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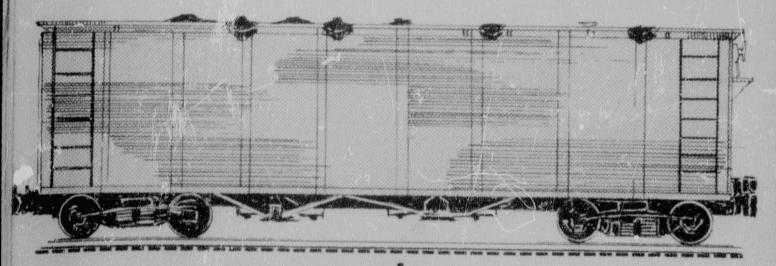

Class II companies are those having annual overating revenues less than \$50,000,000 but in excess of \$10,000,000. For this class, Aunual Report Form E-2 is provided.

Class III companies are those having annual operating revenues \$10,700,000, or less. For this class, Annual Report Form R.3.

In applying this classification to any switching or terminal company which is operated as a joint finility of owning or tenant railways, the sum of the annual railway operating revenues, the joint facility rent income, and the returns to joint facility credit accounts in operating expenses, shall be used in determining its class.

Switching and terminal companies are further classified as

Class S1. Exclusively switching. This class of companies pictudes all those performing switching service only, whether for joint account or for revenue.

Class S2. Exclusively terminal. This class of companies includes all companies furnishing terminal trackage or terminal facilities only, such as union passetizer or freight stations, stockwards, etc., for which a charge is made, whether operated for joint account or for tevenue. In case a bridge or ferry is a part of the facilities operated by a terminal company, it should be included under this heading.

Class \$3. Both switching and terminal. Companies which perform both a switching and a terminal service. This class of companies includes all companies whose operations cover both switching and terminal service, as defined above.

Class 54. Bridge and ferry. This class of companies is contined to ose whose operations are limited to bridges up/4 ferries exclusively. those whose operations are limited to bridges and ferries exclusively. Class S5. Mixed. Companies performing primarily a switching or a terminal service, but which also conduct a regular freight or passenger traffic. The revenues of this class of companies include, in addition to switching or terminal revenues, those derived from local passenger service, local freight service, participation in through movement of freight or passenger traffic, other transportation operations, and operations other than transportation. operations, and operations other than transportation

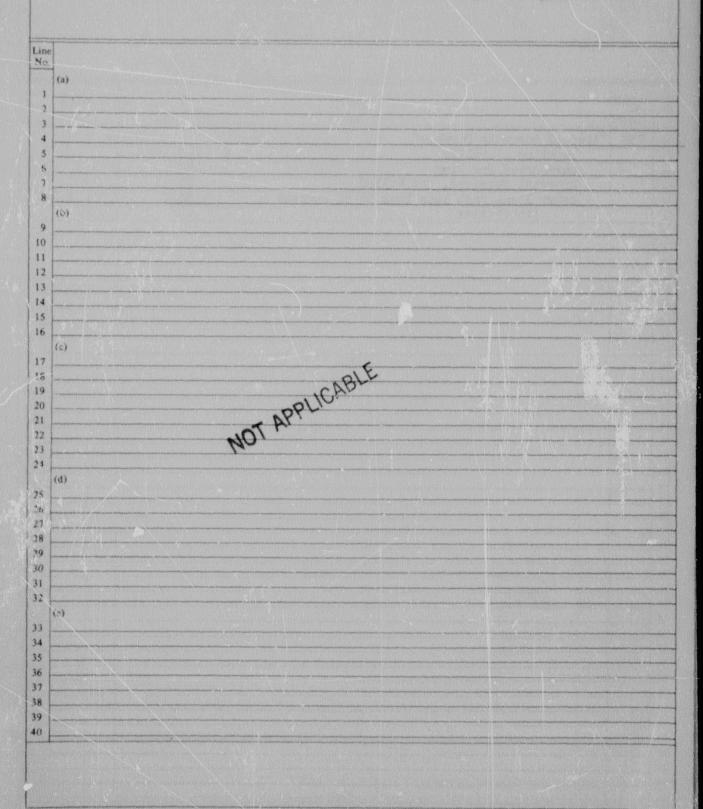

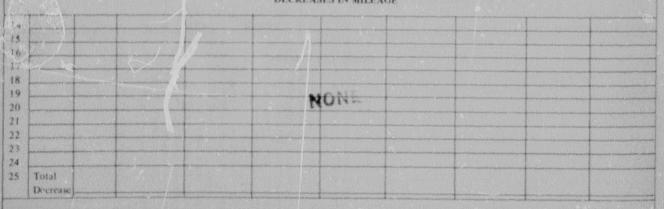

6. To be excluded are: Rent of buildings or other property, taxes payable to the Federal, State, or local Governments, payments for heat, light, power, telegraph, and telephone services, and payments to other carriers on the basis of lawful tariff charges or for the interchange of equipment between carriers, as well as other payments for services which both as to their nature and amount may reasonably be regarded as ordinarily connected with the routine operation, maintenance, or construction of a railroad, but any special and unusual payments for services should be reported. 7.
