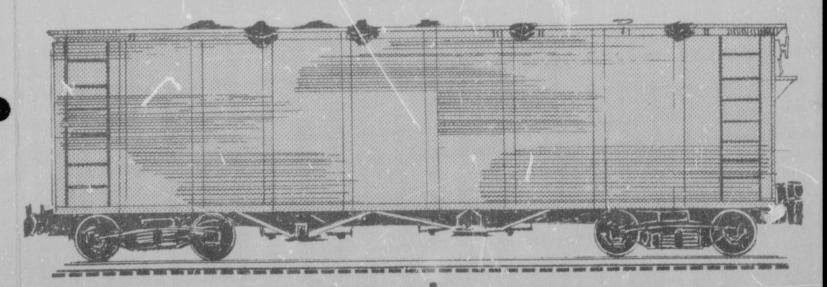

Any person who shall knowingly and willfully make, cause to be made, or participate in the making of, any false entry in any annual or other report required under the section to be * * or shall knowingly or willfully file with the Commission any false report or other document, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject, upon conviction in any court of the United States of competent jurisdiction, to a fine of not more than five thousand dollars or imprisonment for not more than two years, or both such fine and imprisonment *

(7) (c). Any carrier or lessor, * * * or any officer, agent, employee, or representative thereof, who shall fail to make and file an annual or other report with the Commission within the time fixed by the Commission, or to make specific and full, true, and correct answer to any question within thirty day: from the time it is lawful required by the Commission so to a shall forfer to the United states the sum of one hundred dollars for each and every day it shift continue to be in default with respect thereto.

(8). As used in this section " * * the term "carrier" means a common carrier subject to) part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such certier, and the term "lessor" means a person owning a railroad, a water line, or a pipe line; leased to and operated by a common carrier subject to this part, and ocludes a receiver or trustee of such lessor.
