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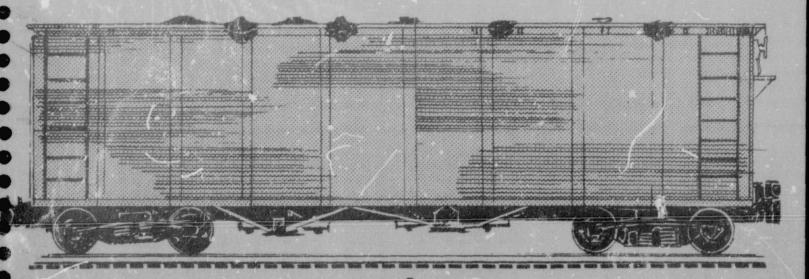

Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broadly classified, with respect to their operating revenues, according to the following general definnions

Class I companies are those having annual operating revenues of \$10,000,009 or more. For class. Annual Report Form R-1 is provided

Class II companies are those having annual operating revenues below \$10,000,000. For this class. Annual Report Form R-2 is provided

In applying this classification to any switching or terminal company which is operated a joint facility of owning or tenant railways, the sum of the annual railway operating revenues, the joint facility cent income, and the returns to joint facility credit accounts in operating expenses, shall be used in determining its class.

Switching and terminal companies are further classified as

Class St. Englusively switching. This class of companies includes all those performing switching service only, whether for joint account or for revenue

Class 52. Exclusively terminal. This class of companies includes all companies furnishing terminal trackage or terminal facilities only, such as union passenger or freight station stockyards, etc., for which a charge is made, whether operated for joint account or for revenue In case a bridge or ferry is a part of the facilities operated by a rerninal company, it should included under this heading

Class SS. Both switching and terminal. Companies which perform both a switching and a terminal service. This class of companies includes all companies whose operations cover h switching and terninal service, as defined above.

Class 54. Bridge and ferry. This class of companies is confined to those wh limited to bridges and ferries exclusively

Class S5: Mixed. Companies performing primarily a switching or a terminal service, but which also conduct a regular freight or passenger traffic. The revenues of this class of companies include, in addition to switching or terminal revenues, those derived from local passenger service, local freight service, participation in through movement of freight or passenger trafother transportation operations, and operations other than transportation

(1) Effective July 1, 1960, the respondent and its Parent Company, St. Louis-San Francisco Railway Company, funded a pension plan under a Trust Agreement with St. Louis Union Trust Company, of St. Louis, Missouri.

The respondent's payments to the Trustee during 1977 amount to \$2,700. The charge to Account 457 pensions for current cost and past service liability was \$3.172. The current year charges are consistent with the prior year. The estimated liability under the plan for unfunded past service is \$-0 -.

- Respondent carried basic and a supplemental service interruption policy with the Imperial Insurance Company, (Cayman-Islands) Limited, under which it will be entitled to indemnity for certain work stoppage losses. In the event such losses are sustained by other railroads holding similar policies, respondent may be obligated to pay additional premiums. The amount of respondent's daily indemnity under the basic policy is \$382 and \$322 under the supplemental policy. 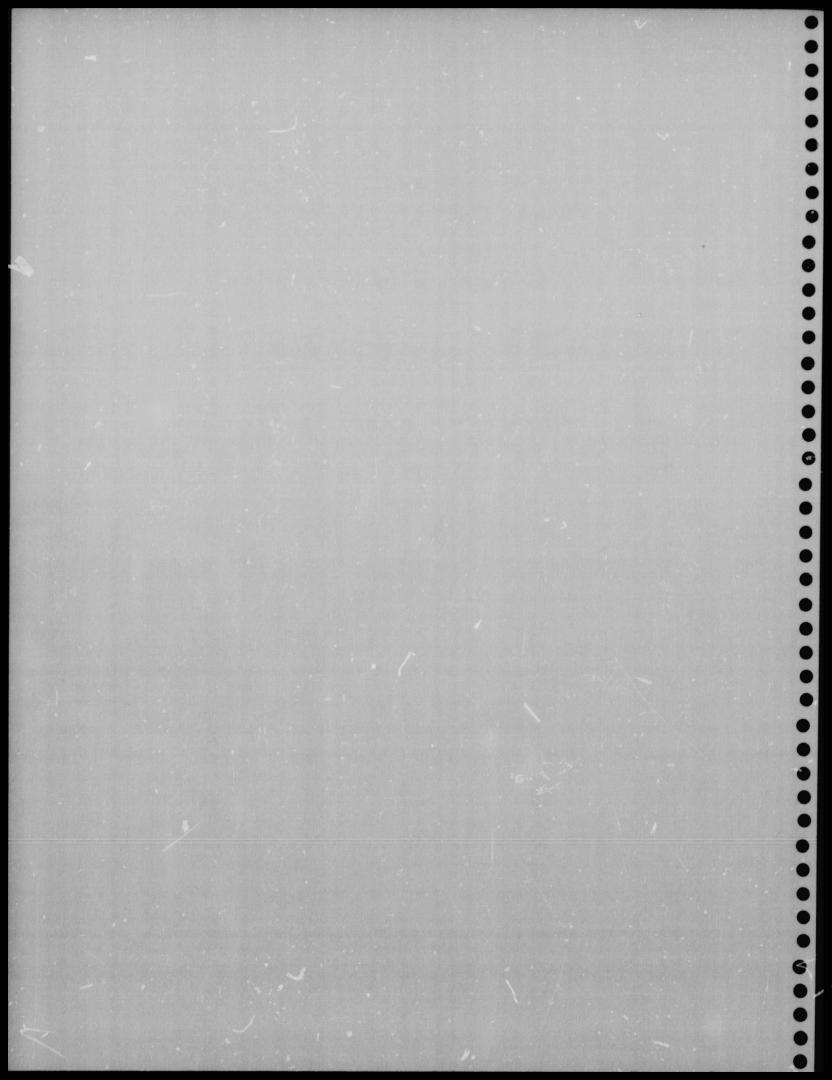
