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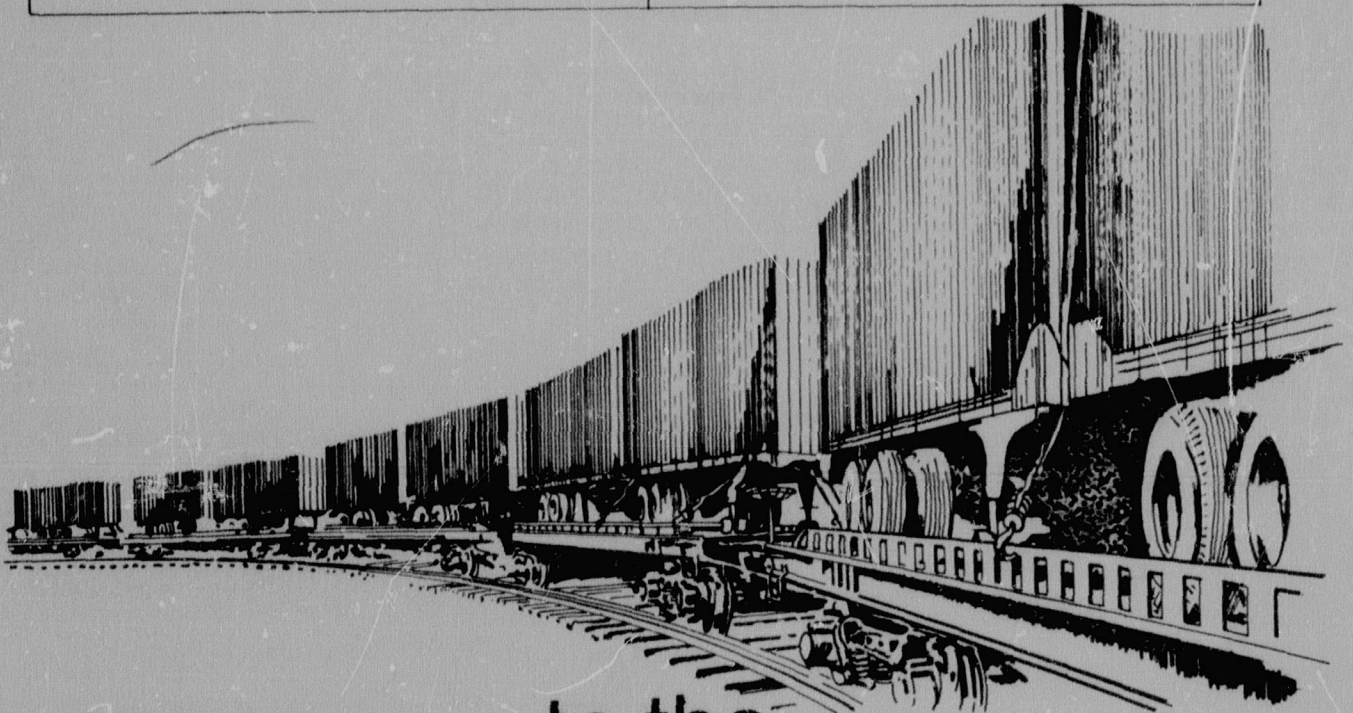

The Company and National Railroad Passenger Corporation (Amtrak) entered into an Agreement on January 3, 1978, under the terms of which the companies exchanged between themselves certain properties in the State of Rhode Island. The details of such Agreement and the treatment of such exchange transaction are outlined in Note 4 of the Notes to Consolidated Financial Statements found in the attached Shareholders' Report.

We anticipate that we will write the ICC for a redistribution of depreciation to eliminate where practical the negative balances in the accounts. Such request will be forthcoming as soon as a complete evaluation of the accounts is completed.
