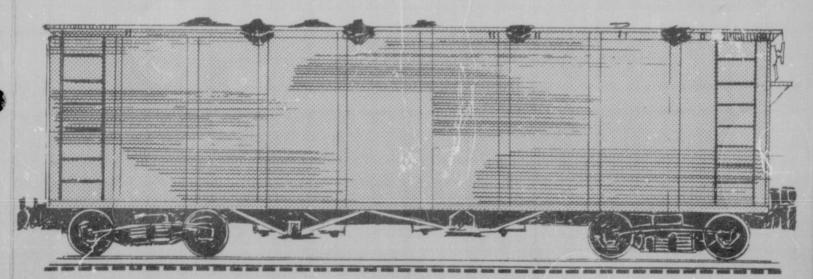

1. This Form for annual report should be filled out in triplicate and following provisions of Part I of the Interstate Commerce Act:

Sec. 20. Any person who shall knowingly and willfully make, cause to be made, or participate in the making of, any talse entry in any annual or other report required under the section to filed. \* \* \* or shall knowingly or wilifully file with the Commission any false report or other document, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject, upon convection in any court of the United States of competent jurisdiction, to a fine of not more than five thousand dollars or imprisonment for not more than two years, or both such fine and

(7) (c). Any carrier or lessor, \* \* \* or any officer, agent, employee, or representative thereof, who shall fail to make and file an annual or other report with the Commission within the time fixed by the Commission, or to make specific and full, true, and correct answer to any question within thirty days from the time it is lawfully required by the Comm shall forfest to the United States the sum of one hundred dollars for each and every day it shall continue to be in default with respect thereto.

(6). As used in this section \* \* \* the term "carrier" means a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver of trustee of such carrier, and the term "lessor" means a person owning a railroad, a water line, of a pipe line, leased to and operated by a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such lessor

The respondent is further required to send to the Bureau of Accounts. immediately upon preparation, two copies of its latest annual report to stockholders. See scheduled 108, page 3.

- 2. The instructions in this Form should be carefully observed, and each question should be answered fully and accurately, whether it has been answered in a previous annual report or not. Except in cases where they are specifically authorized, cancellations, arbitrary check marks, and the like should not be used either as partial or as entire answers to inquiries. In making reports, lessor companies use Annual Report Form R-4

> Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broadly classified, with respect to their operating revenues, according to the following general definitions:

> Class I companies are those having annual operating revenues of \$10,000,000 or more. For this class, Annual Report Form R-1 is provided.

> Class II companies are those having annual operating revenues below \$10,000,000. For this class, Annual Report Form R-2 is provided

> In applying this classification to any switching or terminal company which is operated as a joint facility of twning or tenant railways, the sum of the annual railway operating revenues, the joint facility rent income, and the returns to joint facility credit accounts in operating expenses, shall be used in determining its class.

Switching and terminal companies are further classified as:

Class St. Exclusively switching. This class of companies includes all those performing switching service only, whether for joint account or for revenue.

Class S2. Exclusively terminal. This class of companies includes all companies furnishing terminal trackage or terminal facilities only, such as union passenger or freight stations. stockyards, etc., for which a charge is made, whether operated for joint account or for reven In case a bridge or ferry is a part of the facilities operated by a terminal company, it should be included under this heading

Class S3. Both switching and terminal. Companies which perform both a switching and a terminal service. This class of companies includes all companies whose operations cover both switching and terninal service, as defined above

Class \$4. Bridge and ferry. This class of companies is confined to those whose operations are limited to bridges and terries exclusively.

Class 55. Mixed. Companies performing primarily a switching or a terminal service, but which also conduct a regular freight or passenger traffic.
