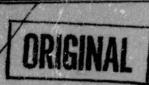

Dashes are used in appropriate places to permit a single code to represent several car type codes. Passenger-train car types and service equipment car types correspond to AAR Mechanical Division designations. Descriptions of car codes and designations are published in The Official Railway Equipment Register.
