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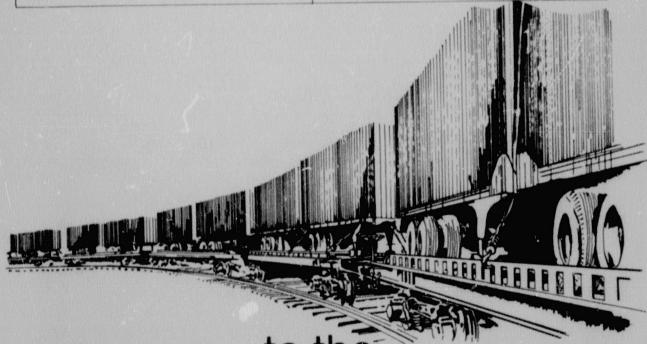

The Company was incorporated in the year 1918, under the laws of the State of Oregon. In 1924, Swift and Company, Peninsula Industrial Company, and the Portland Union Stock Yards sold their tracks and right-of-way to the Peninsula Terminal Company. The tracks were leased for a number of years jointly to the Oregon-Washington Railroad and Navagation Company, and the Spokane, Portland and Seattle Railway Company. In 1929, the Portland Union Stock Yards purchased its original track and right-of-way from Peninsula Terminal Company and in 1930, the Portland Union Stockyards bought all of the Peninsula Terminal Company, taking over all of its assets and liabilities. On September 1, 1930, the Peninsula Terminal Company started operations under the Interstate Commerce Commission rules and regulations and handled all of the switching on its tracks from that day to the present time.
