the time of such appropriation.

ARTICLE XII Checks, Etc.

All checks, drafts, acceptances, notes, and other orders, demands, or instruments in respect of the payment of money shall be signed or endorsed in behalf of the Association by such officer or officers or by such agent or agents as the Board of Directors may from time to time designate.

ARTICLE XIII Audit

The Chairman shall direct an audit of the Association to be made once a year by independent Auditors or others approved by the Finance and Auditing Committee, and a report thereon transmitted to the members of the Finance and Auditing Committee, who in turn shall transmit a report to the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE XIV Waiver of Notice

Whenever any notice is required to be given under the provisions of the Articles of Association or the By-Laws of the Association, a waiver thereof, in writing, signed by the person or persons entitled to such notice, whether before or after the time stated therein, shall be deemed equivalent to the giving of such notice. Attendance of a Director or Member at any meeting shall constitute a Waiver of Notice of such meeting by such Director or Member.

ARTICLE XV Amendments

The Articles of Association of the Association or these By-Laws, or both, may be altered, amended, or repealed by the affirmative vote of a majority of the Members of the Association present at any General Meeting of the Members, if notice of such proposal therefor be given in writing by mail or telegram at least fifteen (15) days prior to the date of such meeting.

ARTICLE XVI Effective Date

These By-Laws shall take effect on the 10th day following the final Order of the Interstate Commerce Commission approving and authorizing the "Rate and Tariff Agreement" set forth in Article IX hereof.
