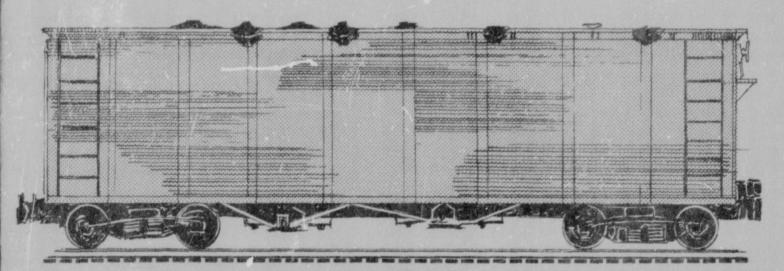

(7) (b) Any person who shall knowingly and willfully make, cause to be made, or participate in the making of any false entry in any annual of other report required under the section to be filed, " " or shall knowingly or willfully life with the Commission any false report or other document, shall be deemed guity of a misdemeanor and shall be subject, upon conviction in any court of the United States of competent jurisdiction, to a fine of not more than five thousand dollars or imprisonment for not more than two years, or both such fine and impresonment." " "

(7) (c) Any carrier or lessor, * * * or any officer, agent, employee, or representative thereof, who shall fail to make and file an annual or other report with the Commission within the time fixed by the Commission, or to make specific aw/full, true, and correct answer to any question within thirty days from the time it is lawfully required by the Commission so to do, shall forten to the United States the sum of one /aindred dollars for each and every day it shall continue to be in default with respect thereto.

(8) As used in this section * * * the term " arrier" means a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver of trustee of suc a carrier and the term "lessor" means a person owning a railroad, a water line, or a pipe line, leased to and operated by a common carrier

subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such losson. * * *

The respondent is further required to send to the Bureau of Accounts, immediately upon preparation, two copies of its latest annual report to stockholders. See scheduled 108, page 3.

- 2. The instructions in this Form should be carefully observed, and each question should be answered fully and occurately, whether it has been answered in a previous annual report or not. Class \$2. Exclusively terminal. This class of companies includes all companies furnisterminal trackage or terminal facilities only, such as union passenger or freight statistockyards, yet. for which a charge is made, whether operated for joint account or for revellin case a bringe or ferry is a part of the facilities operated by a ferminal company, it shoulincluded under this heading.

Class \$3. Both switching and terminal. Companies which perform both a switching a terminal service. Whis class of companies includes all companies whose operations cover switching and terms all service, as defined above.

Class S4. Bridge and ferry. This class of companies is confined to those whose operation timited to bridges and ferries exclusively.

Class S5. Mixed. Companies performing primarily a switching or a terminal service, but walso conduct a regular freight or passenger traine. The revenues of this class of companiclude, in addition to switching or terminal revenues, those derived from local passes service local freight service, participation in through movement of freight or passenger in other transportation operations, and operations other than transportation.
