

NOTICE

1. This form for annual report should be filled out in triplicate and two copies returned to the Interstate Commerce Commission, Bureau of Accounts, Washington, D.C. 20423, by March 31 of the year following that for which the report is made. Attention is specially directed to the following provisions of Part I of the Interstate Commerce Act:

11145. The Commission is hereby authorized to require annual, periodical, or special reports from carriers, lessors, ⁽¹⁾ (as defined in this section), to prescribe the manner and form in which such reports shall be made, and to require from such carriers, lessors, ⁽²⁾ specific and full, true, and correct answers to all questions upon which the Commission may deem information to be necessary, classifying such carriers, lessors, ⁽³⁾ as it may deem proper for any of these purposes. Such annual reports shall give an account of the affairs of the carrier, lessor, ⁽⁴⁾ in such form and detail as may be prescribed by the Commission.

11145. Said annual reports shall contain all the required information for the period of twelve months ending on the 31st day of December in each year, unless the Commission shall specify a different date, and shall be made out under oath and filed with the Commission at its office in Washington within three months after the close of the year for which report is made, unless additional time be granted in any case by the Commission.

11144. Any person who shall knowingly and willfully make, cause to be made, or participate in the making of, any false entry in any annual or other report required under this section to be filed, ⁽⁵⁾ or shall knowingly and willfully file with the Commission any false report or other document shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject, upon conviction in any court of the United States of competent jurisdiction to a fine of not more than five thousand dollars or imprisonment for not more than two years, or both such fine and imprisonment. ⁽⁶⁾

11901. Any carrier, or lessor, ⁽⁷⁾ or any officer, agent, employee, or representative thereof, who shall fail to make, and file an annual or other report with the Commission within the time fixed by the Commission, or to make specific and full, true, and correct answer to any question within thirty days from the time it is lawfully required by the Commission so to do, shall forfeit to the United States the sum of one hundred dollars for each and every day it shall continue to be in default with respect thereto. ⁽⁸⁾

11141. As used in this section ⁽⁹⁾ the term "carrier" means a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such carrier; and the term "lessor" means a person owning a railroad, a water line, or a pipe line, leased to and operated by a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such lessor. ⁽¹⁰⁾

Each respondent is further required to send to the Bureau of Accounts, immediately upon preparation, two copies of its latest annual report to stockholders.

2. The instructions in this form should be carefully observed, and each question should be answered fully and accurately, whether it has been answered in a previous annual report or not. Except in cases where they are specifically authorized, cancellations, arbitrary check marks, and the like should not be used either as partial or as entire answers to inquiries. If any inquiry, based on a preceding inquiry in the present report form, is because of the answer rendered to such preceding inquiry, inapplicable to the person or corporation in whose behalf the report is made, such notation as "Not applicable, see page _____ schedule for line number _____" should be used in answer thereto, giving precise reference to the portion of the report showing the facts which make the inquiry inapplicable. Where the word "none" truly and completely states the fact, it should be given as the answer to any particular inquiry or any particular portion of an inquiry. Where dates are called for, the month and day should be stated as well as the year. Customary abbreviations may be used in stating dates.

3. Every annual report should, in all particulars, be complete in itself, and reference to the reports of former years should not be made. Take the place of required entries except as herein otherwise specifically directed or authorized.

4. If it be necessary or desirable to insert additional statements, typewritten or other, in a report, they should be legibly made on durable paper and, wherever practicable, on sheets not larger than a page of the form. Inserted sheets should be securely attached, preferably at the inner margin, attachment by pins or clips is insufficient.

5. All entries should be made in a permanent black ink. Those of a contrary character should be indicated in parentheses. Items of an unusual character should be indicated by appropriate symbol and footnote.

6. Money items, except averages, throughout the annual report form should be shown in whole dollars adjusted to cents with dittings. Totals for amounts reported in subsidiary accounts included in supporting schedules must be in agreement with related primary accounts.

7. Each respondent should make its annual report to this Commission in triplicate, retaining one copy in its files for reference in case correspondence with regard to such report becomes necessary. For this reason three copies of the form are supplied.

8. Railroad corporations, mainly distinguished as operating companies and lessor companies, ⁽¹¹⁾ for the purpose of report to the Interstate Commerce Commission divided as follows. An operating company is one whose officers direct the business of transportation and whose books contain operating as well as financial accounts, and a lessor company, the property of which being leased to and operated by another company, retains but maintains a separate legal existence and keeps financial but not operating accounts. (In making reports lessor companies use Annual Report Form R-4.)

Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broadly classified with respect to their operating revenues, according to the following general definitions:

Class I companies are those having annual operating revenues of \$50,000,000 or more. For this class, Annual Report Form R-1 is provided.

Class II companies are those having annual operating revenues less than \$50,000,000 but in excess of \$10,000,000. For this class, Annual Report Form R-2 is provided.

Class III companies are those having annual operating revenues of \$10,000,000 or less. For this class, Annual Report Form R-3 is provided.

9. Except where the context clearly indicates some other meaning, the following terms when used in this form have the meanings below stated:

Commission means the Interstate Commerce Commission. Respondent means each person or corporation in whose behalf the report is made. The year means the year ended December 31 for which the report is made. The close of the year means the close of business on December 31 of the year for which the report is made, or, in the case the report is made for a shorter period than one year, it means the close of the period covered by the report. The beginning of the year means the beginning of business on January 1 of the year for which the report is made, or, in case the report is made for a shorter period than one year, it means the beginning of the period covered by the report. The preceding year means the year ended December 31 of the year next preceding the year for which the report is made. The Uniform System of Accounts for Railroad Companies means the system of accounts in Part 1201 of Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, as amended.
