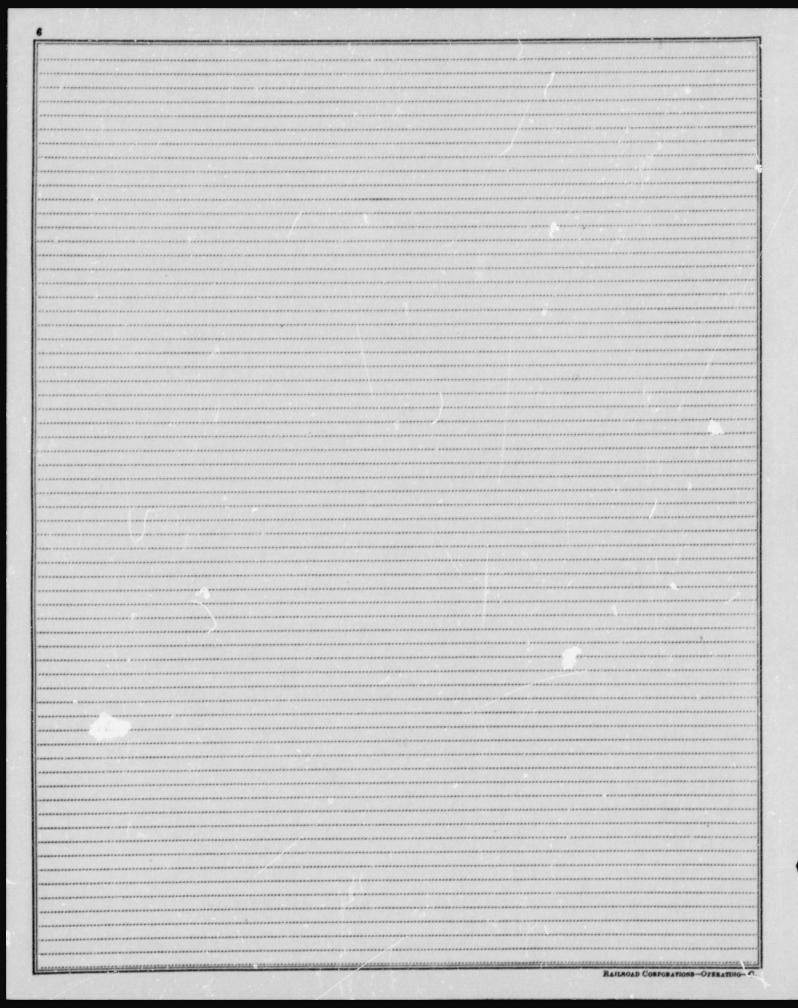

761. ROAD AND EQUIPMENT PROPERTY
