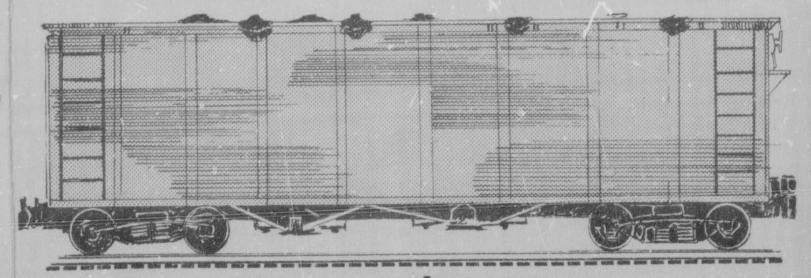

(7) (c). Any carrier or lessor, * * or any officer, agent, employee, or representative thereof, who shall fail to make and file an annual or other report with the Commission within the time fixed by the Commission, or to make specific and full, true, and correct answer to any question within thirty days from the time it is lawfully required by the Commission so to do shall forfeit to the United States the sum of one hundred dollars for each and every day it shall continue to be in default with respect thereto.

(8). > Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broadly classified, with respect to their operating revenues, according to the following general definitions:

> Class I companies are those having annual operating revenues of \$10,000,000 or more. For this class. Annual Report Form R-1 is provided.
