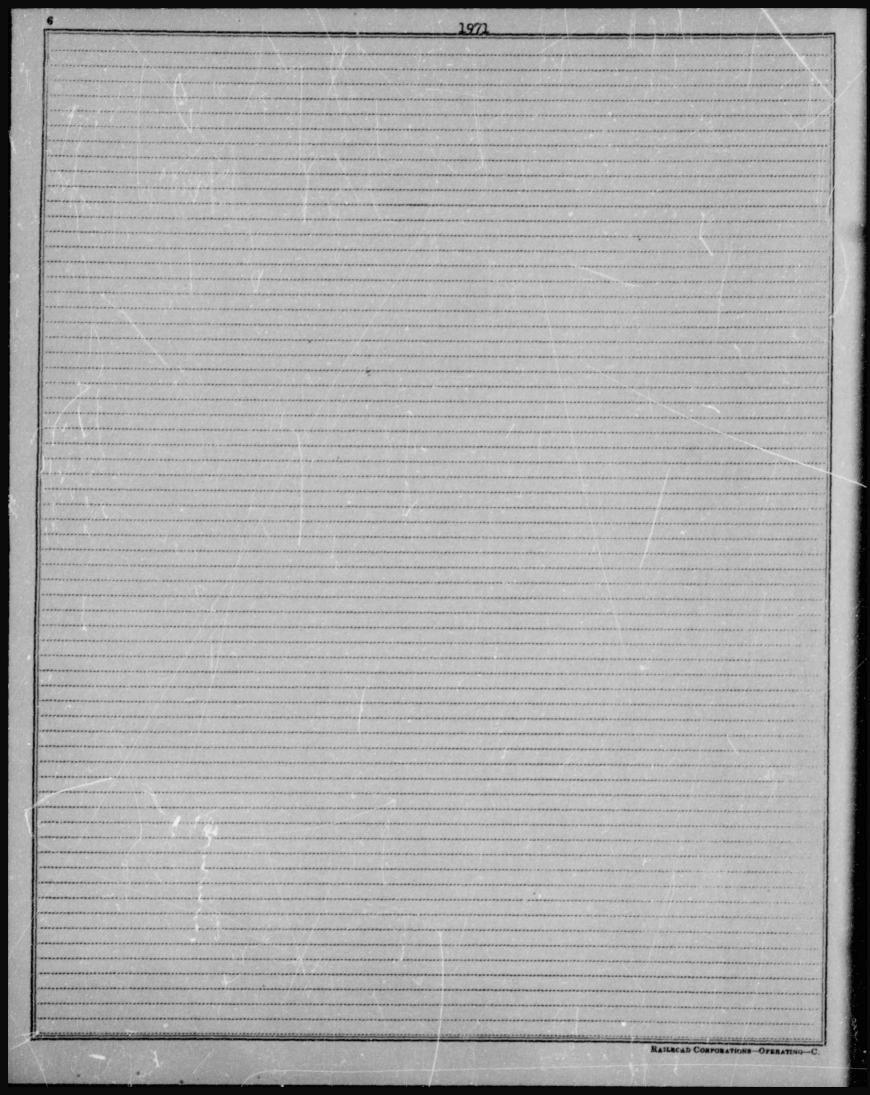

By carriers, as the term is here used, is meant companies owning or operating railroads, facilities auxiliary thereto such as bridges, ferries, union depots, and other terminal facilities, sleeping cars, parlor cars, dining cars, freight cars, stockyards, express service and facilities, electric railway highway motor vehicles, steambosts and other marine transportation equipment, pipe lines (other than those for transportation of water), and other instrumentalities devoted to the transportation of persons or property for hire. Telegraph and telephone companies are not meant to be included.

In reporting advances, the columns mentioned should be left blank. If any advances are pledged, give particulars in a footnote.
- 12. If the cost of any investment made during the year differs from the book value reported, explain the matter in a footnote. By "cost" is meant the consideration given minus accrued interest or dividends included therein.
