

Attention is specially directed to the following provisions of Part a of the Interstate Commerce Act.

(2) Said annual reports shall contain all the required information for the period of twelve months cuding on the 31st day of December in each year, unless the Commission shall specify a different date, and shall be on de out under oath and filed with the Commission at its office in Washington within three months after the vlove of the year for which report is made, unless

additional time be granted in any case by the Commission.

(7) (b). Any person who shall knowingly and villfurly make, cause to be made, or participate in the nixking of, any fake entry in any onnual or other report required under the section to be filed, " * " or shall knowingly at willfully file with the Commission any false report or other document, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall or subject, upon conviction in any court of the United States of competent jurisdiction, to a time of not more than five thousand deflars, or imprisonment for not more than two years or both such fine and imprisonment."

(7) (c). Any carrier or lessor, * * * or any observagen, amployee, or nymentative thereof, who shall fail to make and file an annual or other report with the Commission, within the time fixed by the Commission, or to make specific and fail, true, and correct cover to any question within thirty days from the time it is lawfully require by the Commission to to do, shall fortune to the United States the sum of one hundred dellars for each and every day it shall continue to be in default with respect thereto.

(8) As used in this section * * * * the term "carrier" mesos a common carrier subject to this

(8) As used in this section * * * * the term "carrier" messes a common carrier subject to the part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such carrier, and the term "lessor" means a person owning a radition, a water line, or i pipe line, leased to aid operated by a common car as subject to this part, and includes r section or trustee of such leason * * *

The respondent is further required to send to the Bureau of Accounts, immediately upon preparation, two copies of its latest annual report to stockholders. See scheduled 108, page 3.

- 2. The instructions in this Form should be carefully observed, and each question should be answered fully and accurately, whether it has been answered in a previous annual report or not. Except in cases where they are specifically authorized, cancellations, arbitrary check marks. and the like should not be used either as partial or as entire answers to inquiries. If any inquiry, based on a preceding inquiry in the present report form is, because of the answer rendered to such preceding inquiry, inapplicable to the person or corporation in whose behalf the report is made, such notation as 'Not applicable; see pageschedule (or line) number----" should be used in answer thereto, giving precise reference to the portion of the report showing the facts which make the inquiry inapplicable. Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broat classified, with respect to their operating revenues, according to following general definitions.

Class I companies are those having around operating resembles of \$5,000,000 or more. For class, Annual Report Form R-1 is provided.

Class II companies are those having annual operating revenues below \$5.000,000. For class, Annual Report Form R-2 is provided.

In applying this classification to any switching or terminal complex which is operated as a joint facility of owning or tenant railways, sum of the annual railway operating revenues, the joint facility a income, and the returns to joint facility credit accounts in operat expenses, shall be used in determining its class.

Switching and terminal companies are further classified as:

Class 5). Exclusively switching. This class of companies includes an those perfore switching service only, whether for joint a count or for revenue.

Class S2. Exclusively terminal. This class of companies includes all companies furnisterminal trackage or terminal facilities only, such as union passenger or freight state stockwards, etc., for which a charge is made, whether operated for joint account or for reve. In case a bridge or ferry is a part of the facilities operated by a terminal company, it about include 2 under this heating.

Class S). Both switching and terminal. Companies whice perform both a switching at terminal service. This class of companies includes all companies whose operations cover t switching and terminal service, as defined above.

Class \$4. Bridge and ferry. This class of companies is confined to those whose operations impred to bridges and ferries exclusively.

Class S5. Mixed. Companies performing primarily a switching or a terminal service, but whalso conduct a regular freight or passenger traffic. The revences of this class of companies the interest of the class of companies in addition to switching or terminal revenues, those derived from local passers struce, local freigh service, participation in through movement of freight or passinger training transportation operations, and operations other than transportation.
