

Pension costs under this plan are determined by an independent actuary based upon an acceptable actuarial method and various actuarial factors which, from time to time, are adjusted in light of actual experience. Pension costs reflect current service. and a 25-year amortization of unfunded past service. The funding policy provides that payments to the pension trusts shall be equal to the minimum funding regairements of ERISA plus additional amounts which may be approved from time to time.

Pension costs were \$330,496 in 1978 and \$289,294 in 1977.
