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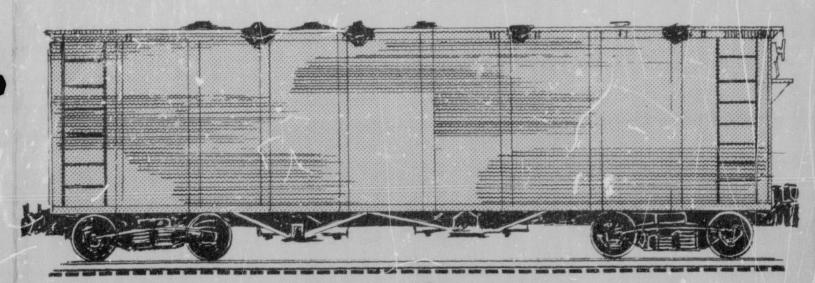

Any person who shall knowingly and willfully make, cause to be made, or p in the making of, any false entry in any annual or other report required under the section to be filed, \* \* or shall knowingly or willfully file with the Commission any false report or other document, sholl be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject, upon conviction in any court of the United States of competent jurisdiction, to a fine of not more than five thousand dollars or imprisonment for not more than two years, or both such fine and

(7) (e). Any carrier or less it, " " " or any officer, agent, employee, or representative thereof, who shall fail to make and file an annual or other report with the C the time fixed by the Commission, or to make specific and full, true, and correct answer, a any question within thirty days from the time it is lawfully required by the Commission so of loc shall forfeit to the United States the sum of one hundred dollars for each and every day it shall continue to be in detault with respect thereti

(8). As used in this section " " part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such carrier, and the term "lessor" means a person owning a railroad, a water line of a pipe line leased to and operated by a common earner subject to this part, and includes a receiver of trustee of such lesson.

The respondent is further required to send to the Bureau of Accounts. immediately upon preparation, two copies of its latest annual report to stockholders. See scheduled 108, page 3.

2. The instructions in this Form could be carefully observed, and each question should be answered fully and accurately, whether it has been answered in a previous annual report or not. Except in cases where they are specifically authorized, cancellations, arbitrary check marks and the like should not be used either as partial or as entire answers to inquiries. If any inquiry, based on a preceding inquiry in the present report form is because of the answer rendered to such preceding inquiry, inapplicable to the person or corporation in whose behalf the report is reade, such notation as "Not applicable: see pageschedu'e (or line) number--- should be used in answer therete, giving precise reference to the portion of the report showing the jacts which make the inquiry inapplicable. 3. F very annual report should, in all particulars, he complete in itself and references to the returns of former years should not be made to take the place of required entries except as herein otherwise specifically

directed or authorized.

4. If it he necessary or desirable to insert additional statements. typewritten or other, in a report, they should be legicly made on durable paper and, wherever practicable, on sheets not larger than a page of the Form. Inserted sheets should be securely attached, preserably at the inner margin; attachment by pins or clips is insufficient.

5. All entries should be made in a permanent black ink. Those of a contrary character should be indicated in parentheses. Items of an unusual cirracter should be indicated by appropriate symbol and

7. Each respondent should make its annual report to this Commission in triplicate, retaining one copy in its files for reference in case correspondence with regard to such report becomes necessary. For this reason three copies of the Ferm are sent to each corporation

8. Railroad corporations, mainly distinguished as operating companies and lessor companies, are for the purpose of report to the Interstate Commerce Commission divided into classes. An operating company is one whose officers direct the business of transportation an I whose books contain operating as well as financial accounts; and, a lessur company, the property of which being leased to and operated by another company, is one that main ains a separate legal existence and keeps financial but not operating accounts. In making reports, lessor companies use Annual Report Form R-4

Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broadly classified, with respect to their operating revenues, according to the following general definitions.

Class I companies are those having annual operating sevenues of \$10,000,000 or more. For this class. Annual Report Form R-1 is provided

Class II companies are those having annual operating revenues below \$10,000,000. For this class, Annual Report Form R-2 is provided

In applying this classification to any switching or terminal company. which is operated as a joint facility of owning or tenant railways, the sum of the annual railway operating revenues, the joint facility rent income, and the returns to joint facility credit accounts in operating expenses, shall be used in determining its class.

Switching and terminal companies are further classified as:

Class 51. Evelusively switching. This class of companies includes all those performing switching service only, whichire for joint account or for revenue.

Class 52. Exclusively terminal. This class of companies includes all companies furnishing terminal trackage or terminal facilities only, such as union passenger or freight stations stockyards, etc., for which a charge is made, whether operated for joint account or for revenue In case a bridge or ferry is a part of the facilities operated by a terminal company, it should be included under this heading.

Class S3. Both switching and terminal. Companies which perform both a switching and a termical service. This class of companies includes all companies whose operations cover both switching and terminal service, as defined above

Class S4. Bridge and ferry. This class of companies is confued to those whose operations are limited to hridger and ferries exclusively

Class \$5. Mixed Companies performing primarily a switching or a terminal service, but which also conduct a regular freight or passenger traffic. The revenues of this class of companies include, in addition to switching or terminal revenues, those derived from local passenger service, rocal freight service, participation in throw a movement of freight or passenger traffic, other transportation operations, and operations other than transportation.

9. Except where the context clearly indicates some other meaning, the tollowing terms when used in this Form have the meanings below stated:

COMMISSION means the Interstate Commerce Commission. RESPONDENT means the person or corporation in whose behalf the report is made. THE YEAR means the year ended December 31 for which the report is made. THE CLOSE OF THE YEAR means the close of husiness on December 31 of the year for which the report is made; or, in case the report is made for a shorter period than one year, it means the close of the period covered by the report. THE BEGINNING OF THE YEAR means the beginning of business on January 1 of the year for which the report is made; or, in case the report is made for a shorter period than one year. it means the beginning of the period covered by the report. THE PRECEDING YEAR means the year ended December 31 of the year next preceding the year for which the report is made. THE UNIFORM System in Part 1201 of Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, as amended.
