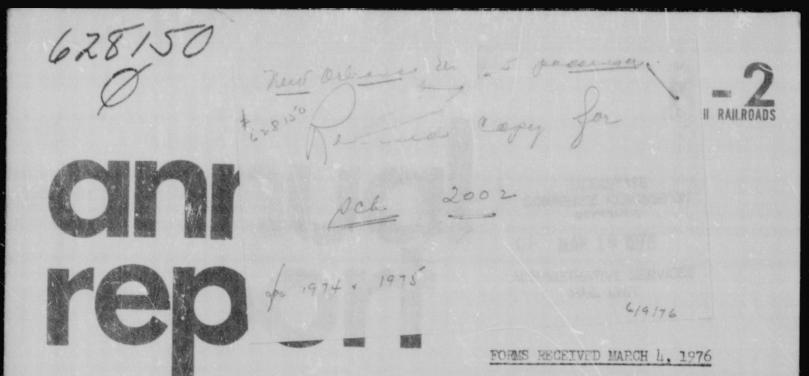
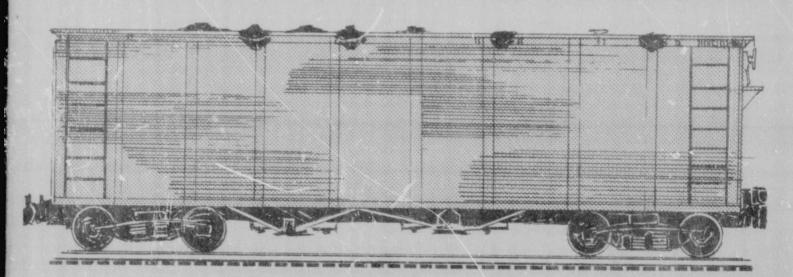

(7) (c) Any carrier or lessor * * * or any officer, ager; employee, or representative the time fixed by the Commission, or to make specific and full, true, and correct answer to any continue to be in default with respect thereto.

As used in this section * * * the term "carrier" means a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such earrier, and the term "lessor" means a person owning a railroad, a water line, or a pipe line, leased to and operated by a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such lessor. * * *
