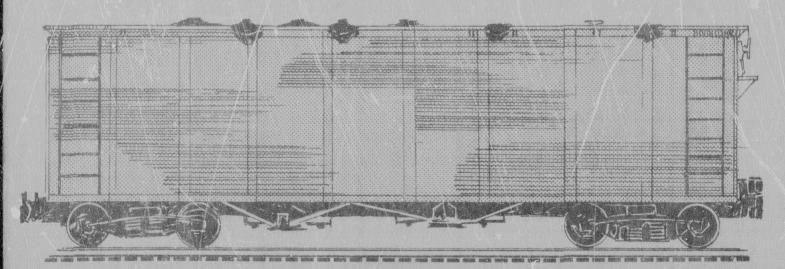

RICHMOND TERMINAL RAILWAY COMPANY -- ABANDONMENT OF ITS ENTIRE LINE OF RAILROAD INCLUDING THE BROAD STREET STATION IN RICHMOND, VIRGINIA

Upon consideration of the application filed under section 1(18) of the Interstate Commerce Act, on April 18, 1975, by the Richmond Terminal Rail-way Company (Terminal Railway), a common carrier by railroad subject to Part I of the Act, for a certificate of public convenience and necessity permitting abandonment of its entire line of railroad including the Broad Street Station in Richmond, Virginia which extends from Right of Way Station 170+67, South and into the loop of Broad Street Station to Right of Way Station 32+00, and from Station 170+67 south to a point on the east side of the loop at Station 57+45, aggregating 0.99 miles of road and 6.08 miles of track; and the protest filed by Railway Labor Executives' Association on the ground that the proposed abandonment, if permitted, would have an adverse affect upon the employees of the applicant;

It appearing, That the Broad Street Station is currently used solely by passenger trains of National Railroad Passenger Corporation which is currently constructing a new station several miles to the north at a location on Richmond, Fredericksburg, and Potomac Railroad, and expects to occupy that station approximately November 1, 1975, after which there will be no railroad operations at Broad Street Station, and no necessity for the facilities of Richmond Terminal Railway Company; that there is no freight traffic on the line and no service to shippers or the general public will be discontinued or in any way affected; and that the Terminal Company property includes about 63 acres of land;

It further appearing, That an environmental threshold assessment survey has been prepared by this Commission in these proceedings and made available for public inspection upon request; that such survey has found that no significant impact on the environment would result from the approval of this application; that by order of the Commission, Commissioner Brown, dated October 16, 1975, it was determined that, based on the aforesaid threshold assessment survey, no environmental impact statement need be issued in these proceedings as they do not represent a major Federal action significantly affecting the quality of the human environment within the meaning of the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969, 42 U.S.C. Section 4331, et seq.; that appropriate notice of such determination has been published as directed by this Commission, that said environmental statement as a part of the record herein has been considered and made a part of our decision herein; and that the Board so finds, the economic advantage to be gained from the transaction, outweigh any adverse environmental factors; and

AB-75 (Sub-No. 1) It further appearing, That the interest of employees will be protected by imposition of appropriate conditions, that no protests were received from shippers; and that continued maintenance and operation by applicant of the line of railroad would impose an undue and unnecessary burden on applicant and upon interstate commerce; It is hereby certified, That subject to the same conditions for protection of employees extrorth in Chicago, B.& O.R. Co. Abandonment, 257 I.C.C. 700, the present and future public convenience and necessity permit abandonment by the applicant of that line of railroad described above; It is ordered, That this certificate and order shall take effect and be in force from and after 35 days from its date of service and that tariffs applicable to the line herein permitted to be abandoned may be canceled upon notice to this Commission and to the general public by not less than 10 days filing and posting in the manner prescribed in section 6 of the Interstate Commerce Act; It is further ordered, That, when filing schedules canceling tariffs applicable to said line, the applicant shall in such schedules refer to this certificate and order by date and docket number; It is further ordered, That, if the authority herein granted is exercised, applicant shall submit for the consideration of this Commission two copies of the journal entries showing the retirement of the line from service, and shall advise this Commission in writing, immediately efter abandonment of the line of railroad, the date on which the abandonment actually took place; and It is further ordered, That if the authority granted in this certificate and order is not exercised within one year from its effective date, it shall be of no further force or effect.
