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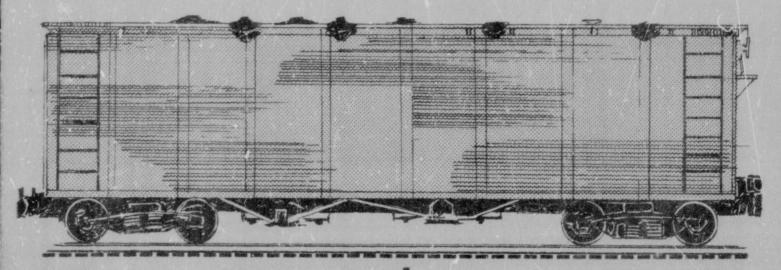

An operating company is one whose officers direct the business of transportation and whose books contain operating as well as financial accounts, and, a lessor company, the property of which being leased to and operated by another company, is one that maintains a separate legal existence and keeps financial but not operating accounts. In making reports, lessor companies use Annual Report Form R-4

Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broadly classified, with respect to their operating revenues, according to the following general definitions:

Class I companies are those having annual operating revenues of \$5,000,000 or more. For this class, Annual Report Form R-1 is provided

Class II companies are those having annual operating revenues believes 50,000,000. For this class. Annual Report Form R-2 is provided.

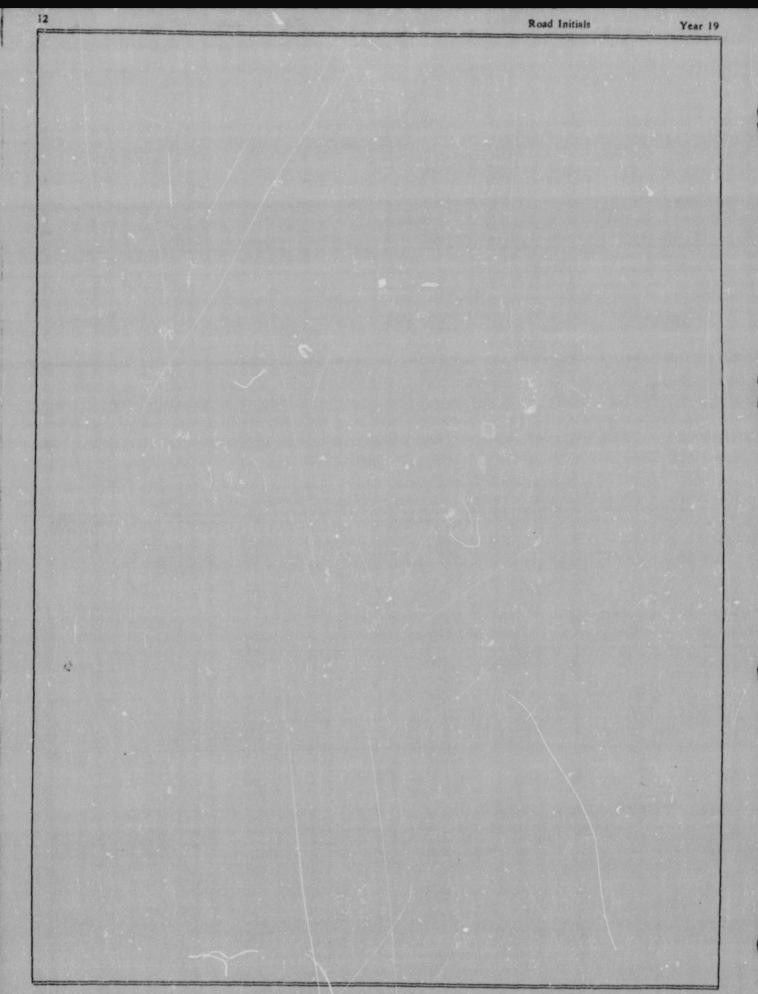
