

- Incorporated on December 5, 1899, controlled by American Steel Wire Co. until November 23, 1908 when control was assumed by Carnegie Steel Co. and operated until September 9, 1928. Davidson Coke & Iron assumed control at that time and operated until reorganization in 1936 as Pittsburgh Coke & Chemical Co. Shenango, Inc. assumed control on April 7, 1962.

Construction consisted of expanding roadway, buildings and equipment.
