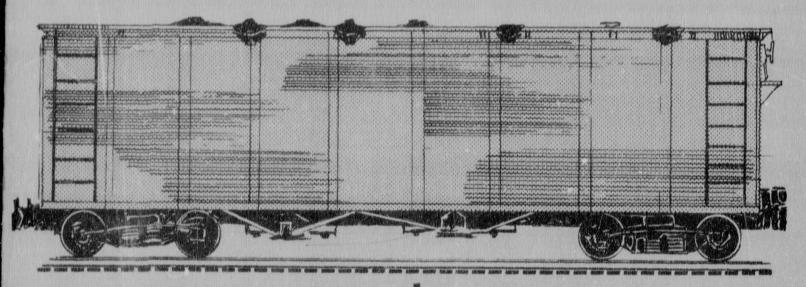

(7) (b) Any person who shall knowingly and willfully make, cause to be made, or participate in the making of, any laise entry in any annual or other report required under the section to be filed. \* \* \* or shall knowledge or willfully file with the Commission any false report or other document, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject, upon conviction in any court of the United States of competent jurisdiction, to a fine of not more than live thousand dollars or impresonment for not more than two years, or both such fine and imprisonment. \*\*\*

(7) (c). subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such lessor \* \* \*
