This Form for annual report should be filled out in triplicate and 2 copies, the original of which must be the copy containing the mailing label, returned to the Interstate Commerce Commission, Bureau of Accounts, Washington, D.C. 20423, by March 31 of the year following the year for which the report is made. One copy is to be retained for reference in case of correspondence relative to the report. Attention is directed to Section 5A, Part I of the Interstate Commerce Act.

3. Carrier rate-making organizations as described in instruction 2, above, are classified into two classes. Class I rate bureaus are those with annual operating revenues of \$100,000 or more. Class II rate bureaus are those with annual operating revenues of less than \$100,000. Class I rate bureaus shall file the full report, Annual Report Form RBO. Class II rate bureaus shall file only the carrier statistics (ITEMS 1-9) and certification (page 4) portions of the Annual Report Form RBO.

4. The instructions in this Form should be carefully observed, and each question should be answered fully and accurately. If any inquiry does not apply to the respondent, such fact should be shown on the inquiry by the words "Not applicable." Where the word "None" truly and completely states the fact, it should be given as the answer to any particular inquiry or any particular portion of any inquiry. Where dates are called for, the month and day should be stated as well as the year. Customary abbreviations may be used in stating dates.

5. If it is necessary or desirable to insert additional statements, typewritten or other, in a report, they should be legibly made on durable paper, on sheets not larger than a page of the Form. The inserts should be securely bound in the report.

6. All entries must be made in permanent black ink. Those of a contrary and unusual character must be indicated by use of parentheses.

7. Throughout this report the Commission means the Interstate Commerce Commission; the respondent means the rate bureau or organization in whose behalf the report is made; the year ended December 31 for which the report is made; the close of the year means the close of business on December 31 of the year for which the report is made or, in case the report is made for a shorter period than one year, it means the close of the period covered by the report; the beginning of the year means the beginning of business on January 1 of the year for which the report is made or, in case the report is made for a shorter period than one year, it means the beginning of the period covered by the report.

ATTACHMENT "2"

NOTE 1 - In accordance with Article IV, Rule 1 of Section 5a Application No. 61, the National Classification Board considers proposals for changes in the descriptions of articles, minimum weights, packing requirements, ratings or regulations in the National Motor Freight Classification, holds public hearings, recommends the disposition of proposals and instructs the Publishing Agent of the Classification as to resulting changes in the Classification.

NOTE 2 - In accordance with Article IV, Rules 9, 10, and 11 of Section 5a Application No. 61, the National Classification Committee hears appeals from dispositions of the National Classification Board and decides whether the recommendation of the Board appealed shall be approved, disapproved or submitted to the Board for further consideration.

ATTACHMENT "a"

Pursuant to an agreement with the National Motor Freight Traffic Association, Inc., which is Attachment 3 to Respondent's Section 5a Application filed April 25, 1956 and granted on December 19, 1956 (Application No. 61, 299 I.C.C. 519), Respondent is constituted an autonomous committee of the Association. As such, it neither collects nor disburses any monies for any purpose. Rather, as provided in said agreement, the Association charges and collects fees from carriers participating in the National Motor Freight Classification and bears all of the expenses of Respondent. Therefore, the financial data given in answer to questions 10 and 11 is that of the National Motor Freight Traffic Association.

Regarding questions 12 and 13, the Committee has no employees; all administrative and clerical duties are performed under contract with the American Trucking Associations, Inc., see copy of contract attached to Respondent's Section 5a Application.
